The crowd composed of 100.000 people passed through the principal streets of Genoa and then gathered in the square facing the monument of Mazzini where a laurel wreath was deposited.

The Sindaco spoke to the crowd about the significance of the ceremony.

No incidents occurred and the manifestation ended at 1815 hrs.

The CC.RR Commander of the Internal Group of Palermo with fonogram dated 8/5/46 reports:

""" At 1530 hrs - 7/6/46 - in Palermo, large groups of monarchists and separatists assembled in front of the Allied Commission building asking to be received. A committee was received by Lt. Colonel MORTACU to whom was presented a statement dealing with irregularities during the ballot for the referendum.

The demonstrators then formed a procession which enlarged "en route" until it formed a mass of about 2000 people. The same mass was repeatedly faced and finally dispersed by the police.

From different parts of the city, they agreed to gather, 4000 in all, in P.zza Castel Nuovo at 7 p.m. Encountered again by the police the crowd was dissipated.

11 persons among the most untempered have been arrested. The P.S. Commissary La PAROLA was badly bruised and is now under medical treatment for 9 days.

The excitement is persisting.





I. Recently information has been received from reliable sources regarding the activities of Italian Political Bodies.

It will be appreciated that the sources of the information cannot be disclosed, and the information as shown below has not, and in many cases cannot be verified at the present time, but there is good reason to believe that the main substance is true.

2. During the evening of 9th. May, 1946, the day on which King Victor Emmanuel's abdication was announced, a meeting was held at the Ministry of Interior which lasted until midnight.

All the Chief Officers of Police at the Ministry and the Questura in Rome were present, including Doctor FERRARI, Director General of P.S., but excluding the Carabinieri.

The meeting was apparently convened to decide upon the action to be taken at a Monarchist demonstration which was being held the following day (Friday, 10th.).

It is alleged that Di Cesare (Deputy to Dr. Ferrari) monopolised the conversation, Ferrari rarely speaking. De Cesare is reported to have said "You must order your men to fire, whatever the uniform the others are wearing. Can you answer for your men". VERDIANI, the Questore of Rome replied "Yes". De Cesare then said that the Partisans at the Police Schools should be armed and that although he believed the Allied Authorities had placed a veto on additional Partisans being drafted into Rome for training, they the Police Authorities, would find a way to evade the veto.

3. Verdiani later saw the officers of the Questura and told them his orders to use firearms must be obeyed irrespective of who formed the opposition, whether the uniform was Blue, Field Green or Khaki.

4. On the 10th. May, 1946, a Monarchist Demonstration was held outside the Quirinale and later moved to the Viminale (Ministry of Interior building) where a request

request was made for the Royal Flag to be hoisted over the building. The request was refused and later the crowd dispersed without any incident.

4. The same evening the Questore issued an order (copy attached Ia) in which he deplored the lack of initiative on the part of the police in failing to break up the demonstration, and ordering them to take firmer action in future using all means according to law.

The order as it stands cannot be criticised, but it is alleged that the original draft called upon the police to open fire on the crowds, but on the advice of other senior officers the order was amended.

5. On the morning of the 11th. a large counter-demonstration organised by the Anti-Monarchists, was held at the Piazza del Popolo. All firms were circularised by the Federation of Labour calling upon them to release their employees to enable them to attend the demonstration. Government vehicles were used to convey demonstrators to and from the meeting. Later the crowd marched to the Viminale, carrying slogans and shouting "Death to the King". No action was taken by the police to disperse the procession or to prevent it taking place.

It is significant that the procession was preceded and followed by detachments of the Police Flying Squad.

#### 6. Armoured Cars.

At the present time it is alleged that the Questura in Rome has 40 armoured cars, and further that 270 new armoured vehicles are on order from the "Ansaldo" factory in Genoa. Another report puts the number as 240. A third report says 230 from the Breda factories. A British Armoured car is in the garage of the Ministry of Interior, Via Tomasso Campanello, Rome, and is being converted to give it the appearance of an Italian type vehicle.

During the recent demonstrations Armoured Cars were located as follows:-

- 4 at Ministry of Interior, Pragno Viminale.
- 3 " Questura, Via San Vitale.
- 4 " P.S. Barracks, Via Pietro de Cortona.
- 4 " Ministry of Interior garage, Via Tomasso Campanello.
- 2 " P.S. Barracks, Via Ruffini.
- 2 " P.S. Barracks, Via Caltagirone.
- 2 " P.S. Barracks, Via S. Eusebio.

- 2 at Quirinale Square, Palogno Rospiglion'.  
2 " Old Questura Building, Via S.Stefano del Cacco.

It is believed that 15 others were at the Ministry of Interior Garage.

7. Police Schools.

The Ministry of Interior has applied to the Ministry of Transport for 40 trucks to transport the Partisan Cadets in the Police School at Nettuno to Rome.

8. Petrol.

There is a serious shortage of petrol especially for the armoured cars.

It is alleged that the Ministry of Interior has applied to the Army for 60,000 litres.

Marzano, the Chief of the Ministry of Interior garage, has been instructed to purchase as much petrol as possible on the Black Market. A large amount was brought to the River Police Station on the Isola Tiberna on 16th. May.

9. Arms.

It is alleged that the Ministry of Interior has, during the last few days, acquired 1800 (Beretta small type) Tommy Guns and has issued 800 of these to the Questura in Rome, the remainder being stored in the police school at Via Guido Reni.

It is further alleged that the whole of these Tommy Guns were obtained from the Beretta Factory at Gardone near Brescia, under the subterfuge of 'repaired weapons'. Actually they are nearly all new 1942 models.

In connection with this matter:- On 13th. May, 1946, in consequence of an application by the Ministry of Interior for permission to supply more than 6,000 automatic carbines to the Questura, I asked Doctor Ferrari for a return of the numbers of automatic arms at present in possession of the force and on the 19th. he replied giving the figures as:-

Heavy Machine Guns	507
Light " "	32
Mitre	4448

It is obvious that these figures are not inclusive for the whole of Italy, as it is fairly certain that the numbers held by the Questura in the North (many of whose personnel are ex-partisans) are not known to the authorities in Rome.

It was significant that on 17th. May, when at the invitation of Dr. Ferrari, I visited the Police School at

at the Ferdinanda Savoia Barracks, a section of the Police Flying Squad was drawn up for inspection. I noticed that each man was armed with a Tommy Gun, the majority of which were obviously new. When I commented on the fact that the men appeared to be well armed, Dr. Ferrari volunteered the information that every man in the Reparte Celere (Flying Squad) which consists of 4 companies of 320 each company, was now armed with a Tommy Gun, making a total of 1280. In addition each company had 5 heavy machine guns and a military truck mounting 2 light machine guns.

This was the first intimation this Sub-Commission had, that the Public Safety Agents were so armed, and there is little doubt that the information was volunteered by Dr. Ferrari as he realised some of the facts must be disclosed in his report mentioned above.

It is alleged that at the present time in Rome, the Questura are armed with a total of 2,205 automatic arms, apart from heavy machine guns.

#### X. Meetings.

It has been alleged that during the afternoon of 16th. May, a meeting was held at Via Condotti No.61, Rome, occupied by a Signor Foschini Torquato. There were present:-

Signor SARAGAT, Socialist. Ex Ambassador to France.  
" COMANDINI, Action Party.

" MINUTOLO, " "

and 2 members of the Communist Party (names unknown).

At the meeting plans were discussed for the seizure of the Queen and Crown Prince. The reasons for such contemplated action are not known.

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#### II. Arrests.

Arrests in Rome during the week ending 19/5/46 were 468. This number is in excess of the previous weeks total by 140, although reported crimes had decreased.

This bears out to a certain extent, reports (unconfirmed) of extensive arrests of monarchist supporters during the past week.

I2. With regard to the reported arrests, Dr. Ferrari informed me that he had definite information that the Monarchists were plotting to seize power. He said that high ranking ex-officers of the Carabinieri and officers of the fighting services were involved. He did not mention that any arrests had been made but said that the tension between the parties was growing hourly.

So far as he was concerned he felt that whichever party succeeded, he Ferrari, would be removed as each party thought he favoured the side of the other.

As regards the Left Party, he said the authorities were well aware that they were well armed, organised, and ready to take instant counter action.

I3. On 24th May, large demonstrations are expected to take place in Rome in commemoration of Italy's entry into the war.

It is thought that clashes may occur between rival political factions and in consequence police reinforcements are being brought into Rome as a precautionary measure. These include the Cadets from the Police School at Nettuno. (Copy of Questura Order attached 2a).

I4. The serious view taken by the Government of possible serious disturbances may be judged by a plan for the defence of the Palazzo Viminale and prepared by the Questore of Rome. Elaborate precautions are being taken which may or may not be necessary. Tanks and machine guns will be used if the situation requires.

It is evident the authorities are fully prepared for force to be used by one or all of the opposing political parties.

I5. Changes in Senior Police positions are being made and it is believed others are contemplated. Generally it seems that the officers earmarked for removal are those with suspected Rightist tendencies. They are being replaced by men reputed to belong to the Left. They are chosen by the Minister ROMITA.

I6. It will be appreciated that the foregoing is information which may well be coloured. It is very evident that each side suspects the other of intending to effect a Coup d'Etat which results in a crop of rumours.

All the references to Police in this report refer to the Agents of Public Safety and not to Carabiniere.

I7. The contents of this report have been obtained from various confidential sources and is submitted with a view to acquainting you of the information gained by this Sub-Commission. It is again stressed that the above points cannot be verified, but the sources have been found generally reliable in the past. The situation will be closely watched and reports submitted from time to time.
