SUBJECT: AMG Passes to Civilians for Entry into POW Camps

TO: CG MTGUSA POW COMMAND

1. Numerous civilians have been coming to this camp bearing passes authorizing them to enter for the purpose of receiving and evacuating motor vehicles allegedly their property.

2. These passes are generally signed by subordinate AMG Officers, are couched only in general terms and give no details of the type or serial number of vehicles concerned or the basis of the civilian claim to it.

3. Since this headquarters has no personnel available to investigate or settle such claims nor the personnel to provide each civilian so admitted with an escort during his stay in the camp, none of these passes are recognized unless the civilian is accompanied by an Allied AMG Officer.

4. As a result of this, many civilians are traveling considerable distances to no avail on the erroneous supposition that such passes will admit them to the camp.

5. I recommend that some definite policy and procedure be established and made known governing the handling of these claims pending which AMG should issue the necessary instructions to stop the issuance of these passes by their provincial officers.
