Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission.

The writer reports as requested:-

1. That he has taken over his duties as ^APrison Officer ¹of liberated Italy, with Headquarters at Naples, succeeding Capt. G.F. DALEY.

2. That although the city of Naples itself is still under AMG but as Dott. Ermete BONOMI, the Italian career director of Poggioreale prison and Inspector of Prisons in the Southern Region, has such a splendid professional reputation locally; that the trend, after talking both to you and Capt. DALEY seems to require liaison functions more and more such as supervising; assisting the Italian Officials when called upon by them for help; and finally to see to it that the proper reports are made, tabulated and sent to their destination on time.

3. That he has already had two conferences with Dr. BONOMI one at Poggioreale (the big prison in Naples) and at S. Eframo the boys prison in Naples.

4. Arrangements have already been made for a through inspection by the writer, accompanied by Dr. BONOMI, of the above institutions in the near future.

5. The monthly reports due on or about the first of March have already been forwarded by Capt. DALEY, whose cooperation and courtesies have been most appreciated by the writer.

Lecce 10 Dec. 44

SUBJECT: Revolt at Military Prison at Otranto (Lecce Province).

On the 9th December 1944 at 1600 hours at Otranto (Lecce) due to previous complaints owing to small food rations and inefficient guarding of the prison staff several inmates in the Royal Navy Prisons assaulted the Government personnel and mutinied. The quick intervention of CC.RR. prevented inmates from escaping, but 180 remaining isolated in the prison started to throw things in the courtyard burning them. The undersigned with the help of the Procuratore del Regno of the local Tribunale Militare, CC.RR. from the Lecce Group and Arsenale Taranto, and sailors from Brindisi and Taranto had the prison surrounded. With the use of machine guns they stopped any attempt of escape. Today CC.RR. Captain with the prison Inspector and the Procuratore del Regno talked with a group of inmates persuading them to return to their cells at 1000 hours. 8 inmates injured, two seriously. During the day the s/m inmates will be transferred to other prisons. Order re-established. Information sent also to War and Navy Ministries.

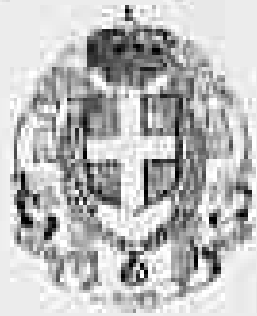

The Court of Justice of Santa Maria Capua Vetere, with sentence dated 3/5/43, and rendered irrevocable, condemned Miele Vincenzo, with the attendant of partial mental vice, to 10 months of reclusion, and 6 months and 20 days of arrest for aggravated resistance, drunkenness, disturbance of people, and omitted denunciation of a dagger and a revolver; Miele was ordered to a rest and custody home for a period of not less than six months.

Miele was arrested on the 5/8/42 and taken to the judiciary prison of Santa Maria Capua Vetere. He should have ended his detention on 25/12/43, and on the next day be interned in a rest and custody home.

But on 18/10/43 Miele was set free, following orders by Francis M. Wraj Major, Ang. Ligison, Officer 56 Division. We beg therefore to give us some information concerning the liberation order, copy of which is attached, and to notify us if this order concerns the remaining detention punishment that Miele should have undergone from 18/10 to 25/12/43, or also security provisions of the rest and custody home that Miele has not yet done.

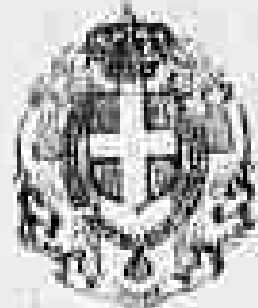

TO : ACC. Public Safety Sub-Commission
(Attention Major E.W. Hanbury).

1. The attached report on the existing conditions at Taranto prison, received from the Zone Commissioner, Taranto Zone, is forwarded for your information, and with the request that it be brought to the urgent attention of the Minister of Grace and Justice.
2. In forwarding this report I cannot but reiterate my previous remarks on the necessity of a representative of the Minister of Grace and Justice being on the spot in the Southern Region to inspect the prisons situated therein.
3. Now that the prisons have been turned over to the Italian Government, I, at this level, can only advise, I cannot order the Directors to pay more attention to the functioning of their prisons. An inspector from the Ministry of Grace and Justice, however, could issue definite instructions on the spot, without the need of reporting through channels, as would have been done by us during the AMG. phase.
4. Two representatives of the Ministry of Grace and Justice, Comm. Salvatore Auriemma, and Comm. Tommaso di Arienzo, called to see me last month to discuss prisons in this Region. Both agreed that it was necessary for a resident inspector to be on tap in the Southern Region, and both

appeared to be of the opinion that Dott. Bonomi was suitable for the job. However, although an answer to the question was promised in a reasonably short time, todate I have heard nothing further about it.

1. On 21 Sept. 44, accompanied by Zone Police and Supply Officers I visited the Judicial Prison at Taranto.

2. I first dealt with two complaints which had been received from the Director of the prison:-
(a) regarding bedding, blankets and surgical instruments, which it is alleged had been removed by Allied Forces during the time the place was requisitioned by them. No marching in or marching out statements were made and the matter has been referred to Town Major, Taranto, for his investigation.
(b) a hole has been made through the outside prison wall by Allied Forces encamped outside to allow a chimney from a cooking stove to jut into the prison garden. On inspection this was found to be quite unnecessary as an upright chimney on the outside could and should have been erected. The responsible unit is 224 L.A.A. and the matter has been reported to the Town Major, Taranto, for necessary action.

3. I then inspected the prison which is FILTHY. There is a general appearance of dirt. The mens' lavatories are disgusting, stone floors and stairs do not appear to have been washed down for a long time, and the garden inside the prison wall contains a stinking heap of rubbish which is a veritable paradise for fly breeding. The excuse offered by the Director that there is no water on certain floors does not 'hold water' since the womens' section on the top floor is reasonably clean and showed signs of having been washed down an hour or two before my visit. It does not seem to have struck the Director that the male prisoners could carry water to effect the cleaning of their of their own quaters.

4. There are six showers and one bath, none of which function. Prisoners stated that they had not bathed for over two months. There is a shortage of electric light bulbs, which the Director says he cannot obtain. Both in the case of the baths and bulbs he does not appear to have taken any active steps to remedy the faults.

5. The director states that:-
 Normal accomodation is 195 males and 25 females. Total 220
 Numbers now housed are 340 males and 36 females. Total 376

It will be seen that overcrowding is a serious problem. In one cell approximately 28' X 33' X 12' there are 36 males. In the female section some cells house six instead of the normal two. If an epidemic broke out in the prison few, if any, of the prisoners could escape disease.

6. There is no segregation of prisoners awaiting trial and those under sentence, and there are 16 juveniles in custody.

7. There is **AD** infirmary working. The Director states that it is in the course of being prepared for occupation, and it is necessary to repair the beds etc. first. Prisoners who report sick are seen by the visiting doctor but have no place to go to other than their over-crowded cells.

8. It was impossible to get any accurate information from the Director who either had to ask the Head Warden who did not know the answers, or to refer to the office where information was extremely difficult to obtain and I am confident that any information obtained was inaccurate.

9. I am of the opinion that the Director, Dott. VALENTI Luigi, who has been in charge since Aug. 43, and the Chief Warden LA SALA Adamo, who has been in this post since Jan 43, should both be removed forthwith and I ask that his aspect receives urgent consideration.

JUNE 1944

1. List of Prison in use.

A list of prisons now in use, showing capacity and approximate number of inmates is shown in Appendix "C".

2. Progress in closing of Mandamentali Prisons.

The accomodation situation still does not warrant the closing of any prison at this stage.

3. General Condition of Prisons in respect of:

(a) Administration.

The prisons population continues to increase and there is, apart from the small Mandamentali prisons in the Provinces of Avellino and Benevento, general overcrowding. Fortunately the increase of admissions over releases was not so high in June, the approximate number being 300, whilst in May it was 983. However the position is still bad, especially in the small prisons in the Torre Annunziata - Sorrento area, where pilfering in the docks is responsible for many arrests. A building in this area is in the process of being converted into a prison to relieve the congestion.

Interference by troops with prison officials is cropping up again. Two cases have been reported recently. At Sorrento, where Allied troops fired shots at the prison staff in trying to release a prostitute, and at Barra where Allied troops were responsible for the escape of four men, two of whom were awaiting trial for manslaughter.

(b) Hygiene

In the Penal and Judicial prison conditions are quite fair, but in the Mandamentale it is still bad in spite of local efforts. Many of these places should be closed, and will be, as soon as other accomodation becomes available.

Two further cases of small-pox were reported during the month, one at Poggioreale and the other at Procida. All prisoners in the affected areas have been vaccinated.

(c) Prison Labour

Prison labour is concentrated on supplying equipment, of which there is an urgent need.

(d) Food

The staff rations have been increased but that of the inmates remains unchanged. Now that the civilian rations has been increased it is hoped that the inmates case will be reviewed. Their ration looks quite healthy on paper, but in actual fact only produces a small loaf of bread and a bowl of decent soup each day. If it were not for the extras received from their families prisoners would have a very thin time.

4. Records.

Taking into consideration the abnormal numbers with which the staff have to contend, records are efficiently kept.

5. Approximate numbers of:

6. Progress in Pending Cases.

There are still large numbers of inmates awaiting trial, many of which have waited periods exceeding six months. However these cases have been examined by the Regional Prison Commission who are of the opinion that there is very little ~~availability~~ avoidable delay in the prosecution of these cases.

PRISONS

1. List of Prisons in Use.

A list of prisons now in use, showing capacity and present number of inmates is shown in Appendix "C".

2. Progress in closing Mandamentale Prisons.

The accommodation situation still does not warrant the closing of any prison at this stage. In fact, two prisons of this type which had fallen into disuse are now in the process of being reconditioned, prior to bringing them into use again.

3. General Condition of Prisons in respect of:-

(a) Administration.

The problem of accommodation is still acute. As was predicted in my last report, the increase of admission over releases was maintained during the past month. To cope with this increase, school and recreation rooms in the main prisons have been brought into use to accommodate inmates. Also prisoners from the prisons in Naples City, where conditions are bad have been transferred to Provincial Prisons, including Procida Penal Prison and Pozzuoli, the latter being a prison for the infirm and which normally caters for sick persons from throughout Southern Italy.

A few cases of corruption amongst the prison staffs have been reported. In one instance an agent was sentenced to nine months imprisonment for accepting a bribe to facilitate the unlawful release of an inmate. The pay and food received by the prison staff is very low in comparison with the importance of their task, and it is feared that if their conditions are not improved, corruption will become more apparent.

(b) Hygiene.

In the Mandamentale Prisons hygiene still leaves much to be desired. The custodians are apathetic towards this question and use little initiative. Only constant driving obtains results.

It was hoped that many of this type of prison, the majority of which are very old and lack adequate sanitation, could have been closed, but lack of accommodation and transport has not made this possible to date.

It is interesting to note that the inmates accept these conditions which to our standards are overcrowded and insanitary and are even prepared to bribe the prison officials for the doubtful privilege of staying put when it becomes necessary to transfer them away from their home area to prisons in which better conditions prevail.

In the larger prisons, although crowded, the conditions are better.

There was one case of smallpox at St. Eframo Juvenile Prison, which resulted in the prison being placed in quarantine. All inmates of the prisons in Naples City have been vaccinated and no further cases have been reported to date.

At Poggioreale which has a population of approximately 3500 and which average 120 admissions each day a unit of the Public Health Service is installed to help supervise the inmates health.

-2-

(c) Prison Labour.

Prison labour is at present concentrated in supplying prison equipment beds, bedding etc. which the prisons of the Region urgently need. There is as yet no organised labour capable of undertaking contracts such as were dealt with prior to the war. It is understood, however, that an industrial official from the Ministry of Grace and Justice is making a tour of the prisons to survey the position.

(d) Food.

The ration scale has improved, but there is considerable difficulty in both the transporting and indenting, which results in some prisons, especially those in the outlying parts of the Provinces, not receiving their just entitlements. Owing to the various channels through which the indents have to pass before the ration coupons finally reach the prisons, it is necessary for the prisons to indent some ten days prior to the date required. Consequently by the time rations are received, the number of inmates have increased and there is insufficient food to cope with the increase.

Economics and Supply Division have been informed of the situation and have agreed to adopt a new procedure, which will permit individual prisons to submit their requirements direct to their local Ufficio Alimentazione, thus cutting out the time lag. Also, instead of rations being issued on a ten days basis as is done at present, they will be issued monthly, thus any increase in the number of inmates can be catered for from stock, which will be adjusted by supplementary indents.

4. Records.

Generally speaking records are kept efficiently.

5. Approximate numbers of:

PRISONS

(a) List of Prisons in use.

There have been no changes from those shown last month. The list of prisons called for (vide ACC/I4217/PS dated 14 April 44) is shown at Appendix I.

(b) Progress in closing Mandamentale Prisons.

The accommodation situation still does not warrant the closing of any prisons at this stage.

(c) General conditions of Prisons in respect of

(I) Administration.

The accommodation problem is now acute. The increase of admissions over releases has been maintained during the past month and this, together with the fact that any serious overcrowding of the prisons during the summer months will lead to serious hygienic conditions, makes it imperative that all civil prison accommodation held by the Army, at least in Naples Province, should be vacated.

This is the subject of a new report.

The conditions in the Mandamentale Prisons have deteriorated during the past months, many of them having become overcrowded.

There are thirty of this type of prison in Naples Province, where the overcrowding has taken place, and as they have no transport of their own it is impossible to keep an even distribution throughout the prisons at all times. But, as soon as it is known at this HQ that a prison has become definitely overcrowded our own transport is provided to transfer the overflow of inmates to a less crowded prison. By this method the position should be kept under control.

However, during the past month there have been some deplorable instances of overcrowding, which could have been avoided if the Pretori, under whose jurisdiction the Mandamentale Prisons are controlled, had carried out their duties in a more efficient manner. Firstly by refusing to accept such large numbers in excess of the prison's normal capacity, and secondly by informing this HQ of the position. Unfortunately many of them show little interest in their prisons, and leave complete control in the hands of the custodians. Their responsibilities have been pointed out to all Pretori and it is hoped that there will be an improvement in the near future.

(II) Hygiene

In the Penal and Judicial Prisons the hygiene is fairly good, but in the Mandamentale Prisons it is bad. This is due in part to the old nature of the buildings which often lack adequate sanitary arrangements. But in the main, the Pretore, by exercising more supervision over the prison staff, could improve matters considerably.

(III) Prison Labour.

In the juvenile Institutions trades are taught as far as the limited material will allow.

In the main prisons, weaving, carpentry and shoe-repairing is carried out on a small scale.

The re-installation of the machinery at Poggioreale is nearing completion and efforts are being made to utilise the workshops there.

(IV) Food.

The food situation is now much more satisfactory. A new ration scale has been authorized for all inmates, which will allow the issue of at least two meals each day.

(d) Records.

Position remains unaltered.

(f) Progress in Disposing of Pending Cases.

Cases awaiting disposal by Allied Courts continue to be dealt with promptly. It would appear from the last available figures that little progress is being made by the Italian Courts and this in spite of the recent Regional Order that the Courts will sit for longer hours.

There are still a considerable number of inmates who have been awaiting disposal by Italian Courts for periods of over four months. However, these are now being investigated by the Regional Prison Commission with a view to hastening trial.

(g) Staff Changes.

Dott. Gioia Giovanni, Director of Benevento Judicial Prison, having been proved to be unsatisfactory, has been suspended from office. Regional authority for his discharge from the Prison service has been requested.

1. List of Prisons in Use.

There have been no changes from these shown in last month report.

2. Progress in closing Mandamentale Prisons.

The accomodation situation still does not warrant the closing of any prison at this stage.

3. General conditions of the prisons in respect of:

(a) Administration.

Progress in the general administration is maintained. Thirty Guards have been made available for transfer to Region II.

An enquiry was held at Pozzuoli prison to investigate the complaint of an anonymous writer who stated that the staff rations were being unfairly distributed at that prison. Although approximately 50% of the staff were interviewed individually and the remained as a whole, the statement could not be substantiated.

(b) Hygiene.

Conditions in the main jail are improving. In some of the smaller mandamentale prisons however, the hygiene leaves a lot to be desired. Now that supplies of soap are being obtained the conditions will improve. The Pretori responsible for these prisons are being urged to get them cleaned up.

There were no illnesses in the prisons which could be attributable to bad hygiene.

(c) Prison Labour.

Little progress has been made during the past month, apart St. Maria Capua Vetere where hospital beds are being now made for a local Military hospital, and at Poggioreale where the Italian firm of Federico Cargiulo have renewed a contract for some small machine parts.

Machinery from Poggioreale which was sent to Aversa to escape war damage is being restored and when this is completed it is hoped to undertake work for D.A.D.O.S.

However, before any serious work can be undertaken by the inmates their rations will have to be increased.

(d) The position as regards prisoners remains unchanged.

The prison guards have been brought into line with other similar agencies and their food position is now satisfactory.

Letters from the Directorate of prisons are continually being received requesting increased rations for inmates. Also the most serious problem encountered during visits to prisons is that of food.

Public Health and Welfare Region III, have recommended that inmates of all prisons should receive the hospital scale of rations. The result of recommendation is not yet to hand.

4. Records.

Records of all 'Security detainees' are being maintained.

There was some improvement in the receipt of prison reports during the past month but even so a true picture of the state of the prison as at the end of February was not obtained until mid-March. This is due to the long distances some of the reports have to travel. Now that the postal services are functioning better results are anticipated.

6. Progress in Dispensing with Pending Cases.

Although there has been a decrease during the past month there are still large numbers of inmates awaiting trial.

The situation is expected to improve however in view of the Regional Commissioner's order that all Italian Courts will sit until 5 p.m. each day, if preparation of cases is speeded up.

The Regional Commissioner has also appointed a Commission to investigate the cases of all inmates who have been awaiting trial in a prison for a period of over thirty days. This Commission will have the power to order any case to be tried within a certain date, and also to recommend the release of those whom in the opinion of the Commission, have been awaiting trial for a period longer than that which they would normally receive had they been tried and found guilty.

It is considered that the accomodations situation does not warrant the closing of any prison at this stage.

General Conditions of Prisons in respect of:

a. Administration

Fearing in mind the difficulties with which the prison staffs have to content it is considered that their administrations is quite good.

b. Hygiene

Soap and disinfectants are most difficult to obtain and in consequence this retards progress in prison hygiene. However, in spite of this the prisons are certainly not dirty; and the fact that there were only ten cases of typhus in the prisons during the recent epidemic tends to show that the officials are doing a good job with the limited means at their disposal.

c. Prison Labours.

In the juvenile institutions, trades are still being thought as far as the limited material will permit.

In the main prisons labour is not enforced to any great degree except that of a domestic nature.

Small repairs to buildings and some carpentry and shoe-repairing is carried out when the material is available.

The larger prisons are equipped with machinery for carpentry, shoe-making and with weaving shops. There is a distinct possibility that the machinery and buildings can be put in a good state of repair and that prison labour can be harnessed to the war effort. The whole matter is being discussed with the Economics and Supply Division.

d. Food.

The food situation has deteriorated during the past month and the supplies available to the prisons are entirely inadequate. The contractors are unable to furnish the normal diets contracted for owing to the shortage of supplies on the open market.

The whole situation was reviewed early last month by the Public Health and Welfare of Region III who recommended a diet of 2000 calories. The Economics and Supply have agreed to supply this diet, thus making the prisons independent of the open market except for fresh vegetables.

Before issuing the diet, however, it was necessary to obtain the authority of ACC Food Sub-Commission, and the recommendation was passed to that Commission on the 11th February 1944, together with our view expressing the urgency of the matter. However, apart from being informed that they were reviewing the question with a view of authorising a universal diet for all prisons, nothing further has been heard.

It can only be hoped that this new diet which when authorised will solve the problem will not be long delayed.

Records

Every effort is being made to keep an up to date record showing the turnover of both those awaiting trial and of those already sentenced.

However, whilst a fairly true picture regarding the main prison is obtainable that of the Mandamentale prison is to a large extent out of the date by the time reports are received in this office. This is due to the long distances some of these reports have to travel and the transport difficulties involved.

Whilst there has been some improvement in receiving these reports during the past month it is thought that the position will not be really satisfactory until such time as the Italian postal service is operating again.

Approximately 30% of those awaiting trial are AMG cases.

Progress in Disposing of Pending Cases.

During the past month, whilst the number of those awaiting trial by AMG Courts has considerably decreased, those held for the disposal of the Italian Courts have increased.

This Division periodically brings to the attention of the Legal Division nominal rolls of prisoners awaiting trial. Complete records are kept by the Courts.

Staff Changes.

By the authority of the Prefect the undermentioned officials were dismissed during the past month.

Extract from REGION III Monthly Report for January 1944 dated 9 February 1944.

JANUARY 1944

PRISONS

I. General.

It was expressed in the previous report on the prisons in the Region that apart from a few black spots, accommodation being the main one, a fair condition prevailed. This is true to date.

Some progress has been made, especially in regard to repairs to buildings and in the general hygiene of the prisons.

Lack of accommodation has been acute during the past month, and if the present increase is maintained it is estimated that all available accommodation will have been taken up in the very near future. This is apart from the fact that owing to the drive against prostitution, accommodation for hundreds of women will have to be found.

2. Administration.

Most of the problems encountered during the period ending 31 December 43 have if not entirely solved, been considerably eased. There is still room for improvement in the general administration but generally speaking the prison authorities are now settling down.

Reports on individual prisons, especially those in outlying parts of the provinces, are still hard to obtain - this is due to lack of staff and transport. However, this month a new system is being tried. Report proforma printed in Italian have been despatched, and are to be collected through the medium of the CC.RR. courier service. It is hoped that this method will achieve a more comprehensive report.

3. Sanitation.

There were no fresh cases of typhus in prisons reported during the month. All inmates and staffs of the prisons in the affected area have been inoculated. Segregation of new arrivals until such time as they have been inoculated and disinfected is still being enforced.

There has been some improvement in hygiene. Small amounts of soap and disinfectants have been issued, and the Public Health Division, who in spite of the burden imposed upon them by the typhus situation, are giving every help and promise adequate supplies will be available in the near future.

Repairs to the shower baths at Poggioreale have been completed, and also the laundry is now functioning.

4. Discipline.

Strict segregation is being maintained, and there have been no reports of disorders.

Discipline on the part of the staffs is satisfactory. There was one incident at the Mandamentale prison at Barra where lack of discipline on the part of members of the staff was noted and this has been dealt with.

5. Buildings.

Repairs to the prison buildings are still being carried out. Much improvement has been made at Avellino and Poggioreale which were extremely damaged by bombs. At the latter, both the ablutions rooms and the hospital are now functioning.

6. Food.

The old ration scale issued by AMG has been revived and a uniform ration of 300 grams of bread and 50 grams of soup is now issued to all inmates.

Difficulty is still experienced, however, in obtaining other rationed foodstuffs, the supply of which is the responsibility of the Italian Alimentation office. Representation has been made to that office with a view to obtaining adequate supplies but so far without results.

7. Political Prisoners.

Records of all security prisoners are being maintained.

8. Awaiting Trial.

There are still a great number of persons awaiting trial, especially in the Naples city area, the majority of whom, however, are held for the disposal of the Italian Courts. The authorities concerned have been requested to dispose of the cases with the minimum of delay.

9. Accommodation.

Apart from the Naples city area the position is satisfactory.

The juvenile prison of San Eframo, Naples, is definitely overcrowded, but it is hoped to ease this during this month as we are informed that the Indian troops will vacate the women's wing at Poggioreale in the near future. This will enable the female prisoners to be transferred back there from Filangieri which in turn will be used to accommodate the overflow of minors from San Eframo.
