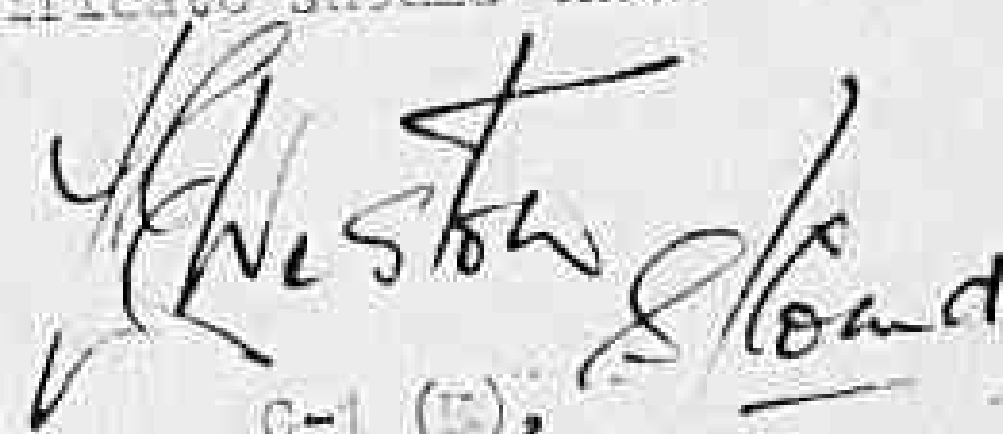

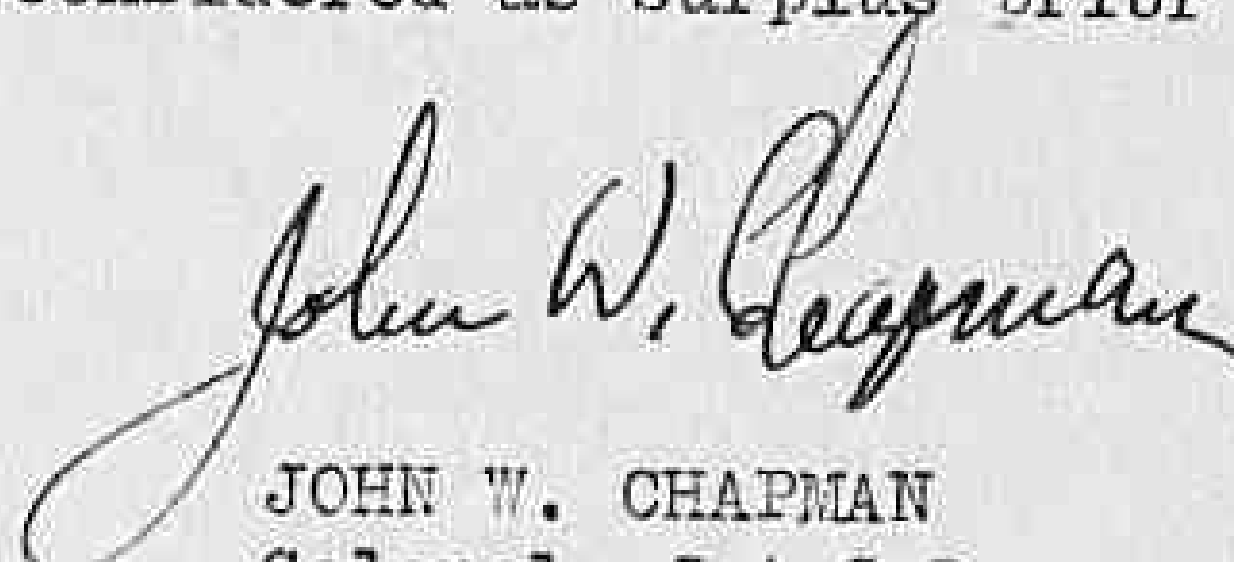

SUBJECT : Record of Officer.

TO : Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission.

1. In view of present policy regarding promotions and decorations the undersigned submits the following for your consideration.

2. This officer's first active assignment in Italy was as CAPO of Aversa Province, comprising fourteen communes and containing a population of over 250,000. He was given this assignment following the admitted inability of his predecessor to maintain public order. After two months his entire area was considered safe enough to be returned to the control of the Italian Government, as a new experiment in AMG.

3. He was then assigned to Capua as CAO/CAPCO, and as the pass issuing officer over the control line at the Volturno River. Again he was advised that the work of the two officers who had preceded him had been highly unsatisfactory. In this position he earned the commendation of Maj. Beer, P.F.S.C. Lt. Col. Doherty 5th Army, Col. Dwyer senior officer of the British troops of that area, and the 3 town majors with whom his work overlapped.

4. Recalled to Public Safety Division of Region 4 for the advance on Rome, he entered the city on 5/6/44 and took over the Prisons of Rome. He found Regina Coeli in a filthy condition, the staff dispersed and demoralized. Reorganization of the personnel and the cleanup of this prison within four hours as to enable large numbers of prisoners to be received and processed was achieved.

5. The undersigned took over quarters at this prison and one half months in spite of

containing a population of over 250,000. He was given this assignment following the admitted inability of his predecessor to maintain public order. After two months his entire area was considered safe enough to be returned to the control of the Italian Government, as a new experiment in AMG.

3. He was then assigned to Capua as CAC/CAPO, and as the pass issuing officer over the control line at the Volturno River. Again he was advised that the work of the two officers who had preceded him had been highly unsatisfactory. In this position he earned the commendation of Maj. Beer, P.B.S.O. Lt.Col.Doherty 5th Army, Col. Dwyer senior officer of the British troops of that area, and the 3 town majors with whom his work overlapped.

4. Recalled to Public Safety Division of Region 4 for the advance on Rome, he entered the city on 5/6/44 and took over the Prisons of Rome. He found Regina Coeli in a filthy condition, the staff dispersed and demoralized. Reorganization of the personnel and the cleanup of this prison within four hours as to enable large numbers of prisoners to be received and processed was achieved.

5. The undersigned took over quarters at this prison and remained there for over five and one half months in spite of knowledge that quarters were available for him at the Ambassador Hotel. He lived in a cell-like room, with no heat or hot water, and for the first two months lived mainly on rations served to prisoners. During this period he personally prevented disturbances, and stopped rioting on 4 occasions with the sole help of his Italian interpreter. There were very few nights that as many as 6 hours sleep were obtained, and, to maintain control of the situation, this officer rarely left the establishment. During his tour at Regina Coeli he received commendations, either verbal or in writing, from Sir Charles, Brigadier Upjohn, Col. Poletti, Lt.Col.Pollock, Lt.Col. Hendrickson, RLC and Major Gilreath RLC, Col.Menay's official report, now in Public Safety Sub-Commission files, is also very favourable, and Col. Hulcy, inspector general's dept. personally praised the undersigned's handling of the prison situation.

6. Subsequently this officer was assigned as Provincial Prison officer, Regional Prison officer, and Prison officer for Allied Commission, and he feels that his work has continued to be satisfactory to his superiors.

7. In view of the above it is respectfully requested that the best offices of the Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission be used to facilitate the return of the undersigned to inactive status.

SUBJECT : Demobilization in Italy of British Military Personnel.

A special procedure was concorded, in agreement with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the British Embassy, to rule the issue of sojourn permits for the British soldiers who wish to remain in Italy as civilians after their demobilization.

Complying with such agreements the applications will be addressed to the concerned Commands that will forward them to the British Embassy in Rome. The latter, after having examined the application with regard to the financial possibility of the applicant for supporting himself during a certain period of time, will send it to this Ministry through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The application, for what concerns the Italian Authorities, shall contain the following details: applicant's full name and paternity, date and place of birth, reasons for the request for sojourn in Italy, place where he intends to reside, length of stay; probationary documents (marriage certificate, working-contract, etc.) will be enclosed if possible.

This Ministry will examine the applications and communicate its decisions to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and, if the request is complied with, also to the competent Prefecture.

The applicant will further on address himself to said Prefecture both to obtain the sojourn authorization and to furnish other eventual details.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, on its turn, will communicate the above decisions to the British Embassy in order that the Military Authorities may proceed to the applicant's demobilization in Italy.

We deem it necessary to point out that the above procedure shall also be applied for the soldiers coming from the British Dominions or Colonies, and, especially, from Australia, Canada, India, New Zealand and South Africa.

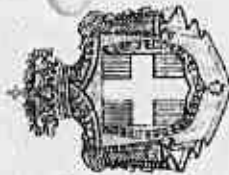
