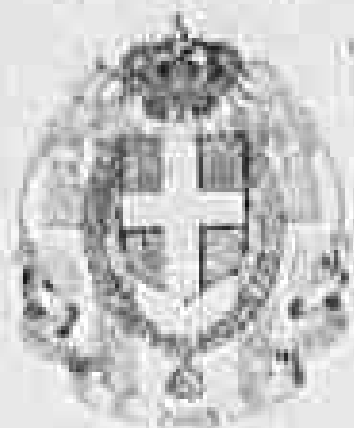

CIVILIAN PHOTOGRAPHY - NOTES

1. Captain Harris, F.S. authority on civilian photography from the security angle, states the AFHQ policy on this subject:-
2. There are two points which concerns security and these are covered as under:
 - (a) Developing of films taken by Service personnel
Only authorised photographers who are in possession of permits issued by AFHQ are allowed to process films taken by Service personnel.
 - (b) Photographers. Service personnel may have their portraits taken by any civilian photographer, providing they do not disclose the identity of their unit. Day leave personnel who are unable to collect their photographs may take the photographers receipt to the town Major who will arrange to collect and forward.
Special instructions regarding the above regulations have been issued to photographers, who are compelled to bring them to the notice of Service customers.
Apart from above - AFHQ do not wish to place any restrictions on the normal business of civilian photography.

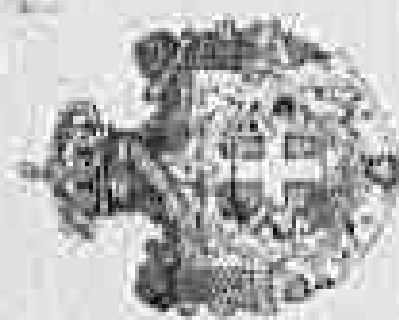

would you please acknowledge receipt of the ministerial letter n. 10.50152, dated 29 March 1944, which is repeated below:

The P. Prefecture of Bari has informed this Ministry, that the Command of the 15th Section of the Intelligence Corps, in last October has requested that Quentina to dispose the immediate closing of all photographic studios of the whole town of the Province, allowing 6 dealers of the town and only one of each Comune of the Province to continue their photographic work.

The adoption of the provision caused general complaints from those concerned, who notified that, having no other means of keeping their families, they soon would find themselves in very painful conditions.

In consequence of this, the same Prefecture wrote to the English Command, so that it would kindly examine the possibility of modifying the provisions, allowing also other photographers who have a regular Police authorization, to practise their profession, even by turns among themselves, in order to avoid an excessive disparity of treatment in favour of the few selected.

The English Command with letter, dated 9/1/1944, informed, that the proposal could not be granted and that anyhow it should be made again by the Superior Italian Authority.

Then this Ministry, with letter n. 376, dated 16/1/1944, replied to A.M.G. of Bari, which up-to-now, in spite of another pressing letter forwarded on 27/2/1944, has given no reply.

In view of the urgency stated by those concerned and considered, that the activity carried out by the photographers, as it has been pointed out, is submitted to the authorization of the Police and as such is controlled by P.S. Authorities, this Ministry, as a rule, intends to grant the request of the claimers, but before giving consequent provisions, it is deemed to be our duty to call the interest of this A.C.C., in order that it would kindly give proper opinion on said matter and inform, if prevailing military reasons obstacle the reopening of the photographic studios."

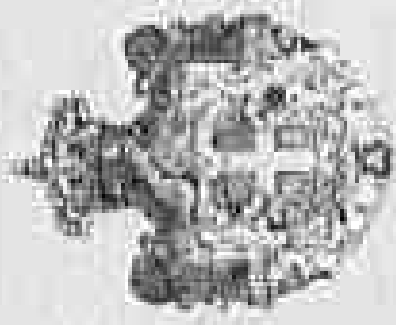

Would you please acknowledge receipt of the ministerial letter n. 10.50158, dated 29 March 1944, which is repeated below:

"The R. Prefecture of Bari has informed this Ministry, that the Command of the 16th Section of the Intelligence Corps, in last October has requested that Questura to dispose the immediate closing of all photographic studios of the chief town of the Province, allowing 6 dealers of the town and only one of each Commune of the Province to continue their photographic work.

The adoption of the provision caused general complaints from those concerned, who notified that, having no other means of keeping their families, they soon would find themselves in very painful conditions.

In consequence of this, the same Prefecture wrote to the English Command, so that it would kindly examine the possibility of modifying the provisions, allowing also other photographers who have a regular Police authorisation, to practise their profession, even by turns among themselves, in order to avoid an excessive disparity of treatment in favour of the few selected.

The English Command with letter, dated 9/1/1944, informed, that the proposal could not be granted and that anyhow it should be made again by the Superior Italian Authority.

They this Ministry, with letter n. 876, dated 16/1/1944, applied to A.M.C. of Bari, which up-to-now, in spite of another pressing letter forwarded on 27/2/1944, has given no reply.

In view of the urgency stated by those concerned and considered, that the activity carried out by the photographers, as it has been pointed out, is submitted to the authorisation of the Police and as such is controlled by P.S. Authorities, this Ministry, as a rule, intends to grant the request of the claimers, but before giving consequent provisions, it is deemed to be our duty to call the interest of this A.C.C., in order that it would kindly give proper opinion on said matter and inform, if prevailing Military reasons obstacle the reopening of the photographic studios."

SUBJECT: Security in Rear Areas.

TO : R.C.'s Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII and IX.
R.C. Rome Region.

1. It is known that German espionage agents are being left behind by the German Armies in their retreat northwards. In view of this it cannot be too strongly stressed that a high standard of vigilance and alertness must be maintained throughout all Regions so that these agents may be detected and placed in custody. Regions will therefore ensure that the security measures laid down by them are being carried out and that all officers and others are informed of these measures and warned to be on their guard.

2. Situations have arisen where former Fascists who have been allowed to remain in office has endeavoured to usurp more power and have tried at the same time to incorporate their doctrines into the organization administered by them. Such officials must be closely supervised and where necessary the provisions set out in Executive Memorandum No. 67 must be carried out.

3. Checks carried out on photographers have revealed that photographs have been taken of heavy guns and other war equipment. Steps should therefore be taken to ensure that cameras are not taken into forward areas by military personnel.

4. Unauthorized movement of civilians presents a considerable problem and R.C.'s are reminded that they should take all steps possible to stop this movement. R.C.'s attention is drawn to directive by this Section 316/CA of 26 April 44 which deals with Provincial Movement and movement into Army and Corps Areas, copy of which was sent to you. Further instructions on this subject, slightly amending and amplifying the above quoted letter will also shortly be issued. Meanwhile action should be taken as requested.

SUBJECT : Permits for Photography

TO : Public Relations Branch - ACC HQ

1. Reference is made to your letter dated 23rd July 1944 requesting that a permit be granted to Bixio Alberini, of the Paramount News Service, allowing him to use a camera as far north as the Army control line.
2. Normally, permits to take photographs in Military Government territory are granted, in accordance with Proclamation No. 3 Article 2, Section 1, by an officer designated by the Regional Commissioner concerned.
3. In the case of Bixio Alberini, who wishes to use his camera in more than one Region, it will be necessary to issue a permit from this HQs after he has been screened by Military Security officials.
4. For security reasons it is necessary to limit very strictly the number of persons in possession of permits and it is feared that the granting of a permit to one news service may release a flood of similar applications which could not equitably be refused.
5. It is therefore suggested that a small number of photographers should be given permits and that all news services should have access to the photographs taken by them.
6. If you can supply this Sub-Commission with the complete list of persons recommended the matter can then be dealt with finally.

1. It is agreed that commerce of optical and photographic materials should be re-established throughout King's Italy, subject to the following special restrictions.
2. Civilians wishing to use a camera should obtain a permit from the civil Police. Such permits could be given freely to all reputable applicants.
3. No civilian may photograph any military, naval or air-force establishments, equipments, ships or subjects of any kind.
4. No camera to be carried by civilians within the perimeter of a port.
5. Exposed films or prints should not be despatched by civilians outside King's Italy. (Including Sicily and Sardinia)
6. Printing and developing of films only to be done by civil shops and firms approved by Allied security authorities. There need be no limit to the number of establishments so approved.
7. Establishments approved, are to be subject to periodic visits of inspection by Allied Security Officers, to ensure that above provisions are being complied with.
8. We would appreciate for approval, a copy of your draft instructions before finally authorizing commerce to be re-established.

TO : G.S.I. (b) A.A.I. -

1. Proclamation 11, Art. 11, 1 Sept. 43, forbids the taking of photographs of any sort, or to develop or print any photograph his film or plate of any nature without permission in writing of Allied Military Authority.
2. Proclamation 16, 11 Feb. 1944, cancelled above Proclamation; no reservation was made in respect to photography.
3. The Ministry of Interior now proposes to re-establish the commerce of photographic and optical materials, and proposes to institute a plan of control to the extent that each merchant must register and keep an accurate record of the sale of all photographic equipment, supplies and services. The record is to show date of purchase, kind of equipment or supplies purchased and name and address of purchaser.
The records will be available to the Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza for their inspection.
Regulations prohibiting the photographing of Railways, Harbours and Military establishments have been effective and enforced in Italy for several years by the Police authorities at the direction of the Minister of War.
4. The questura of Bari has been instructed by HQ 14th FSS to close down all photographic studios in town and province with exception of six.
The Ministry states that this measure will cause hardship to persons in the photographic trade who have no other means of maintaining their families.
5. No objection is raised here to the Ministry re-establishing the trade in ACC areas.
6. Before communicating our views we would be glad to have any observations you care to make, in particular with the restriction imposed at Bari.

The R. Prefettura of Bari informs this Ministry that the Hq of 16th Section of the Intelligence Corps on October 43 requested the Questura of Bari to shut down all photographic studios of the town and of the Province, allowing only six of them in the city and one only in each comune to continue to operate.

The adoption of this measure caused a general disapproval of all concerned, who mentioned that, not having any other means of maintaining their families, would soon find themselves in difficult straits.

In consequence, the Prefettura wrote to the English Command in regard to modifying such an order, and also to permit all other photographers to engage in this field, in such a manner so that partiality would not be shown toward any particular person or group.

The English Command, through its letter of the 9th Jan., stated that such a request could not be granted, and that it should be submitted to a higher Italian Authority.

This Ministry by letter N° 876 of 16 Jan. informed AMG Bari, has not yet made any replies through repeated request were made.

In view of the urgency of the matter, this Ministry is disposed to grant above requests, but before doing so, would like to have the approval or opinion of A.G.C. in regard to Military reasons which might be involved in the matter.
