Memorandum on the Italian Touring Club Company (Compagnia Italiana del Turismo).

The CIT is a Joint Stock Company established in March 1927, aiming at the management of Travel and Touring Offices, the Management of railway ticket windows and all the services connected with the national and international tourism, including in these the banking, transport, consignment services, with its main office in Rome and 165 branches located in the chief cities of Italy and abroad.

The share capital of the CIT, which at present amounts to L. 20.000.000 has been subscribed by the Banco di Napoli and by the State Railways.

The CIT, as a joint stock company, is going on by means of its own management and does not receive either subsidies or state contributions under any title.

In freed Italy the CIT has the following offices: Naples, Bari, Brindisi, Palermo, Catania.

The Chief Main Office of the CIT in Naples, located in Tiazza Municipio no 72 has been destroyed by German Troops, who set fire to it on September 27, 1943.

The offices in Bari, Brindisi, Palermo, Catania, on the contrary, are regularly opened to the public and they provide for the services of engagement and sale of railway tickets as well as for the sale of tickets of buses of the authorized lines.

The central official of the CIT (President, Administration Council, General Manager) are in Rome, Territory which is now occupied by the enemy.

In order to avoid this difficulty of management, the Italian Government has appointed Rag. Enrico Linzi (Manager of the CIT in Naples) Commissioner of CIT offices in Freed Italy.

The Naples Prefect has requested for the authorization of the Agailied Military Government to extend said decree also to Naples Province.

After the approval of the Allied Willtary Government, the Public Domain, the owner of the premises where the chief Offices of the CIT are located, began the repairing of the premises.

It is wrong to believe that the CIT has carried on any political activity or it has had any connection with the politics of the past regime; the CIT is a commercial Company which has always carried its own touristic activity in the exclusive interest of the tourist organization of Italy, and of travellers of Italy.

All the propaganda, made up by its own means and expenses, has always been made on touristc-commerical ground.

Before the war the CIT had set up friendly business rapports with the best Travel Firms abroad, for some of which it had and it still has the official representation (Dean Dawson in London, Raymond Whitcomb in Chicago letc.)

The CIT, is siming at facilitate the touristic movement towards Italy has had the function of list price (Calmiere) for prices and of moralization (Moralizzazione) for the Italian touristic commerce.


