- 3) the director is unjust and over-bearing towards the personnel.

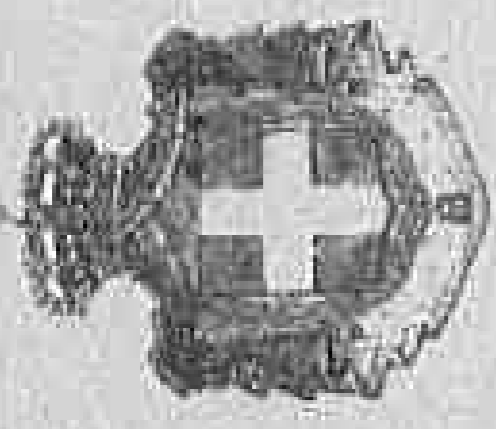
As Pisa is still under the A.M.G. administration, we beg the Allied Commission to give its approval for prompt inspection, together with one of this Ministry's officials.

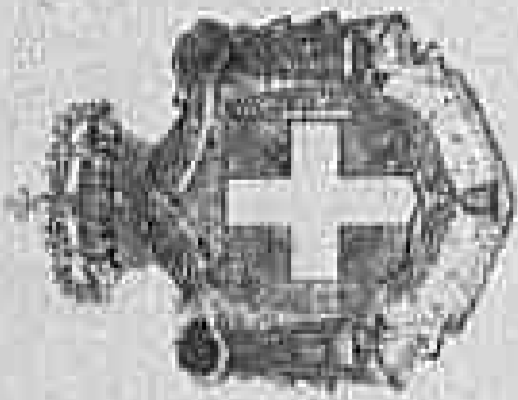

With reference to your communication of
4 April 45, RVIII/IIC/II, the following is offered
for your information and guidance.

1. Operational necessity of varying degrees of urgency has resulted in the taking over of either parts or the whole of penal institutions throughout Italy, to the disruption of normal civilian administration of prisons in the areas effected. In A.M.G. territory the degree of necessity is presumably urgent enough to justify the taking over of prison accommodations by the Military. To the extent that Civil Affairs personnel believe that de-requisitioning should be effected in areas under their jurisdiction it is suggested that the Regional Commissioner contact the S.C.A.C. of the Army Headquarters involved and secure release of accommodations by agreement. The aim of such procedure is in line with established policy to deliver requisitioned institutions back to civilian administration as soon as strict operational necessity no longer prevents. It is felt that the wishes and suggestions of the Regional Commissioner concerning the prisons of Arezzo and Florence should be communicated to S.C.A.F.O. 5th Army.

2. The problem of the segregation of prisoners arrested under epuration procedures, from common prisoners, appears to be dependent on accommodations and available personnel, and is in line with Allied policy that suitable separation between classes of prisoners should be provided wherever deemed advisable.

The Regional Prison Officer is in a position to institute such a program as he believes necessary to achieve the common aims of both Allied and Italian Government prison administration.

3. Under present policy Italian Military Prisoners become "ineffective" and assume civilian prisoner status after

(1) they have been held in custody by Italian Military for 30 days or more

(2) if they have been sentenced for 30 days or more by an Italian Military court. This situation is not satisfactory to either the Ministry of Grace and Justice or the Ministry of War and a new program is in prospect wherein the Ministry of War takes over Italian Military prisoners and confines them in Military prisons. In any event it is pointed out that Civilian prisons are not obligated to accept Italian Military prisoners who are not in the above two categories, and the directors should be so advised.



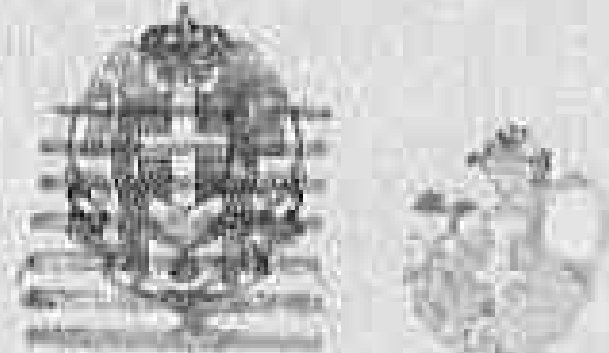

SUBJECT: Prison accommodation.

TO : HQ. AC.

1. The present static conditions of the campaign have inevitably led to a vast increase in minor delinquencies which have to be tried by law. This and the process of epuration has thrown a strain on the prison accommodation in this Region. Congestion is beginning to assume serious proportions. Amongst other measures such as the increased use of "piedi libero" and "denunciare" already implemented, I recommend that efforts be made to secure the release of the following prisons occupied by the Forces:

a. AREZZO. Judiciary Prison is, in part, being used as a Guard House. It is recommended that men who have to be detained be transferred to Holding Centre No. 20 at FLORENCE and that all the prison accommodation, except say half-a-dozen cells, be handed back to the P.C. AREZZO.

b. FLORENCE. With the diminution of military personnel held in the Marati Prison it is requested that two more sections be made over to the PC FLORENCE. (By arrangements with AMG Fifth Army the administration of regional prisons within Fifth Army jurisdiction is undertaken by this Region).

2. Another point which it is desired to press is that persons arrested under the system of epuration be entirely segregated from the ordinary male-factors. There are two angles from which this proposal should be viewed. First, there are, in some jails, partisans incarcerated for over-zealous persecution of alleged fascists. Where partisans and fascists are detained in the same prison trouble is bound to occur. The second angle is that fascism, however epurated, is still strong and I have reason to suspect that petty crimes have, in one instance at least, been carried out in order to gain admittance to jail in order to renew contact with those in custody. Whatever the intention, such contact is undesirable. As this point involves a question of policy it is referred for early guidance. Such segregation is not possible in existing prisons in this Region and it would seem advisable to set aside special accommodation.

3. A further measure to increase prison accommodation would be to require the Italian Government to make separate arrangements for the custody of deserters from the Italian Army. The argument against this course is reported to be that after thirty days an absentee loses his position as a soldier and is, therefore, accommodated in a civil jail; as, however, after the man has served his sentence, he is sent to a military replacement centre it is considered that the prison situation would be materially improved if other arrangements were undertaken.

Subsequently, following verdict, dated 1st December, 1944, issued by the investigating Section at the Florence Appeal Court, which acquitted him, dott. Franchi made an application to be re-instored to the direction of the Pisa prison.

Such desire has been reported, through dott. Calderera of this Ministry, to Lt. Guarini, prison Officer of AMG Toscana, and Lt. Guarini has informed us, that, due to the advanced age of the mentioned dott. Franchi, he would not appreciate that the latter be entrusted with any direction whatsoever of prison establishments under his control.

As it is necessary however to employ dott. Franchi, the Commission's approval is requested, requesting kindly to communicate whether dott. Franchi may be re-employed, if not in the Toscana Region, in some other Region under AMG jurisdiction.

3. Due to the fact that Toscana Region has been a battle-line, many of the prisons have lost considerable staff. It has been difficult to replace these men and I have been granted permission by the Minister of Grace and Justice to hire new men for this service. I have been doing this. It has not been possible, as yet, to secure uniforms. Many of my guards are in rags with very bad shoes, and this is a poor psychological factor in dealing with prisoners. So far no results have been obtained from demands made to the Minister.

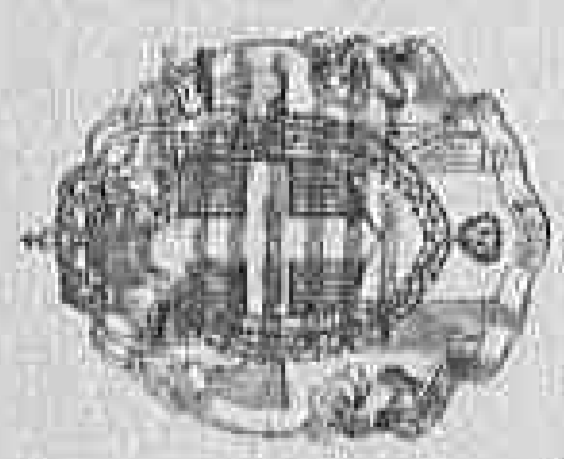

1. Both the prisons at Campiglia Marittimo and Piombino are functioning and will continue to be necessary to us as long as the Port of Livorno functions as an Allied port. Campiglia was transformed into a women's prison to take care of the large number of women that are being arrested in Livorno. Many of these women are prostitutes and the usual procedure is to give them a pass south after their sentence has been completed. Since Campiglia is at the southern end of Livorno Province this procedure is facilitated. The Pretore was instructed to hire wardenesses and has done so. Any allocation of money necessary to operate this prison should be made. The prison of Piombino is in use as a men's prison and houses at present 39 prisoners. A shipment from here was sent to Portolongone to start cleaning up the Penitentiary there. This prison is very necessary for Piombino is a fairly large city and it will also be necessary to have a prison there to house prisoners while they are waiting shipment to the Penitentiary at Portolongone. Neither of these prisons can be closed at present.

2. There is no objection to retiring SIGHIERI Quinto, art master of the Boy's Reformatory at Pisa. The staff is complete there and there are but few prisoners.

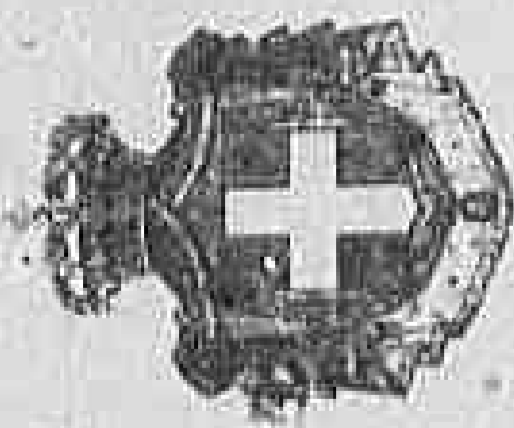

- With reference to the verbal agreements reached with Major Hanbury on the 28th of February, 1945, it is stated:
- 1) that it is possible to transfer the agents of the provinces under the Administration of the Italian Government only to those of the Toscana Region, but that authorisation by A.C. is always necessary;
 - 2) that the agents on leave, belonging to the Volterra and San Gimignano establishments must return to their offices and cannot be assigned or attached to other establishments;
 - 3) that the agents on leave, belonging to other establishments of the Toscana Region, who do not want to return, may be contented to the discretion of this Ministry, bearing especially in mind their health and family conditions;
 - 4) that when the temporary closing of the Capraia and Gorgona establishments will be effected, in each one of these prisons, two agents will be able to remain in order to watch the premises.

It would be appreciated to have, in due time, a nominative list of the agents who will remain at Capraia and Gorgona and of those who will be transferred with the indication of the establishments to which they will be assigned;

- 5) that the under-chief Leonildo Consalvi must be removed from Pianosa; he is one hold back in service and therefore A.M.G., if deeming advisable, can dismiss him.

Subject : Prison Staff.

To : A.C. Public Safety Sub-Commission - Rome.

We reply to the a/m letters, communicating as follows:

It does not appear to this Ministry that at the Viterbo prisons then wardens are waiting to reach the Toscana prison institutions; nevertheless the Director of a/m prisons has been already requested to report in this regard.

From the perusal of the records existing at this Office, the agents of whom in the enclosed list appear to belong to the staff of the penal establishments of the above Region and are actually attached to other institutions. With ordinance being taken their return to the places to which they belong has been disposed, exception is made for those, who, with previous authorisation of the Commission, have been transferred elsewhere, and for the agent Marino Gabriele, for whom, except that there are no contrary reasons on the part of the Commission, no instructions have been given for his return to Volterra, as he did not belong to the staff of the prison, but was only on temporary duty; this agent belongs instead to the staff of the Salerno prisons, where he actually is and where he returned to service at the end of a period of convalescent leave, granted to him for injuries suffered at Volterra as a result of war events.

We assure that by recent provision 8 agents have been transferred from the prisons of Rome to those of Grosseto, who should reach the new Office as soon as possible.

For the judicial prisons of Leghorn the assignment of ten volunteer agents had been disposed, but, as from these, up-to the present time, only one presented himself, measures will be taken for the assignment of other agents to be newly appointed.

Besides which, it is communicated that the Director of the judicial Asylum of Montelupo Fiorentino, with letter n. 111 dated 14/1/45, has reported that, by order of the Allied Military Command - Toscana -, the agents Bitossi Narcision, Mardini Cesare and Bonacci Nicola coming from the penal establishment of Massa Apuania, as refugees following war reasons, have been assigned to the Leghorn prisons.

Finally, it is assured, that with circular in preparation, which will be sent to the Directors of the prison institutions, instructions are issued that no leaves be granted to the wardens who are on duty in establishments existing in A.M.G. territory unless the leave is authorised by the competent Allied Authorities.

DELLA VOLPE Luigi Belonging to the staff of Pistoia - was sent on the 20/11/1944, by the director on leave to Aversa - attached to the judicial Asylum of Aversa. His return to Pistoia arranged.

ARENA Antonio Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - on 5/9/44 went on leave to Ancona (his previous Hq.) to have news from his family who has died during the Ancona bombardment and remained attached to these prisons. Contacted the Ancona Director so that he reaches direct agreements with the Allied Authorities for the return of ARENA to Pianosa. The director, instead, with letter dated 18/1/45 proposes that the agent be definitely left at Ancona considering that his wife and daughter are still unburied in the collapsed gallery. His return to Pianosa has been disposed.

NICOLETTI Gennaro Belonging to the staff of Florence - in September, 1943, sent by the director on leave to Matera, remained attached to those prisons - A.C. has not granted authorisation for his return to Florence being the place north of the control line.

COVIELLO	Leonardo	Disbanded from Pianosa - has been attached to the Bari prisons. Has filed application for dismissal from service for the expired term of service. By cable dated 16 inst. discharged.
DI LERNIA	Domenico	Belonging to the staff of Volterra - sent on leave by the director to S. Maria C.V. during last January - temporarily attached to those prisons. His return to Volterra has been disposed.
BROTINI	Egidio	Belonging to the Staff of Leghorn - sent on temporary duty to Montelupo Fiorentino, by ministerial provision dated 15/11/43, remained at the latter establishment.
SABATINI	Mariano	Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - in June, 1944 was sent to Rome on mission to withdraw office printed matters at the printing-house Mantellate. Due to lack of communications could not return to Pianosa and has been attached to the Rome prisons. Actually is on temporary duty at the Foggia prisons.
AMBROGI	Antonio	Belonging to the staff of the Collesferro penal establishment - in April, 1944 was sent on mission to Spoleto. Subsequently by ordinance 11/4/44, has been transferred to the Pisa prisons, office which he could not reach for lack of transport. Actually attached to the Spoleto penal establishment, director of which has been told to make Ambrogi leave for Pisa as soon as possible.
SALEMME	Giuseppe	Belonging to the Volterra staff - sent by the director on leave to S. Maria C.V. remained attached to these prisons (see letter of the director n. 2933 dated 13/12/1944). His return to Volterra has been disposed.
FURZI	Elvizio	Belonging to the S. Gimignano staff - sent by the director on leave to Grosseto - remained attached to those prisons. The Commission has granted authorisation for his return to S. Gimignano. Steps are being taken in this regard.

FAVALE	Antonio	Belonging to the staff of Florence - on the 30/5/44, went to Rome to see his family and could not return to Florence due to the lack of transport. Arrangements have been made for his return to Florence.
SILVESTRI	Nicola	Belonging to the staff of Leghorn - sent on convalescent leave to Avellino in December, 1943, he has been attached to those prisons. His return to Leghorn has been arranged.
FEDERICI	Antonio	Belonging to the staff of Pianosa. Evacuated on 13/6/44 (see letter from Pianosa direction n.1094 dated 13/6/44. Attached to Rome with ministerial letter n.98437 dated 21/11/44). His return to Pianosa has been disposed.
TRAFFICANTE	Gaetano	Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - In January, 1944, was sent on leave to Sulmona. In April, 1944 he has been attached to the L'Aquila prisons, confirmed by ministerial letter n. 92888 dated 18/12/944. His return to Pianosa has been disposed.
PAPPALARDO	Filippo	Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - during last January was sent on leave to Minea, personally reported to the chief of staff the impossibility to return at the end of the leave. He had been attached to the Sciacca prisons. Such attachment has been revoked and his return to Pianosa ordered .
APICERNI	Verrengia Pasquale	Belonging to the staff of Leghorn - was sent in November, 1943 on temporary duty to the Rome prisons and has been attached to these prisons. His return has been ordered.
FAEDDA	Giovanni	Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - in December, 1943 was sent on leave to L'Aquila - has been attached to these prisons. His return has been ordered.
CAPONE	Mario	Belonging to the staff of Florence - In July, 1944, he filed application to the office in Northern Italy for dismissal from duty at the expired term of service. Such application was not considered.

Capone, however, left the service on 16/9/44 taking residence at Avellino. Following his application he has been re-assumed into service and attached to the Isernia prisons (see ministerial letter n.2048 dated 26/10/1944). His return to Florence has been ordered.

CIPICCHIA Vittorio

Belonging to the Staff of Montelupo Fiorentino - was sent on temporary duty to the Genova prisons, was sent by this director in October, 1943, on leave to L'Aquila. At the end of the leave he has been attached to the L'Aquila prisons. His return has been disposed.

CIMINI Angelo

Belonging to the staff of Florence - was sent on the 28/4/44 by the director on leave to Opi, at the end of the leave he has been attached to the Rome prisons. His return to Florence disposed.

PUCCIA Francesco

Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - was sent on leave to Modica in Nov.44 (exact date does not appear) - at the end of the leave he has been attached to the Siracusa prisons, where he has been definitely transferred on 18/12/44 (transfer approved by A.C. with letter 1/12/1944).

GRILLO Luigi

Belonging to the staff of S.Gimignano - was sent on leave to Rossano (period not stated) - at the end of the leave he did not return to his office

FOGLIAROSSA Guido

Belonging to the staff of S.Gimignano - was sent on leave by the director on 28/11/44 to Salerno - has been attached to those prisons. His return to S.Gimignano has been disposed.

BOCCIA Michele

Belonging to the staff of ~~Montelupo~~ along one in May, 1944, following evacuation, was sent on temporary duty to S. Gimignano - The director of the S. Gimignano penal establishment sent him on leave to Acerenza (Potenza) in Nov.1944 - at the end of the leave did not return to S.Gimignano; instead has been attached to the Naples prisons following Central director's initiative who reporting to the Ministry (letter 8/11/1944) proposed his definite

assignment to those prisons. Return to to S.Gimignano disposed.

PASSARETTA Giuseppe Belonging to the staff of S.Gimignano - was sent on leave to Sessa Aurunca in August, 1944, at the end of the leave he presented himself at the Rome prisons, where in view of the impossibility to proceed the travel he has been attached (see letter n.13401 dated 19/9/44); definitely transferred to Rome by ordinance 12/11/1944, on A.C.'s approval (letter 25/10/1944).

GALLO Giuseppe Belonging to the staff of Pianosa - following evacuation, on the 8/6/44 has been attached to the S.Gimignano penal establishment - in Nov.44, was sent by the director on leave to Caltanissetta - At the end of the leave instead of returning to his office he presented himself to the director of the minor re-education Centre of S.Cataldo who temporarily assumed him reporting to the Ministry and proposing his definite assignment (letter n.41 dated 9/1/45). But the Ministry with letter n.89369 dated 12/1/1945 disposed his immediate return to Pianosa.

DELLA SALA Angelo Belonging to the staff of S.Gimignano - sent, in October, 1944, on leave to Reggio Calabria - at the end of the leave he has been transferred to the Reggio Calabria prisons (ordinance n.7234 dated 12/11/44) on A.C.'s approval (letter 25/10/1944).

MARINO Gabriele Belonging to the staff of Salerno - sent on temporary duty to Volterra in August, 1943 - Following war events this agent suffered injuries on the 2/7/1944. Got into hospital was released on the 20/8/1944 and 60 days of convalescent leave was granted. Went to ~~Volterra~~ ^{Salerno} where he actually is.

ARGENIO Alfonso Belonging to the staff of Montelupo Fiorentino - on the 22/6/43 was sent on convalescent leave (six months) to Bellizzi (Avellino) - At the end of the leave he has been attached to the Avellino prisons, by order of the director of the Naples central prisons (see letter n.3737 dated 11/11/44 of the Avellino prisons) - With order in preparation his return to Monte lupo Fiorentino has been disposed.

MATTIELLO	Nicola	Belonging to the staff of the Pistoia prisons - Following evacuation of these prisons he was assumed on temporary duty at the Florence prisons. On the 27/7/44 was removed together with other agents from Florence and brought to several concentration camps from where he succeeded then to reach his native country (Carinola). Has filed application asking for his definite transfer to Aversa. The Ministry with letter dated 26/10/1944 disposed his attachment to the Naples prisons pending the A.C.'s authorisation for his return to Pistoia. With provision in preparation his return to Pistoia has been disposed.
OLIVIERO	Egisto	Belonging to the staff of Montelupo Fiorentino - on 2/1/44 was sent on leave to Soriano nel Cimino and did no more return to his office. With letter in preparation the director of the Soriano penal establishment has been contacted and requested to make this agent immediately return to Montelupo.
GIANNINI	Luigi	Belonging to the staff of the Florence prisons; left his service arbitrarily on 26/6/44 and presented himself at the Montelupo Fiorentino Asylum where he performed duties for some days. Left Montelupo without authorisation and presented himself at the Rome prisons. The Ministry disposed his return to Florence reached by him on the 4/9/44. Assumed into service he again left abusively; returned to Rome where he has been attached to the local re-education Centre. Return to Florence has been disposed. Disciplinary measures are being taken for arbitray absence from service.
CIRIELLO	Raffaele	Belonging to the staff of Portolongone - In may, 1944, he was assigned on temporary duty to the S.Gimignano penal establishment following evacuation of Portolongone. On the 28/11/44 was sent by the director on 26 days leave to Nocellato (Naples). At the end of the leave did not return to his office. Has filed application for transfer to Naples. With provision in preparation, return to S.Gimignano has been disposed.

Dr. Marzarisi, Liaison Official for the Minister of Grace and Justice, with this region, received a letter from the Minister stating that prison guards on temporary duty South cannot come back to Toscana without the permission of A.M.G. I would like to say that we will be glad to grant that permission. This is just a further effort on his part to delay the return of these men to their proper stations.

2. A large packet of letters to all the provinces of Toscana, from the Minister, came thru this office this morning. They were all read and sent on, some with comments added by myself. These are a few of the irregularities that were noted.

- (a) Guards DE AMICIS Vincenzo and MEMICHINI Nicola on leave from Volterra Penitentiary were granted an additional 16 days by the Minister.
- (b) Guard CANNONI Leonidio of Siena was to report for disciplinary hearing without me knowing the nature of his offense. Several other guards were suspended without informing me what the reason was.
- (c) Guard DELLA Volpe Luigi of Pistoia, who had overstayed his leave from that prison, was transferred to Avreca where he is now.
- (d) Commandante GRANDINETTI Pasquale of Grosseto, who had recently left on leave South has been transferred to Salerno.
- (e) Guard PUCCIA Francesco of San Gimignano Penitentiary, on leave South, had been transferred to Siracusa.

I wish to emphasize now, more than ever, that this Region has been a battlefield where many of the most severe engagements of this war have been fought. Furthermore, a part of this Region has remained the battle line for months. As a result of this many prisons have been totally evacuated. Staffs have been scattered and must be re-assembled to enable these prisons to function. Several prisons have been completely destroyed. With the Army in this area crime is prevalent and the prisons in the Region are rapidly approaching their capacity. Many of the prison guards have gone North and cannot be re-called to their post. In spite of all this the Minister continues to transfer prison guards out of this area and refuses to send others here. To protect myself I have found it necessary to issue an order to prison directors that they are not to grant any further leaves to guards with families out of Toscana. It is requested that this matter be brought forcibly to the Minister's attention. I have my problems here and they are not eased any by his actions.

Personally, I intend to conduct an investigation as quietly as I can. If I can prove to myself that the man is honest, he stays, if otherwise, I'll recommend his transfer.

1. A complaint has been received from the Regional Public Safety Officer of Toscana Region in which he states that the Directors of Prisons in Toscana have, in accordance with instructions received from the Ministry of Grace and Justice, been granting guards leave to visit their families in the South and in Sicily. And as a result many of them do not return and in fact many of these Guards present themselves to the Office of your Ministry and arrange to have themselves transferred to other prisons of their own choice.

2. This must be stopped and a list is being prepared by the Public Safety Officer and when it arrives I will check it against your request for transfers and any found will be sent back to Toscana, as there is a shortage of Prison Guards in that Region.

3. You must realize that Toscana has not been returned to Italian Government Control and is still A.M.C.

4. I trust you will notify the Directors of Prison in Toscana that this practice will stop at once and they will maintain their prison staffs at full strength.

1. In reply to your R-VIII/PS/9.2, dated 9 Jan. 45, reference the above subject, enclosed you will find a letter sent to the Minister of Grace and Justice.

2. In reply to Para 2 of your letter the ration as laid down for Prison Guards is one for all Public Security personnel and is to be paid for by the Italian Government. I must call your attention to the fact that this only applies to Prison Guards and does not include clerks or civilian workers who are not part of the Custodial Staff. These employees must pay for their food and are not, repeat, not to receive the Prison Guard rations.

3. I would appreciate if you will make an investigation and send the result to me if the guards are receiving the rations as laid down in AD/LH-1/food of 18 Oct. 1944 also if the prisoners are receiving the ration of 250 grams of bread and 80 of pasta per day, as went into effect on Jan. 1st 1945. also if soap has been issued to prisons.

1. The prison directors of Toscana, in accordance with instructions from the Minister of Grace and Justice, have been granting guards leave to visit their families in the south of Italy and Sicily. A serious problem has resulted from this. From one prison alone, the Penitentiary at S. Gimignano, 12 guards out of a force of 54 have not returned. Other prisons have reported the same complaint to a lesser degree. This office has been led to understand that several of the guards have presented themselves to the office of the Minister of Grace and Justice and have had themselves transferred to prisons of their own choice. This definitely must be stopped. These men are in a service comparable to the army and cannot engineer their own transfers because conditions in Toscana are not ideal. Several of the prisons have had their staffs scattered about the country and re-establishing these particular institutions is difficult enough without having this situation to contend with. A list of these guards is being prepared and will be forwarded to your office. In the meantime it would be appreciated if a word is spoken to the Minister concerning this matter.

2. A letter from the Minister of the Interior, dated 25 October 1944, to all Public Safety Agencies, states that the rations scale, as set up by ACC and the Italian Government, for these Agencies, is to be supplied at the expense of the Italian Government. Prison Staffs are obviously in this category but since they do not come under the Minister of the Interior they cannot be included. A search of the files revealed no authority that may grant prison staffs this same consideration. In some areas the food is supplied without expense to the staff and in others the staff has had to pay. This has caused considerable dissatisfaction. 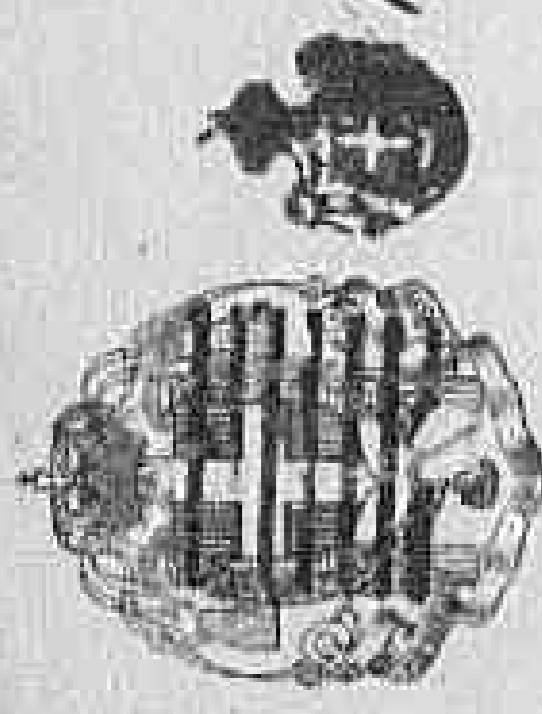

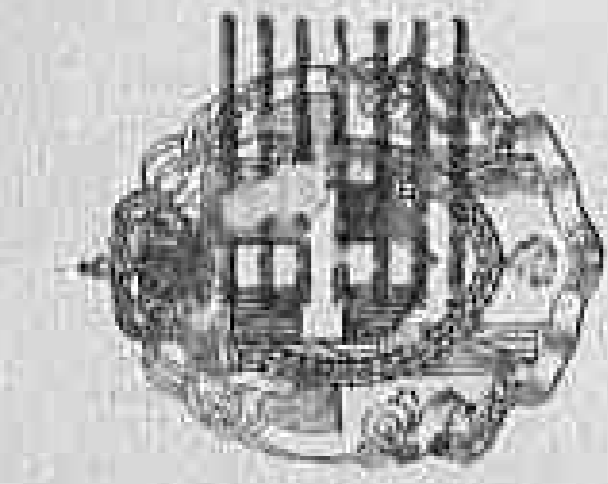



1. As yet this office has received no response to the letter R-VIII/PS/9.2, 3 November 1944, concerning the removal of Dr. Ugo Raffaele Costa from this position.
2. Dr. Costa's work has shown no improvement in the interim and if a replacement is not forthcoming shortly it may be found necessary to relieve him outright and place the Commandante in charge, who is, incidentally, a very capable person.
3. Dr. Costa himself has expressed the desire to be transferred from Livorno as he claims the climate there is affecting his health. His wishes are in accord with this office.
4. When Livorno was entered the prison was completely deserted and ever since then efforts have been made to collect an adequate staff. In spite of all efforts the custodial force is still under strength and several of the men now serving have been recalled from pension and they should be sent back. Two underguards are needed as there is only one on duty at present. This office would like to know if the Minister of Grace and Justice can furnish guards to serve there.
5. The turnover of prisoners at Livorno is heavy because ^{of the} importance of the city as a port. If any prison in the Region needs a competent staff under capable leadership, it is that particular institution.

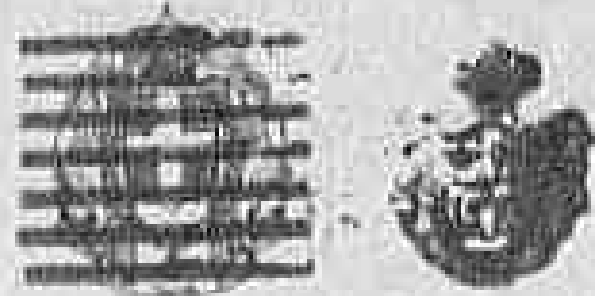

1. I have to-day had a visit from Dr. MAZZARISI, Director of Prisons, Florence, who has just returned from Rome where he had business with his Department.

2. Whilst in Rome he was seen by Major HAMBURY, Public Safety, A.C.C., who informed him that there was in existence a letter stating that he was not on duty at his post during the first days of Allied occupation of this City. This letter however was not produced *(file missing)*

3. In order to clarify the position and to clear any stigma that may be attached to the Director's name, I submit the following information.

4. I entered Florence on "D" day and have worked here continuously since. After a period South of River Arno, I crossed to the North bank on the first day Allied troops entered the North of the City. Owing to certain Military changes which were made at the time I was the sole representative of the Public Safety Division and as such commenced "vetting" all Police and other officials. I contacted Dr. MAZZARISI the second day I was here, interviewed him and served him with SCHEDA PERSONALE. F.S.S. returned this in due course "satisfactory".

5. Dr. MAZZARISI has an excellent reputation here which is supported by British, American and other nationals who have been imprisoned here during recent years. He has given us every support and cooperation since our arrival.

6. It is possible that a mistake has been made in this case and to prevent this alleged absence being recorded against him, I submit the foregoing information.

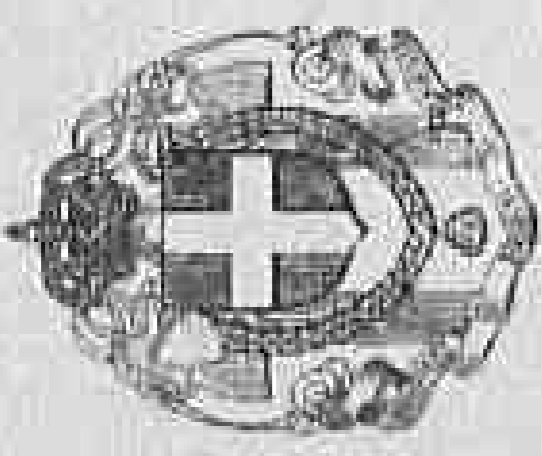



1. Dr. Mario Basile, Ragioniere of the Casa di Reclusione, at Volterra, Province of Pisa, was placed in charge of the institution on 20th July 1944 when the former Director, a fascist, had departed with the Germans.

2. The prison was heavily shelled by our artillery as the Germans were using it for an OP. Every section of the prison was damaged to some extent. Dr. Basile took over and has done a most excellent job in returning the institution to normalcy. He located building materials and with the aid of our transportation got it to the prison. He organized the prisoners for the labour and at present they have reestablished 2 complete cell blocks that can accommodate 400 prisoners. He has handled both prisoners and guards excellently. The large number of political prisoners arrested by the Partisans was well handled and at present only criminal prisoners are left there. He also established a section for women prisoners.

3. Dr. Basile has shown ability and cooperation in his capacity as Director of the institution and this Office strongly recommends that he be appointed as a 2nd Class Director to remain at his post in Volterra.

4. Dr. Basile entered the Prison Service on 15 September, 1934.

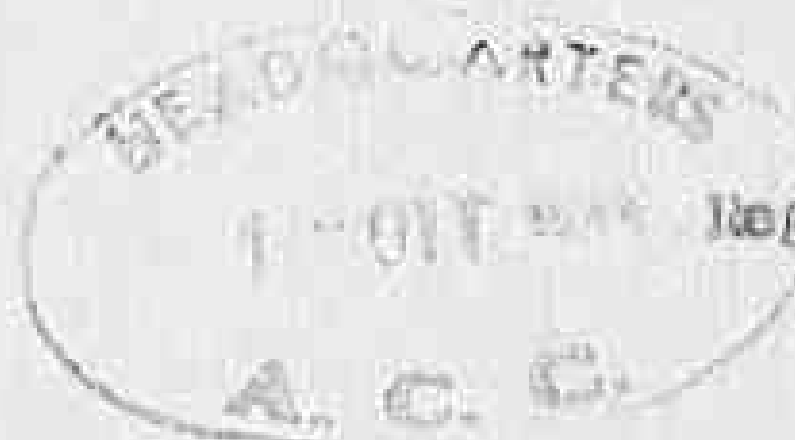

1. Herewith letter from the acting Director of the Penal Settlement on Pianosa, addressed to the Ministero di Grazia e Giustizia, Roma, with reference to the appointment of a permanent doctor for the prison and civil population of Pianosa.

2. The present system of sending a doctor from Elba is highly unsatisfactory for everybody concerned.

3. The Penal Settlement on CAPRAIA is also without a doctor, and it is several months since a doctor visited the island. There are many ill people on Capraia, and it is suggested that the appointment of a permanent doctor on Pianosa could provide medical attention for the two islands.

Doctor of the Penal Settlement of Pianosa

This is for the information of the Ministry, ^{that} notwithstanding the damages provoked by war, which include the destruction of the directors' house, almost all the services of these settlements are going on well. We feel all the same, the necessity of relacing again relations with the central offices/ Among the things going wrong, there is the sanitary service. This is now ~~exercised~~ carried on, since the ~~dea~~ death of Dr. Alfredo Ferrari, under the ruins of the Directors' house, the 17th of April 944, by the civil doctors of the island of Elba, who alternate them selves every 20 days, with the inconvenience you can imagine, ~~due~~ to their scarce practice of the beginning, and to the fact that ~~for~~ them is difficult and unwanted to stay here. We need a doctor as soon as possible, who is able to cure the prisoners, of which 222 are now ill, and 132 well standing, and the civil population amounting to 250 people.

This letter is sent by means of the Allied Government, represented by Capt. Bently, resident in the Island of Elba, and ~~time~~ to time coming here

We said this officer too, that the Ministry could ask Dr. Edoardo Bocchini, second doctor of the Hospital, who went in holidays in July 1943 to Montemarrano (Avellino) if he wants to come back at once. Waiting for ~~an~~ quick answer, we would know too, how much we must pay the doctors now acting.
