

1. On 5th Oct. 46 Dott. ROSSELLI Beniamino of the Ispettorato Generale di Pubblica Sicurezza, Rome, arrived in Udine to investigate certain alleged irregularities, e.g. improper purchase and sale of captured vehicles, disposal of sequestered goods etc. by the Questore and other personnel of that organization.
2. Dott. Roselli reported immediately on arrival to the Prefetto, and was seen by S.P.F.S.O. on 7th Oct. 46, to whom he explained the nature of his visit.
3. Briefly, it appears that complaints have been made against the Questore, Col Bazzoni, (Comandante of Auxiliary Police) and Tenente Ruffo (Comandante of Traffic Police Section) as outlined in para. 1 above.
4. Enquiries that have been made to date, but which are not yet completed, have disclosed no irregularities. Close touch is being kept with Dott. Roselli during the course of his investigation.
5. There is no doubt that this enquiry is another echo of the visit of Scoccimarro in August, as reported in Monthly Report for August 1946, para VIII, and is an attempt by the Communist Party to discredit these individuals with the view to their eventual removal from office, and replacement by representatives more favourable to that party.
6. Both the Questore and Col. Bazzoni are particularly unpopular with the Communists for what is considered their intransigent attitude as to the employment of ex-partisans in the Police service.

The fact is overlooked, deliberately or otherwise, that ⁵¹⁸⁰ three men have been appointed by A.M.G., and are acting on instructions from A.M.G., in that, every effort is to be made to eliminate undesirable elements from the number of existing Auxiliary Agents, and far from increasing that number, no recruiting whatever is to take place.
 8. Further, it is not understood why no application was first made by the Italian Government, through A.C. Public Safety Sub-Commission,
