Subject: Throwing of a bomb against the P.C.I. Section of Sampierdarena.

On 12th inst. at about 23.50 hrs. in Sampierdarena, at the HQ. Communist Party "E. Guerra" Section, in Via Luigi Dottesio, a group of five unknown persons throw, from the street, a German hand-Grenade, which exploded on the window-sill of the first floor, causing damage and breaking window-panes, at the same window.

A certain Carbone Luciano aged 20 from Sampierdarena, workman, who was inside the above mentioned HQ. near the window, was hit by splinters, and wounded at his face, arm, shoulder and right hand. He was taken to Sampierdarena Hospital, where he was judged to be cured within 10 days if complications would not arise.

Carabinieri of Sampierdarena, promptly intervened had only to take note of the fact, because in the meantime the authors thanks to darkness had succeeded to make away.

At 1.30 a.m. - 12/6/46 - in Brescia, some soldiers on guard at the 11th Reg. Artillery Command "Legnano" thinking that unknown persons were trying to assault them, fired volleys from a mitra and threw some handgranades without doing any damage.

With the intervention of the Unit's officers the incident was explained and order re-established.

The following morning, the workmen of the local factory threatened a strike after a protext for the accident believing it to be the work of monarchists.

The strike could be avoided for the intervention of the left parties managers when it was decided to organise a anti-monarchist meeting on the same evening.

HM King Umberto arrived Genoa by sea-plane on the 31/5/46 at 1745 hrs and unknown to the general public visited certain points in the city incognito. At 1900 hrs he visited Persattura. Where he received certain administrative and Italian service officials. His presence became known and a crowd of some thousand persons assembled outside the building and when he departed at 2000 hrs he received a mixed reception from the monarchists and antimonarchist sections which later developed into a scuffle with the parties concerned. Not serious. The King dined at the house of the Marchesa di Groppollo Genoa, where until midnight he received an audience of certain genovese residence. The King remained in the house until 0530 hrs, when he left for Milan accompanied by a small entourage in a convoy of 3 motor cars.

Although both wounded, the a/m CC.RR.'s reacted discharging their weapons against the evildoers, whom they missed owing to the dim light.

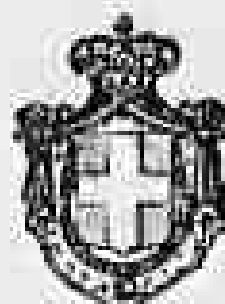
The two CC.RR.'s got wounded on the legs and are liable to recover within 40 days save complications.

SUBJECT : Public Disorder in La Spezia following sentence of Court of Assize.

TO : Director 14191/3
Public Safety Sub-Commission
A.C. Hq. ROME -

1. On the 3rd May 46 at 16.00 hrs. in Corte d'Assisi, La Spezia, following the trial of the former Fascist ALDO ANGELI, sentenced to 17 years imprisonment for Fascist crimes; 400 persons of the population displeased with the verdict, demonstrated outside the Court, expressing their desire to lynch the subject. After some difficulty the CC.RR. and P.S. dispersed the crowd, and removed the prisoner to the Carcere Giudiziario.

2. On the 6th May 1946 the case of AURELIO SALLO, a well known Fascist, charged with even more serious crimes, will commence at the Court, and unless the death penalty is made, the Italian Authorities anticipate serious public re-action and have asked for increased CC.RR. aid, and Italian Military to stand by. Necessary arrangements have been made.

3. A further report of the culmination will be submitted by this office.

Reference is made to your letter of 19th March 1946, concerning disorders which took place at Imperia Province on the 15th February.

The Allied Commission knows already that eight men have been arrested and after the sackings, a large part of the goods have been recovered. Public order was also re-established at once.

The high cost of living, in that Province, provoked the interruption of the work for some days, therefore this Ministry is studying a possible solution in accordance with the present economic-financial situation of the country.

In agreement with Ministry of Treasury, we informed the Prefect of Imperia that we will re-examine the percentage of the cost of living indemnity in conformity with the law of 1945 No. 722 in order to appreciate the cost of living in the tourist centers,

It is also possible that the provision in progress could foresee a retroactive efficacy and the dispositions of Ministry of Treasury concerning the increase of 20% of cost of living and of complementary contributions contained in the article No. 6 of the above mentioned decree will be applied also to the Provinces and Townspeople with the modalities concerning the article No. 14 of the same decree.

At the same time, the Prefect of Imperia, has been invited to arrange the matter and let the people re-assume the duty, because, considering that some provisions are in progress, the strike seems to be unjustified.

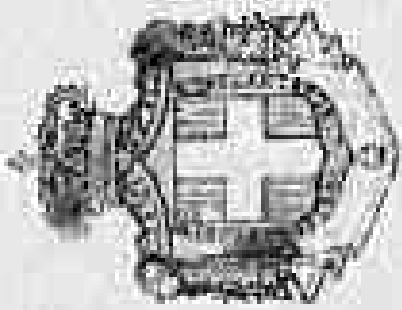

Al riguardo si può confermare quanto già noto a codesta Commissione, che cioè, a seguito dei saccheggi compiuti, furono operati otto arresti e disposte prompte perquisizioni, che fecero recuperare buona parte delle merci sottratte, ristabilendosi così ben presto l'ordine pubblico.

The main cause for alarm is that owing to the delay by the Italian Government in coming to a decision regarding the payment of the cost of living Bonus, it has given fuel to the pro-French propaganda. The French propagandists are now making a great point of the fact that the Italian Government does not support its employees, and they of course state that if the employees were under French administration, this matter would have been settled immediately and their general wellbeing greatly improved.

A telegram has been received this Office from CCRP Imperia, that at 7 30 hours 13 February 46, 1000 demonstrators, protesting against the high cost of living, demonstrated in the centre of city. A few shops were looted with extensive damage. Following intervention of President CCM and Secretary Communist Party, CCRP restored order after 1 hour. A few arrests have been made, and CCRP are investigating responsibility of incident. A telegram received at 1200 hours 14 February 46 states the situation is now tranquil, but there is much discontent with population owing to the action of Italian authority in not having settled the strike of Government employees which has brought public business to a standstill. The local Italian authorities urge immediate Italian Government action in the matter owing to present Italian/French situation.

I inform you that on 9th inst. towards 10.00 hrs. the patrol composed of Finanziere Cacopardo Antonio, Vallorini Giuseppe, Cornicelli Ivano and Isidoro Mario, while on duty on the road which leads from Ciaunà' House to Ventimiglia, was informed that in the square of AIROLO, a French flag had been posted on the wall at a height of 2 meters.

When the soldiers arrived they saw that the flag had been posted in a corner of the square, where about a fifty persons were assembled in an all but peaceful attitude.

The Finanziere Cacopardo, the commander of the patrol ordered that two of his men remain somewhat behind, ready to intervene if necessary, while he and his comrade Isidoro went to remove the flag from the wall.

Finanziere Isidoro, acting with deplorable ease and imprudence, fired a musket-shot at the flag hitting it.

The Sindaco of AIROLO, asked for explanations replied, smiling in a haughty and mocking manner, not to know who had posted the flag there.

From further informations it appears however, that the Mayor not only was not extraneous to the fact, but that it was he himself who had promoted the act. It must be borne in mind that the Mayor owes his position to the French Authorities, who installed him during their occupation of the Zone.

I have arranged that Finanziere Isidoro will be punished.
