SUBJECT : Forged Passes.

1. Reference is made to your letter GSI.389-506/NIDC dated 17th January 1947.
2. The two passes taken from the two S.I.P.S at SILLIAN have been examined and there is no doubt they are forgeries.
3. Flight Lieut. Baker, who was formerly attached to the Travel Control Section, this Commission, and who is now employed in the Visa Department, British Embassy, has also examined the passes but can give no information regarding any likely source of origin.
4. At no time have any embossed stamps been in use in this Division.
5. Inquiry shows that there were no engineering corps in Poggia further that the only Unit to whom the S.I.P.S. may have been referring was an American Quartermaster Group which was located in Poggia, but this Unit has been disbanded. **4516**
6. The particulars of the forgeries have been noted for action should any additional information come to light.
7. The passes are enclosed for return to G.S.I. (B) Austria for such action as may be deemed appropriate.



E LA SARDEGNASUBJECT : Movement of persons from other Italian Provinces  
to Venezia Giulia - Permits issued by the Questure.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs points out that the situation arisen owing to the imperfect application by the Questure of the instructions regarding the procedure to follow to obtain permits to enter the Venezia Giulia Region for Italian citizens from other Provinces, has become worse during the last weeks.

From statements of persons interested it appears that many Questure seem to be in ignorance of the dispositions in force, whilst other Questure, with the excuse that a normal procedure would take too long, send the persons to Udine where, they assure, the permits are issued in one day.

This behaviour of the Questure causes in Udine an excessive afflux of persons, coming from other Provinces and going to the Venezia Giulia Region, who are compelled to remain for 3, 4 or more days, awaiting that their petitions, forwarded thru the AMG of Udine, are approved by the competent Allied Office of Trieste.

Such situation, besides overcrowding the few Hotels put at disposal for civilians transiting and making them spend too much money, forms an obstacle to the work of the Liaison Group in favour of more urgent or particular cases.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs also communicates that

the H.Q. of the 13th Corp and the A.M.G. of Udine have often pointed out the necessity that the Questure strictly follow or have follow the dispositions in force, which have been forwarded to the Prefettura for their performance with Ministerial n. 500/72138 dated 11 March 1946.

We therefore dispose :

- 1) The Questure must again be invited to strictly follow the rules communicated in said circular bearing in mind that the H.Q. of the Venezia Giulia Region Police has assured that the petitions forwarded thru the Questure will be taken in consideration and the permits to be issued with urgency will possibly be sent within 24 hrs. from date of request. The Questure have been authorized to forward request by cable in the most urgent cases.
- 2) The Questure must remember that the only document valid to enter the Venezia Giulia Region is the permit issued by the Venezia Giulia Police which is sent to the Questura according to request, and that to avoid what has already happened, that persons provided with permits irregularly issued, are to be sent back.
- 3) Not only the Questure but also the Comunes and the Commands of Carabinieri must be able to inform the interested persons of the necessity to provide themselves with the permit to enter the Venezia Giulia Region and the procedure to follow to obtain it.

Information has been received that certain German prisoners of war have been arrested in Austria having travelled with permits alleged to have been issued by Travel Control Dept., Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission.

These passes are forgeries. The Travel Control Dept. was disbanded on September 16th last and any passes bearing later dates must be suspect. 449?

The particular passes are of a yellow brown colour on cardboard and are headed HQ. Allied Commission Public Safety Sub-Commission, Travel Control Division, APO 794 U.S. Army. They then have spaces for date, name, identity number, age, address, colour of hair, eyes, and portrait to be signed by Colonel, acting Director. At the bottom left hand corner of the pass is an embossed stamp H. . Allied Commission - Travel Control Division stamped on the opposite side MPAINTATION and rubber stamp PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER.

Will you please cause Italian Police, especially those on duty at international boundaries to be informed of the existence of such passes and request that any person having them in possession be apprehended and this Commission immediately informed.

TO : The Ministry of the Interior.

1. Information has been received that much inconvenience is being caused by persons who wish to enter Venezia Giulia making their application to the office of Allied Military Government, Udine. It is pointed out that this office is only empowered to issue permits for this purpose to persons residing in Udine Province.

Amongst persons applying at Udine for such permits are:

(a) Italian civilians from other provinces who state that the local office of the Questura has advised application to Udine as the quickest method of obtaining a permit;

(b) Italian press correspondents, minor government officials etc., officers, political party officials etc., mostly from Rome.

(c) Other nationals to whom Italian consuls outside Italy have issued visas for entry into Venezia Giulia.

(d) Other nationals coming directly from Rome, principally British, American and official representatives of other governments in Rome.

4489

3. All such persons as described above must wait in Udine until authority to issue a pass is received from Venezia Giulia Police. This frequently causes a delay.

The greater number of cases occurring come under the description of para 2(a) above and for these the Italian consul at Udine has authority to make application to Venezia Giulia through A.M.C. for 15 urgent cases a day. Invariably the full quota is exhausted.

4. To obviate a necessary walk at the offices of A.M.C. Udine and to prevent much annoyance and delay to prospective travellers it would be of great assistance if you would please again draw the attention of all Consulate to the regulations and procedure laid down for the issuance of permits to go to Venezia Giulia and if you would be so good as to cause this to be circulated as widely as possible in the Press for the information of the general public.

5. For information it is repeated that all persons, other than American and British military personnel, who desire to go to Venezia Giulia must make their application to the local Questura who forward the application to the Venezia Giulia Police Force for consideration.

As regards American and British civilians however, the appropriate Embassy will undertake to obtain the necessary clearance to issue permits for Venezia Giulia for their respective nationals and persons they are prepared to sponsor.

5. The Managing Director is Ing. Mario COLOMBO residing at 4 Via Regina Giovanna di Bulgaria, ROME, the same address as the ROME offices. Nothing is known to his detriment. He is also owner of the firm "Engineer COLOMBO Mario" who are engaged in road construction and repairs. The firms are well equipped and esteemed in ROME business circles.

6. During the war years COLOMBO was employed on industrial installations in the FRUNK area (Germany) and acted as Director of companies which worked in Germany on behalf of the Reich.

7. COLOMBO has also carried out work in CROATIA, DALMATIA and SARDIGNA on behalf of the Italian Military Command.

8. It has not been possible to obtain any information on the other individuals listed owing to surname only being transmitted. Direct enquiries have not been made of the Company.



1. The following directives regulating travel from, to and through AUSTRIA are rescinded :

- a. Letter, Allied Force Headquarters, Subject : Travel To and From AUSTRIA, File 371.2/173 GBI-O dated 2 May 1945.
- b. Letter, this Headquarters, Subject : Travel To and From AUSTRIA, File AG 371.2 - I, dated 13 July 1945.
- c. Letter, Allied Force Headquarters, Subject : Travel To AUSTRIA, dated 5 August 1945.

2. All persons, except the following, require visas to leave AUSTRIA, and must make application at the nearest Police Station for such visa. The exceptions are/

- a. Nationals of U.S., Britain, U.S.S.R., and France.

3. All persons, except the following, should apply to the Austrian Political Representative in the country where journey originates, for entry or transit visa to enter or transit AUSTRIA. (See Annex 2.) The exceptions are: 4471

- a. Nationals of U.S., Britain, U.S.S.R., and France.
- b. Those persons sponsored by one of the Occupying Powers for travel into its own zone in AUSTRIA.

4. Persons in countries where there is no Austrian Political Representative should apply for Military Entry Permits for entry or transit AUSTRIA at the Military Permit Office in country where journey originates. (See Annex 3.)

5. Nationals of the U.S.A., U.K., U.S.S.R., and France who desire to leave AUSTRIA should apply for a Military Travel Permit to the Headquarters of the Occupying Forces of their country, unless they have appropriate Travel Orders.

6. Nationals of the U.S.A., U.K., U.S.S.R., and France and persons sponsored by any one of those Powers for entry into its own zone of AUSTRIA should apply for Military Entry Permits for entry or transit of AUSTRIA at the Military Permit Office in country where journey originates. (See Annex 1.)

7. In countries where there is no Austrian Political Representative nor Military Permit Office, applicants for entry or transit visas or Military Entry Permits for entry or transit AUSTRIA, should apply in writing to the Ministry of Interior of the Austrian Government.

8. Persons applying for visas to enter, transit, or leave AUSTRIA, as provided in para 2 and 3, unless they are stateless, may apply at the same time for passports; in the case of non-Austrians they must prove that they are unable to obtain or have renounced a passport from their own government. Such persons will be granted a Fremden Passport.

9. Persons may not be granted visas to transit AUSTRIA unless they have already obtained the visas or military clearances to enter the country of destination.

10. Prisoners of War and Displaced Persons registered with the Allied Authorities, when moved over the frontier in groups by those authorities, and documented for such movement in the prescribed way, will not require visas nor military travel permits.

11. The Four Allied Occupying Powers have agreed that, subject to security clearance, only the following types of applications for visas will be considered :

a. Applications for official or business journeys which will contribute to the rehabilitation of AUSTRIA and are sponsored in positive and precise terms by suitable departments of the Austrian Government.

b. Applications for journeys for very urgent personal reasons which are confirmed by documentary evidence and specially sponsored by the Austrian Government. Only exceptional cases will be considered.

12. U.S., British, Soviet and French Military personnel and citizens of those powers employed by or attached to the Occupying Forces who are in possession of competent Military or State Department Orders, do not require Military Travel Permits nor visas to enter, leave or transit AUSTRIA. Diplomats will carry diplomatic passports, which will be recognised for entry, exit or transit of AUSTRIA.

13. In the issuance of Military Entry Permits for entry or transit AUSTRIA the following procedures will govern:

a. The following may be issued permits by Military Permit Offices (See Annex 1) without reference to this Headquarters:

- (1) All diplomats accredited to the Allied Council or Austrian Government whose journeys originate in countries where there is no Austrian Political Representative and who require entry or transit AUSTRIA.
- (2) Diplomatic representatives of the Allied nations who require permits for transit AUSTRIA.

TRAVEL BETWEEN ITALY AND AUSTRIA

1. All previous directives on Travel between Italy and Austria issued by Travel Control Section A.F.H.Q. and Travel Control Division issued by Travel Control Section A.F.H.Q. and Travel Control Division A.C.C. ROM will be cancelled with effect 16 September 1946 from which date the following procedure will be in force for travel between Italy and Austria.

2. Travel from Italy to Austria:

All persons desiring to go to or transit Austria, with the exception of the following two categories, should make application to the Austrian Political Representative, Viale Bruno Buozzi, 113 ROME, for an Austrian visa.

- (a) American, British, French and Russian nationals.
- (b) Any national sponsored by one of the four occupying powers to go into its own zone.

The Military Attaché's office of the American Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above, desiring to go to the U.S. zone of Austria and the travel section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above desiring to go to the British zone of Austria; applications for the French zone of Austria, as in the past are dealt with by the Commandement Militaire Francaise, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Guidori, ROME. However, if a person desires to visit the United States and French or the British and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case for their respective zone clearance.

3. Travel from Austria to Italy:

All applicants other than American, British or Polish Service personnel, must make application to the Italian Political representative in VIENNA and KLAGENFURT, for an Italian entry visa. American, British and Polish Service personnel are the only exceptions from Italian visas and may enter Italy on valid travel orders.

It is pointed out that before it is possible to leave Austria, an exit permit is required by all nationals except American, British, French or Russian; this is obtained by making application to the local Austrian Police Headquarters.

4. The above is passed for information and it is pointed out that the Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, and G-2 (CI) A.F.H.Q., will no longer be concerned with application for visas or permits for travel between Italy and Austria.

Directive to AFHQ Ltr, 16 September 1946, AG 371.2 GBI-O

TRAVEL FROM ITALY TO GERMANY.

1. With effect 16 September 1946 applications in respect of all nationals desiring to travel to Germany will be handled by the American and British Embassies in ROME.

2. Applications for the United States zone of Germany will be dealt with by the Military Attaché's Office of the American Embassy, and for the British zone by the Travel section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy; applications for the French zone of Germany, as in the past are dealt with by the Commandement Militaire Francaise, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Guidoni, ROME. However, if a person desires to visit the United States and French, or the British and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case for their respective zone clearance.

3. It is the policy of the occupying powers to restrict travel into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel to Germany are specifically not permitted at the present time.

a. Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the body or visit the grave of a relative killed in Germany. (Visits by French nationals to graves in the French zone are now allowed by the French Authorities).

b. Travel to repossess or locate property looted by the Germans. (Reparations, Restitution and Deliveries Section of the French, British and United States Control Commissions have been established to arrange for the restitution and location of property looted by the Germans. The work of these sections cannot be accomplished if individuals are allowed to enter Germany to locate and remove such property on their own account. All necessary descriptive detail should be forwarded by the Government concerned to the Reparations, Restitutions and Deliveries Section of the Control Commission Council of the Zone concerned)

c. Travel to Germany of businessmen, except those travelling under a scheme of sponsorship arranged by the Government of the occupying power<sup>4454</sup> of the zone to which they are proceeding. (The policy to be adopted with regard to private trading is still under review, and, pending a decision, journeys of this nature cannot be approved.)

4. All other applications, other than Allied Military personnel travelling on duty, should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and in the cases of approval the necessary Military entry permit will be issued.

5. The categories of travel for transiting Germany are of a far more lenient nature, though transit of Germany is only allowed for essential journeys and when no petrol, oil, lubricants, transport, food or accommodation requirements are desired in Germany; in all cases the valid passport or visa

for the country of destination is also required before an application can be considered.

6. Here again all applications complying with the above requirements should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and the issue of a Military entry permit for the approved cases.

7. The above is passed for information, and attention is drawn to the necessity of all applicants being in possession of passports validated for travel in Germany.

With effect 16 September 1945 the responsibilities of Travel Control duties performed by the Travel Control Division, Public Security Sub-Commission, this Headquarters, and G-2 (CI) AFIL will be transferred to the Military Attaché's Office of the American Embassy, Rome, and the Travel Section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy, Rome.

2. Accordingly, applications by American, British, French and Russian nationals desiring to go to Austria, all nationalities desiring to go to Germany, and American and British nationals desiring to go to the Venezia Giulia Province, will be dealt with by the above two departments of the Foreign and British Embassies.

3. All applicants should be handled according to the three attached directives.

SUBJECT : Travel from Italy to Germany.

1. With effect 16 September 1946 applications in respect of all nationals desiring to travel to Germany will be handled by the American and British Embassies in Rome.

2. Applications for the United States zone of Germany will be dealt with by the Military Attache's Office of the American Embassy, and for the British zone by the Travel section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy; applications for the French zone of Germany, as in the past, are dealt with by the Commandement militaire français, (Secteur militaire) at Paris, Guidoni, Rome. However, if a person desires to visit the United States and France, or the British and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case to their respective zone clearance.

3. It is the policy of the occupying powers to restrict travel into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel to Germany are specifically not permitted at the present time:

- (a) Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the wife or visit to a relative living in Germany.

SUBJECT : Travel between Italy and Austria.

10 September 1946.

1. This Division's letter GDI. 389-506/10-S-J dated 12 July 1946 is cancelled with effect 16 October 1946, from which date the following procedure will be in force for travel between Italy and Austria.

2. Travel from Italy to Austria:  
All persons desiring to go to or transit Austria, with the exception of the following two categories, will make application to the Austrian Political Representative, while two messes, 145, 146, 147, or an instruction visa.  
(a) American, British, French and Italian nationals.  
(b) Any national represented by one of the four occupying powers to go into its own zone.
- The Italian Attaché's Office at the American Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above, desiring to go to the U.S. Zone of Austria and the travel section of the Italian Attaché's Office at the British Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above desiring to go to the British Zone of Austria; applications for the French Zone of Austria, as in the past are dealt with by the Commandant Militaire in the I.C.C. (Société Militaire) at Palazzo Falcondi, Rome. However if a person desires to visit the United States and France or the U.S. and French Zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French Zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case for their respective zone clearance.

3. Travel from Austria to Italy.  
All applications other than American, British or French Service personnel, must make application to the Italian Consulate in Vienna, or to his representative in VIENNA, for an Italian entry visa. British and Polish service personnel are to apply exceptions from Italian visas and may enter Italy on valid travel orders.  
It is pointed out that before it is possible to leave Austria, an exit permit is required by all nationals except American, British, French or Russian; this is obtained by making application to the local Austrian Police Headquarters.

(b) International sponsored by and of the four occupying powers  
to go into its own zone.

The Military Attaché's Office of the American Embassy will handle applicants of (a) and (b) above, desiring to go to the U.S. Zone of Austria and the travel section of the liaison officer out of the British Embassy will handle applicants of (c) and (d) above desiring to go to the British Zone of Austria; applications for the French Zone of Austria, as in the past are dealt with by the Consulment Militaire Franco-Info, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Giudice, Rome. However if a person desires to visit the United States and France or the U.S. and France, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French Zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case for their respective zone clearance.

3. Travel from Austria to Italy.

All applications other than American, British or Polish Service personnel, must make application to the Italian Consulate in Vienna, or to his representative in VIENNA, for an Italian entry visa. American, British and Polish service personnel are the only exceptions from Italian visas and may enter Italy on valid travel orders.

It is pointed out that before it is possible to leave Austria, an exit permit is required by all national except American, British, French or Russian; this is obtained by making application to the local Austrian Police Headquarters.

4. The above is passed for information and it is pointed out that the Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, and G-2 (CI) A.P.I. do, will no longer be concerned with applications for visas or permits for travel between Italy and Austria.

1. Due to the release and redeployment of American and British Army personnel and the eventual closing down of the Allied Commission in Rome, it will be no longer possible for the military authorities to continue the travel control duties.

2. It is suggested, therefore, that the remaining travel control duties be transferred with effect from 16 September 1946 from Gen 2 (CIV) and Public Safety Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, to the American Embassy (Military Attaché's Office) and the British Embassy (Visa Department). (This has been agreed verbally in principle by AAF, Allied Commission and both the American and British Embassies).

3. These duties will consist of the following:

a) Travel to Austria

Obtain clearance and issue permits for:

- I) American, British, French and Russian nationals,
- II) Any national sponsored by one of the four occupying powers for travel into its own zone or Austria.  
(All other categories should be referred to the Austrian Political Representative at 113 Viale Bruno Buozzi in Rome, to obtain an Austrian visa.)

b) Travel to Germany

Obtain clearance and issue permits for any national desiring to go to Germany.

c) Travel to Venezia Giulia

Obtain clearance and issue permits for American or British nationals.

(All other applications should be made through the local masters who write direct to Mr. Venezia Giulia Police Force, XLII Corps).

4. It is suggested that, for the division of this work fairly between the two Embassies, the U.S. Embassy deals with all applications for the U.S. and Russian zones of Austria and Germany, and British Embassy with all applications for the British and French zones of Austria and Germany, and that for Venezia Giulia the respective Embassy deals with its own nationals.

5. Your agreement to the suggestions as outlined above are solicited at your earliest convenience in order that all concerned can be informed.

  3. The sons should make application to their local AMG authority in Germany for an Exit Permit.  
(I understand the Allied Authorities wish to restrict travel in and out of Germany except for essential purposes, therefore it is not at all certain permission will be given at the present time).
  4. If the Exit permit is recommended by the local AMG, the application is then forwarded to the Combined Travel Security Board in Berlin.
  5. If Berlin approves, they should forward details to the Italian Government, thru this Office, for consideration with regard to the issue of a visa authorising entry into Italy.

MEMO TO: Public Safety Sub-Commission.

Reference attached, the story is as follows:

I never met the MILLER family when I was in GENOA. Some time ago, however, a family I did know who apparently knew the MILLER family, did write to me and ask me if I could assist in this case.

The situation was that a son of the MILLER's was in a SWC camp at RIMINI. I gather that Mrs. MILLER, who is Italian, had a first or second husband, (I forget which), who was German.

She wanted her son to be released in Italy and to live with her as he had done before the war.

I wrote and said this was a matter in which I could do nothing but that all concerned should write to the appropriate Allied authorities and ask for the son to be released in Italy and at the same time to write to the Italian authorities and get permission for him to reside in Italy.

The youth has now apparently been sent back to Germany and it transpires that there is a second son who was a prisoner and has been repatriated from America to Germany. Both these ex-prisoners wish to return to Italy and live with their mother at GENOA.

I had a surprise visit from a sister this morning who said that they had applied to the Ministry of Interior for the necessary permission and that the Ministry had said that it was a matter for the Allied authorities. They then wrote to the Allied authorities at CASERTA. A letter came back signed by a Lt.Col.Sealy saying that it was a matter for the Italian authorities.

The family then sent the letter to the Ministry of Interior and got the attached reply in which they state it is a matter for the competent Allied authorities.

The family also put the matter up to the local Allied command at GENOA who said that they had sent the matter to the Public Safety Sub-Commission, AC on 6 July.

All the papers, including Lt.Col.Sealy's letter are said to be with the Ministry of Interior.

It seems to me quite clear that this is a matter for the Italian authorities and they are merely trying to "pass the buck". Do you agree? If they do not wish German subjects to return and reside with an Italian parent in Italy, they should say so.

I do not know whether we ought to do anything in this case and we certainly ought not to bring any pressure.

Do you know anything about this particular case? Possibly Local Government S/C (Mr. Nicoli) might be able to find out from the Ministry of Interior what is the form.

I told the lady who came to see me this morning that she could come again to see me on Tuesday next about 1700 hours.
