Subject : Organisational Identification Numerals for Requisitioned Civilian Vehicles.

To : French Command in Rome  
( Attn. Captain de FLEURY)

1. Your Headquarters is allotted a block of numerals commencing with N° 351 through n° 400
2. These numerals will be stencilled on the vehicle in white, on front and rear bumpers or front and rear body.  
Example: French tricolor = 351
3. All vehicles will have an orange registration number allotted by the vehicle Registration Center, stencilled on the hood showing that it has been properly requisitioned through this Headquarters.
4. Information as to the numbers assigned to vehicles in possession of your Headquarters and units of your command will be forwarded to the office of the A.C. of S., G.4, Rome Allied Area Command.
5. Failure of immediate compliance with the above instruction may result in the impounding of all unmarked and improperly marked vehicles by the Provost Marshall of this Headquarters.

SUBJECT : Circulation of motor vehicles - French Forces.

TO : French representative in A.C.C.

1. A number of civilian motor vehicles have recently been seen circulating in Rome with permits and small tricolours, attached to the windscreen of the motor vehicles in question. The permits are issued on behalf of the Commanding General, French Forces.
2. The vehicles do not bear military vehicle marks nor standard civilian motor vehicle circulating permits issued by ABC or ACC.
3. It would appear that these vehicles are circulating contrary to the instructions contained in General Order No. 11, dated 22 Jul., 1944, issued by Rome Allied Area Command, and to general policy as laid down by AFHQ and ABC.
4. It will be remembered that civilian vehicles used by the military must :-  
  - (a) be requisitioned and bear military vehicle marks (in which case petrol is drawn from military sources);  
    - either
    - (b) carry civilian circulating permits issued by ABC or ACC (questions relating to petrol supplies being referred to by S. and T.).
5. It is requested that this Headquarters be furnished with full details concerning the circulation of the vehicles referred to in paragraph 1, as well as the source from which petrol is supplied to these vehicles. A specimen copy of the permit issued should also be furnished.
