(b) Movement of civilians inside the zone is restricted to 10 kms., and movement into or out of the zone is forbidden unless such civilians are in possession of Movement of Civilian passes. Passes may be issued at the point of departure by LMG/AC Officers.

In Italian Government territory, ~~passports~~ will prefer recommended applications for (a) and (b) to the Ministry of Interior for onward transmission to this Headquarters, Public Safety Sub-Commission, for approval.

5. The issue of passes to the Security Control Zone and / or Prohibited Frontier Zone will only be made in exceptional cases and limited to those persons who show good and sufficient reasons why they wish to travel whether on official or private business or urgent family grounds.
6. Movement is free in the area to the rear of the Security Control Line and the Prohibited Frontier Zone Line, and this includes movement between the islands of Sicily, Sardinia, Elba, and the mainland. No passes are required within this area.
7. The issue of passes will be a Public Safety responsibility.
8. Special attention is drawn to the fact that persons wishing to leave Italy must be in possession of Military Travel Authorizations or equivalent documents authorizing them to leave the country.
9. Members of the Italian Armed Forces may be sent on duty and on leave to places to the rear of the Security Control Line and Prohibited Frontier Zone Line. "Toglio di viaggio" and "biglietto di licenza" will be sufficient authority for such travel. A further communication will be forwarded with regard to the Movement of Italian Armed Forces on demobilization and with regard to movement into the Security Control Zone and Prohibited Frontier Zone.
10. The provisions of Executive Memorandum No. 77/45, which will shortly be released, will continue to apply where applicable.
11. General Order No. 24 will not be published. Suggested draft for Regional Order is attached. (S.C.F.O.'s and R.O.'s only)
12. This instruction becomes effective as from 0001 hrs on 28 May, 1945.

Movement of Civilians and issue of Movement of Civilian
passes.

I, Ellery W. Stone, Rear Admiral, United States Navy Reserve, Chief Civil Affairs Officer, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:-

ARTICLE I

The provisions of Article 46, Proclamation No. 1 are modified to the extent set forth in this General Order,

ARTICLE II

General Order No. 24 (Revised) of 7 August 1944, is repealed.

ARTICLE III

No person shall:-

- (a) travel within the territory forward of the Rear Army Security Control Line a distance of more than ten kilometers beyond his place of residence.
- (b) travel across the Rear Army Security Control Line or the Restricted Line.
- (c) travel across a provincial boundary of a province within a Restricted Zone.

unless such person is in possession of a Movement of Civilian pass authorising such travel issued by, or under the authority of, the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE IVSection 1.

Every request for a pass shall be made by the applicant in person to the Allied Military Government officer nearest to his place of residence, or to such other officer, or office, as may be designated. Applicants for passes must produce identity cards.

Section 2.

A pass will only be issued when in the purpose of the journey is of direct benefit to the allied cause.

Section 3.

A pass is valid only for the specific occasion and purpose for which it has been issued and must not be transferred to or be used by, any person other than the one to whom it has been issued. Passes may be revoked at any time.
