SUBJECT: Veterans Administration Cases.

TO : American Consul General.

1. Further to conversation with Mr. F.H. Murrell regarding this subject, it has been decided that your Consulate should communicate direct with the Minister of Interior in the Italian Government for cases occurring in Regions I, II, VI, VII and part of Region III (see appendix for composition of Regions).

2. With regard to the remainder of Italian territory now in our hands it is regretted that for the time being no work of this nature can be accepted by Regional Commissioners except in the case of Region III (Provinces of Naples, Avellino and Benevento). The papers in such cases may be addressed to R.C. Region III (Prefecture, Naples) direct. Copy of our letter to R.C. Region III is attached.

3. The extension of the facilities to the remaining regions will be considered later. When further territory is handed over to the Italian Government you will be informed and the facilities indicated above will be automatically extended to that territory.

4. Would you kindly indicate if this meets with your wishes or whether there is any alteration that could be made that would further facilitate.

5. It is regretted that so much time has elapsed since our first conversation. You will appreciate that there has been much to do during the past few weeks.

SUBJECT: Veterans Administration Cases.

TO : R.C. Region III.

1. Investigation of cases in foreign lands on behalf of the Veterans Administration was in normal times conducted through the Consulates General. In Italy the subsequent procedure was to ask the C.C.R. to make the necessary investigation, complete and return the forms.

2. With the re-establishment of the American Consulate General in Italy, requests for investigation are being received and will be passed to Regional Commissioners direct.

3. The papers in each individual case should be passed for completion to the Provincial Commissioner concerned. The utmost use of the C.C.R. should be made, though it is requested that Provincial Commissioners give the matter their attention in order that the papers should be complete before return in order to save further correspondence.

4. Completed forms and documents may be returned to American Consulate General direct.

5. Documents in respect of Igino Ruggero Macchionei and Giuseppe Lombardi received in this office are passed to you for treatment.

- 1 It is agreed that the US Consul should deal direct with the Italian Government so far as Italian Government Territory is concerned.
- 2 The procedure suggested in paras 3 and 4 of your letter are approved so far as Military Government Territory is concerned.
- 3 It is also agreed that the Displaced Persons sub-Commission does not appear to be concerned.

SUBJECT: Veterans Administration Cases.

TO : Admin. Section (For Col. Cripps).

1. With reference to my conversation with you today there are outstanding at present 11 requests from the American Consul General in respect of investigations to be carried out before any payments can be made.

2. It is the opinion of this Section that there is no objection to the American Consul General's wish to deal with these matters direct with the Italian Government (as was the case in peacetime) in respect of Regions in Italian Government territory. 9 of these cases occurred in such Regions.

3. With regard to the three Provinces in Region III under Military Government administration, it is thought that the American Consul General should correspond direct with the Regional Commissioner and 2 such cases are outstanding. The Regional Commissioner will then pass these inquiries to the Carabinieri to investigate.

4. It is not thought wise to allow any communications at present with Regions IV, V, VIII or Rome Region as the Regional Commissioners are fully occupied with other problems. It is suggested that as and when these territories are handed back to the Italian Government the procedure outlined above in para. 2 would come into operation.

5. These persons do not appear to be displaced persons since whatever their nationality they are presumably absorbed into the life of the community where they now reside, and as such cannot be considered as "displaced". I would not therefore recommend that the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission be brought into this.

6. Would you please say whether you are in agreement with the proposals outlined above and if so whether you prefer the American Consul General to deal with the Ministry of the Interior direct, or through your Section and the Interior Sub-Commission, over cases in Italian Government territory.

7. I would be glad of an early reply as the American Consul General is anxious to get a quick decision. I attach two such specimen requests for your examination and should be glad if you would return them with your reply.
