MEMORANDUM

13 October 1945

Reporting telephone conversation between
Col. Chapman and Major Goodacre, A/RPSO Liguria at
0945 hours, 18 October, 1945.

1. The press reports concerning attacks on the several forts in the vicinity of Genoa were greatly exaggerated. There has never been any serious attack on any of the forts and none in strength either numbers or weapons.
2. Investigations indicate that the residents in the vicinity of the forts are responsible for such firing as was done as a protest against the storage of ammunition and explosives. They fear other explosions such as have already occurred at Genoa. There is no indication that the attacks had any political significance.
3. On the morning of 17 October, 1945, a sentry at one of the forts was shot by 3 youths for no apparent reason. Investigations are in progress.

CONFIDENTIALGenoa, 12.10.45.ATTACKS ON THE FORCES AROUND GENOA.

The entire Genoese press has given considerable prominence, during the past week, to several attacks made on forts on the immediate outskirts of Genoa. Only the "Unità" (Communist) at first ignored the events, and then endeavoured to belittle them as much as possible. The facts appear to be as follows:

The first attack took place on the night of Saturday to Sunday (6th/7th. October) and had as its objective the Castellaccio Fort on the hill behind Genoa. Apparently three individuals tried to climb over the walls of the fort at about 2200 hours, but were seen and shot at by the sentries, upon which they beat a hasty retreat. Some shots were exchanged, but there were no casualties on the part of the soldiers guarding the fort, and apparently none on the part of the attackers. The fort contains explosives and munitions.

The second attack was directed against a fort, also containing explosives and ammunition, situated at Casale Erzelli near Coronata, not far from the ammunition dumps on Monte Quano and the naval battery at Monte Croce, which latter had been attacked a few nights before. This again was on the outskirts of Genoa and took place on the night of Sunday to Monday (7th./8th. October). Three individuals, armed with sub-machineguns, approached the fort at about 0030 hrs. and shot at the sentry, without hitting him. The soldiers guarding the fort then opened fire in the direction of the attackers. A second attempt to approach the fort was made at 0300 hrs. and was again met by the guards' fire. No casualties were apparently suffered on either side.

The third attack occurred on the night of Monday to Tuesday (8th/9th. October) and was directed, to begin with, against Fort Tenaglia, against which the attackers opened fire at 2200 hrs. According to various reports, the attackers numbered between 40 and 50 and were well armed with sub-machine guns and light and heavy machineguns. There has also been persistent talk of a 45 mm. mortar being used by the attackers. The soldiers guarding Fort Tenaglia fired back and drove the attackers off. The attack was then taken up against the Forte degli Angeli and Fort Granarolo, all on the immediate outskirts of Genoa, in the hills. The Carabinieri there, upon arriving on the scene in force, aided by three (?) armoured cars of their own. Shooting continued up to 0500 hrs. when the attackers finally retreated. More or less heavy shooting had been going on for 7 hours consecutively, and could be seen quite clearly from many parts of the city, and heard in the whole of Central Genoa. Incredible as it may seem, there were again no casualties on the part of the defenders nor, apparently, on the part of the attackers. It seems fairly certain, however, that the Carabinieri's armoured cars, on returning to their barracks, were fired on with machineguns from the roofs of houses in Via Napoli. An Italian army captain, interviewed by a member of the Communist staff, stated that he obtained information to this effect from the Carabinieri headquarters, and was also informed that the tops of the armoured cars bore numerous marks where bullets hit them.

The question everybody is asking is who did it? The vast majority of the population is convinced that the Communists are responsible. Intelligent Centre and Right Wing persons, as well as well-known businessmen, consider that the Communist Party is

endeavouring to create the impression that the masses are exasperated and want to take things into their own hands, in view of the slowness with which matters are developing in Rome, thus enabling the Communist Party to underline its demands for the immediate calling of the Constituent Assembly.

If this theory is correct, the Communists are going about things in a clumsy way, as they are actually alienating sympathies from them very successfully in this manner. Prof. ADAMOLI, Communist and Vice Questore of Genoa until a few days ago, and Secondo PESSI, Communist President of the Ligurian CLE, both expressed the opinion that those responsible are elements endeavouring to cast discredit on the Communist Party (probably "obscure forces of Reaction" as usual) and expressed considerable concern as to the adverse effect these events were having on Communist reputation and prestige.

Another theory/that the Communists are testing the ground to find out what opposition they would meet in the event of major attacks being undertaken in the near future, i.e. a coup d'état, and to find out whether Allied intervention would be forthcoming or not. Actually, Allied armoured vehicles arrived on the scene at about 0700 hrs., after firing had already ceased. According to the same source, the attackers came from two districts, viz: Sampierdarena and from the mount ins behind the forts.

Another opinion held by some is that the attackers were, in all probability, mainly Communist Partisans whom the Party has not been able to control, and that their actions are actually causing considerable inconvenience to the Party at this moment, when relations between A.M.G. and the C.I.M. are none too satisfactory.

The carabinieri in Genoa are extremely nervous, not to say scared, and have a definite inferiority complex due to the continuous campaign of denigration waged against them by the Left and their very obvious inferiority in armament.

Subject : Graves in Rovegno - Result of investigations

As results from investigations carried out at Rovegno there are 13 burial places.

They are all situated in the vicinity of the colony; the first containing 15 bodies of German soldiers, is in close proximity of the inhabited area, the others are at a distance of about 700 meters from that area and consist of 2 groups.

It has not been possible to ascertain the number of the victims there being no helpful elements available for the purpose and chiefly as no traces exist.

According to public rumours some 600 - 700 persons are buried there.

People have presented themselves at the Town Hall of Rovegno who had no news from their relatives, and so they wanted to know whether these relatives might be amongst the victims, but nobody could ever obtain anything definite in that regard.

Up to now there were no exhumations. The bodies in these graves consist of civilians (apparently about 50) German soldiers, soldiers of the brigade here and of the X-th MAS, captured in other zones and concentrated in the abovementioned colony, which, besides serving as hospital for the partisan division "Cichero", served also as prison and as concentration-camp.

The first executions took place in July 1944, then in August and in April 1945. The last execution happened immediately after liberation and according to rumours 49 persons have been executed. According to rumours there were 2 or 3 women amongst them.

The local authorities agreed with the Piccola Opera Divina Provvidenza Don Orione, which actually occupies the colony, to exhumate with its help the bodies, and to bury them in a proper cemetery to be constructed in the place. Exhumation has however had to be postponed to a more suitable season and this for hygienic reasons. At present negotiations are taking place to obtain the consent of the competent authorities in order to start the abovementioned work.

During the period of clandestine resistance the colony was desultorily occupied by the command of the garibaldine division "Cichero" and by the S.A.P. of the same.

It seems necessary to call the attention to the fact, that

the greater part of the graves in question are places where water is flowing when it rains, laying bare some of the bodies, as has already actually happened.

It results clearly from the above that it would be very opportune to exhumate the bodies immediately and to place them into more convenient and chiefly more hygienic conditions in the interest of the population of Rovegno.
