1. I refer to an affair which was originally reported early last month in which some Military Police are alleged to have struck the son of Minister MANCINI.

2. This incident was reported to HQ No. 5 District for a report. A reply was received yesterday in which it was stated that ~~the~~ long inquiries produced no results. It was suggested that an identity parade should be held in order to recognise the individual concerned.

3. Would you please inform me whether you wish this matter pursued further and if so, whether the son of Minister MANCINI would be able to recognise his alleged assailant.
