SUBJECT:- Public Order.

The Allied Commission, in order to determine the competence and tasks of the Allied and Italian Authorities, respectively, for the maintenance of public order in the national territory, has sent a communication, the fundamental points of which are summed up in the two enclosures.

The regulation regarding the use of tear-gas bombs and smoke-bombs, (an allotment of which will be made soon), does not exclude that they may be used by the police and Italian troops even when the latter are not operating under the control of the Allied Authorities.

The present provisions repeal those contained in the circular no. 442/6734 of 4 July 1945 sent to the prefettura, then administrated by the Italian Government.

TRANSLATIONGENERAL ORDERS

1. This Operative Memorandum substitutes the Operative Memorandum N. 78 (Territorial Defence) dated 22 July 1945 that is therefore cancelled.
2. For the maintenance of the internal security (that is the maintenance of law and order and the defence against sabotage) within the zone of competence of SACMED.
 - a) The Commander in Chief G.H.Q. Allied Forces of the Allied Forces Mediterranean Theater, will be responsible for the provinces of Udine and Venezia Giulia.
 - b) The Italian Government will be responsible for all the remainder of the Italian territory.
3. The material security of installations and locations of Allied Forces in Italy, wherever located, is due to the Allied Troops that occupy these installations and locations. The respective concerned commandants will ascertain that plans for protection of their own installations will be prepared.

MILITARY ZONES

4. The Supreme Command Allied Forces Mediterranean Theatre is reserving the right of declaring Military Zone particular zones subjected to the Italian jurisdiction. After promulgation of such a declaration the exercising of the powers of a Military Government in the zone in question will be assumed by the Supreme Command Allied Forces Mediterranean Theater. It is however intended that this right will only be used in case of gravest threat to Allied interests.

USE OF TROOPS IN SUPPORT OF CIVIL AUTHORITIES

5. For special orders, integral for the maintenance of law and order and for the prevention of sabotage in Italy see supplement "A".

TRANSLATION

SIN LIST "A"

A. ITALIAN TERRITORY EXCEPT PROVINCES OF UDINE AND VENEZIA GIULIA

1. Within the Italian Territory, excepted the provinces of Udine and Venezia Giulia, the Italian Government is competent for the maintenance of law and order, and has therefore at his disposal the forces of the Police, the Carabinieri, and the Army.

2. Should the situation become worse, so that the Italian authorities could not maintain law and order with their own resources, they can apply to Allied Troops for help. Such a demand will not be accepted at once, but will be submitted immediately to G.H.Q. Allied Forces. Should the disorder however menace directly Allied military property and installations and impend to interfere with operations of Allied Forces, the local commandant will take all measures that seem to him opportune for protecting Allied interests. With approval of G.H.Q. Allied Forces and on behalf of SACMED, he can as a last resource declare the threatened zone as Military Zone. In this case he will assume the command of all troops and of the whole Italian Police in this zone.

3. In case the local commandant should consider the state of emergency so serious and immediate that he has not sufficient time for seeking the permission of G.H.Q. Allied Forces, he can act on his initiative. He has to refer all facts successively to G.H.Q. Allied Forces in the shortest possible time.

B. PROVINCES OF UDINE AND VENEZIA GIULIAOMISSIONC. LACRIMATORS AND SMOKE GROWING BOMBS

7. In any case Italian and allied troops, Police or Carabinieri should be used under Allied command for smoothing civil disorder, they can make use of lacrimator or smoke growing bombs, but not of white phosphoric bombs, with the following limits:

- a) All precautions have to be taken that the depots of these bombs are not available for unauthorized persons.
- b) All superior commands will issue orders to their dependent parties about the use of these bombs, setting up the limitation that no bomb will be issued to the troops nor be used by them unless by order of an officer. In exceptional cases the responsibility for issuing such orders can be delegated to a non-commissioned officer. The use of these bombs will be permitted only if the use of force is necessary and the purpose can be reached with less damage for the persons by using lacrimators or smoke-growing bombs than by opening fire.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I enclose two copies of Allied force Headquarters' operation memorandum O. 35 dated 8 November 1946. This memorandum supercedes Allied Force Headquarters' memorandum O. 18 dated 22 July 1946.

You will observe that this memorandum reiterates the right of the Supreme Allied Commander to reimpose Allied military government in areas of Italian Government controlled territory.

Under the terms of this memorandum this right is intended to be invoked only as a last resort and then in a limited area for the duration of an emergency only. In effect, it does not actually envisage the reimposition of Allied military Government as normally exercised but rather the institution of martial law for a limited area and period.

You will also observe that in paragraph 7 of the appendix to the memorandum, certain conditions are laid down for Italian troops, police and Carabinieri, who they are employed under Allied command. This paragraph is in no way intended to place any limitation in regard to the use of tear gas and smoke grenades when Italian troops, police or Carabinieri are employed under the control of your authorities.

I am directed by the Supreme Allied Commander, my dear Mr. Prime Minister, to request that you will publish the necessary orders to support this operational memorandum without delay and that a copy of these orders be submitted to this Commission for the information of the Supreme Allied Commander.

1. There are enclosed copies of ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS Operations Memorandum No. 25 of 3 November 1946. This memorandum supersedes ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS Operations Memorandum No. 73 of 22 July 1946.

2. You will note that this memorandum reiterates the right of the Supreme Allied Commander to reimpose Allied Military Government in areas of Italian government controlled territory.

3. Under the terms of this memorandum this right is intended to be invoked only as a last resort and then in a limited area for the duration of an emergency only. In effect, it does not actually envisage the reimposition of Allied Military Government as normally exercised but rather the institution of martial law for a limited area and period.

4. It is desired that you present copies of this memorandum to the Italian government requesting that they publish the necessary orders to support it.

5. It is requested that this headquarters be provided with translations of the Italian government's orders referred to in paragraph 4 above when published.

INTERNAL SECURITY

GENERAL

1. This Operation Memorandum supersedes Operation Memorandum No. 70 (Ground Defence) of 22 July 1945 which is hereby rescinded.
2. The preservation of internal security (i.e. the maintenance of law and order and defence against sabotage), within the D.M.C. area of responsibility, will be the responsibility of:-
 - a. GOC-in-C GR, SPT in the provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA Giulia.
 - b. The Italian Government in all other Italian territory.
3. The physical security of Allied localities and installations in Italy, however located, will be the responsibility of the Allied troops occupying such localities and installations. Comandanti concerned shall insure that plans are drawn up for the protection of these installations.

ZONE OF ZONES

4. The right is reserved by the Supreme Allied Commander, within the territories to be military zones, by the heads of Italian Government, in case of the non-existence or such a designation, by the Supreme Allied Commander, in the zone in question, however, only in case of most urgent threat to determine measures, if intended that this right will be invoked.
5. For specific instructions covering zones see Annex.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE MILITARY GOVERNMENT AND POLICE IN THE PROVINCES OF ITALY AND VENEZIA OF LAW AND ORDER

4. ITALY LESS PROVINCES OF UMBRIA AND VENEZIA JULIA

1. Within Italy, other than the provinces of Umbria and Venezia Julia, the Italian government is responsible for the maintenance of law and order and to accomplish this has the Police Force, the Carabinieri and the Italian Army.

2. Should the situation deteriorate to such an extent that the Italian authorities are unable to maintain law and order with their own resources it is possible that they may request assistance of Allied troops. Such requests will not be honoured, but will be referred immediately to Allied Force Headquarters. However, should disorder's directly threaten allied military installations or property or threaten to interfere with the execution of allied military missions the local commander will take such steps as may be necessary to protect these Allied interests. As a last recourse, with the approval of Allied Force Headquarters and in accordance, he may declare the threatened area to be a military zone, in which case he will assume command of all Italian troops and police in that area.

3. In cases where the local commander considers this emergency so grave and so immediate that time does not allow for requesting allied force headquarters authority he may act on his own initiative, reporting the full facts to allied force headquarters at the earliest possible moment.

5. PROVINCES OF UMBRIA AND VENEZIA JULIA

4. Guy rental is responsible for the maintenance of law and order and the Police Forces are under the control of allied military government for this purpose. Similarly, additional as assistance be required, the allied military government will appeal to the nearest allied military commander. It is essential that close liaison exists between allied military government officers and the nearest allied military commander.

5. A disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a

3. In cases where the local commander considers the emergency so grave and so immediate that time does not allow for requesting Allied Force Headquarters authority to act on his own initiative, reporting the full facts to Allied Force Headquarters at the earliest possible moment.

3. PROBLEMS OF MILITARY POLICE - ITALIA

- a. In the provinces of UDINE AND VENEZIA, WILL the Allied Military Government be responsible for the maintenance of law and order and the Police Forces under the control of Allied Military Government for this purpose. In other situations, if assistance be required, the Allied Military Government will appeal to the nearest Allied Military Commander. It is essential that close liaison exists between Allied Military Government officers and the nearest Allied Military Commander.

5. In disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a military responsibility and will be dealt with by the appropriate military authority.

6. Military reports will be made through normal channels in all cases of riots or civil disturbances, whether or not it has been necessary to employ Allied troops.

6. THERMOS STOCKS

7. In any instance where Allied or Italian troops, police or carabinieri are employed under Allied command to quell civil disturbances, tear gas and/or smoke grenades, but not white phosphorus smoke grenades, may be employed subject to the following restrictions:-

- a. By law, a security precaution will be employed to ensure that stocks of smoke grenades do not fall into unauthorised hands.
- b. All major commands will issue instructions to lower echelons concerning the use of these grenades, subject to the restriction that no grenades will be issued to troops or used by troops except on consent of an officer. In exceptional cases the responsibility for issuing such orders may be delegated to a NCO.

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These grenades will be employed only when it is considered that use of force is necessary and that the object will be achieved with fewer casualties by the use of tear gas and/or smoke, than by opening fire.





APPENDIX "P" TO ORGANIZATION REGULATIONS NO. 3.

USE OF TEAR GAS - CIVIL DISORDERS

OBJECT

1. The employment of Tear Gas is authorised for the purpose of dealing with civil disorders subject to the conditions laid down in the following paragraphs.

2. The use of Tear Gas may be justified in circumstances which would hardly merit opening fire. Officers i/c Regts employed in circumstances of civil disorder must therefore always keep watch on the changing temper of a crowd, bearing in mind that this temper is liable suddenly to deteriorate, and from getting out of control, and to elicit the necessity for opening fire.

POLICY

3. The employment of Tear Gas, having been authorised in principle by higher authority, Powers to Order its Employment are vested in the Commanding General, Home Army Field Command.

METHOD

4. The Commanding General, Home Army Field Command will therefore:

- designate units or parts thereof to draw, hold and employ Tear Gas,
- issue orders to commanders of specific units detailed as protective units when alerted, either wholly or in part, to carry Tear Gas,
- issue general orders to the commanders of these protective troops authorising the employment of Tear Gas.

METHOD

5. Tear Gas will never be used by any troops other than those detailed in accordance with para 4 above, and as given in para 6 below.

HQ Home Army Field Command will after the issue of a General order 4850 The Executive Order for the use of Tear Gas will only be given by an officer.

6. Tear Gas will be drawn and held only for use by:

- a. US and British Military Police,
- b. Personnel of Emergency Services,
- c. Military Resources.

7. Personnel of stations detailed

- b. issuing orders to commanders of specific units detailed as protective units when alerted, either wholly or in part, to carry Tear Gas,
c. issuing general orders to the commanders of these protective troops authorising the employment of Tear Gas.

METHOD

5. Tear Gas will never be used by any troops other than those detailed in accordance with para 4 above, and as given in para 5 below.
It will never be used until after the issue of a general order **AS 89**.
HQ Rome Area Allied Command in accordance with para 4(e) above.
The executive order for the use of Tear Gas will only be given by an officer.
6. Tear Gas will be drawn and held only for use by:
a. US and British Military Police.
b. Personnel of Emergency Column.
c. Mobile Regiment.
7. Personnel of static guards will not be authorised to use Tear Gas.
8. On receipt of word "THREE" all personnel detailed for protective duties in this Operations Memorandum (incl static protective detachments) will wear respirators/masks, service, gas in the alert position.
9. a. Tear Gas will be stored separately and well away from dumps of ammunition and explosives and away from quarters and premises in usage by personnel.
- b. Tear Gas may be stored in water-tight boxes and buried, should it not be possible to segregate it by other means.
- c. Storage will be checked at regular intervals to ensure that leakage does not occur.
10. Requisition and subsequent issue of Tear Gas will be dealt with by Rome Area Allied Command, and independent demands will not be submitted by unit commanders.

S E C T I O NAPPENDIX "N" TO OPERATIONS MEMORANDUM NO. 3INSTRUCTIONS FOR OFFICERS ACTING AS MILITARY COMMANDERS IN CHARGE OF TROOPS
EMPLOYED IN AID OF THE CIVIL POLICE IN ITALIAN GOVERNMENT TERRITORY

1. It may happen that cases will occur when the local Italian authorities may ask for the assistance of Allied Troops to quell civil disturbances.
2. If such a request is made the local commander will take no action unless he is satisfied that allied lives or property are in danger of threat assistance is necessary in order to protect Allied military interests. He will point this out to whomever makes this request, adding that the quelling of civilian riots and disturbances is a responsibility of the Italian Administration and that if he gives assistance the territory in question will forthwith become an Allied Military Zone.
3. After receiving such a request the local commander will, if time permits, consult the local AC officer and seek instructions from his superior commander before giving assistance. In any event he will inform his superior commander of any request made to him and the action taken thereon without delay.
4. Within the limits of the City of Rome the only authority for ordering Troops to take action in aid of the Civil Power is Lt Rom from Allied Commanders before giving assistance. Any requests for assistance will be referred by the quickest possible means to this Headquarters.
5. Within Rome, Reg. Allied Command but outside the City limits, any officer who receives such a request for assistance will, if time and circumstances permit, similarly refer the request to this Headquarters. In the event of emergency, however, when in the judgment of the Officer concerned circumstances do not admit of the delay involved in referring the matter to this Headquarters, he will act on his own initiative but will invariably report action taken at the earliest possible moment.
6. Firearms will only be employed when the military commander is of the opinion that loss of allied lives or the destruction of valuable installations will result unless drastic measures are taken.
7. If firearms are used the following procedure will be adopted except in the case of the greatest emergency:
 - a. The intention that firing is about to take place will if possible be indicated. A line of levelled rifles is the clearest possible indication.
 - b. The crowd disperse within a stated period they will be fired on.

5. Within the limits of the City or Town the only authority for ordering troops to take action in aid of the Civil Power is the Head of Allied Commands, any requests for assistance will be referred by the quickest possible means to this Headquarters.

5. Within the limits of the City or Town the only authority for ordering troops such a request for assistance will, if time and circumstances permit, similarly refer the request to this Headquarters. In the event of emergency, however, when in the judgment of the officer concerned circumstances do not admit of the delay involved in referring the matter to this Headquarters, he will act on his own initiative but will invariably report action taken at the earliest possible moment.

6. Firearms will only be employed when the military commander is of the opinion that loss of Allied lives or the destruction of valuable installations will result unless drastic measures are taken.

7. If firearms are used the following procedure will be adopted except in the case of the greatest emergency:

- a. The intention that firing is about to take place will if possible be made clear to the rioters. A line of levelled rifles is the clearest possible indication. If possible some announcement should be made that unless the crowd disperse within a stated period they will be fired on.
- b. The actual firing will be done by a comparatively small number of soldiers selected for their training and marksmanship.
- c. A limited number of rounds will be fired from each rifle and that number clearly stated before the order to fire is given.
- d. The soldiers detailed to fire will if possible concentrate their aim on the ringleaders or apparent ringleaders and will not fire indiscriminately into the crowd.
- e. Shots will not be fired over the heads of the crowd, and blank rounds will not be fired.
- f. Automatic weapons (including TMC (Tr), TMC (US), and Grenades will not be used in any circumstances.
- g. All precautions will be taken to prevent the shooting of women and children.
- h. Firing will cease as soon as it becomes effective.
