SUBJECT: Port Security Instructions (Italy) No 700-Passenger Travel Control -
Military Travel Authorization

TO: All Concerned

1. The instructions contained in letter, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 19 May 1945, as amended, are rescinded.
2. Military Travel Authorizations are no longer required for travel from Italy, and their issue has ceased.
3. Controls at the sea and air ports, and land frontiers, will continue to enforce US, British and Egyptian visa requirements, as heretofore; that is, they will refuse permission to travel to any individual proposing to leave for territory for which he requires a US, British or Egyptian visa, if he is not in possession of such visa. Cases of this kind will be reported immediately to G-2(CI) Section, this headquarters, the individuals being at the same time advised to apply to the nearest US, or British Consulate, as applicable.
4. Although controls are under no obligation to enforce the visa requirements of countries outside the US, the British Empire and Egypt, they should endeavour to ensure that travellers do not leave Italy without proper documentation for entry into countries of destination and transit.
5. Controls will continue to enforce the Military permit requirements for travel to Germany and Austria.

Port Security Instruction (Italy) No. 715

SUBJECT: Travel by civilians from Italy to the U.S., British and
French Zones of Occupation in Germany.

TO: All Concerned

1. For the purpose of this instruction, the term "civilians" covers all persons not authorized to hold a recognized U.S., British (including Dominion), French or Allied Naval, Military or Air Force Identity Document.

2. Civilians traveling from Italy to the U.S., British or French Zones of Occupation in Germany must hold military permits issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ. The only civilians exempt from this requirement are:

a. Merchant Seamen serving as members of ships' crews, or traveling as passengers or supernumeraries in pursuit of their sea employment and holding appropriate written authority to travel as such.

b. War Correspondents accredited to the U.S., British and French Zone Headquarters in Germany.

c. Displaced persons traveling under proper authority.

3. For the time being, the military permit in use for this travel will be the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit.

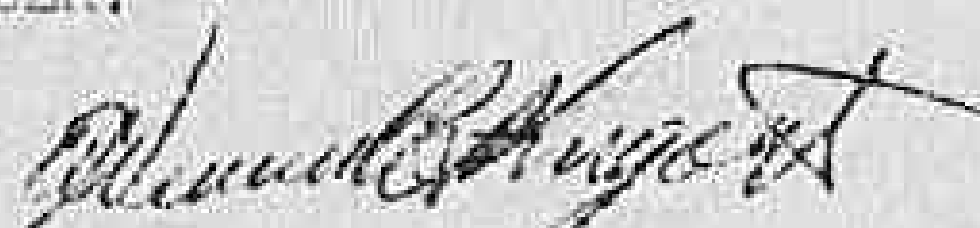

Passenger Travel Control - Military Travel Authorizations

TO: All Concerned

1. This instruction supersedes No. 700, dated 17 December 1944, and amendments thereto.

2. Letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-O, dated 7 November 1944, subject: "Military Travel Authorizations", copy of which is attached to the instruction referred to in paragraph 1 above, will also be destroyed. This is superseded by letter, file AG 371.2/013 GEG-O, dated 14 May 1945, copy of which is attached hereto.

3. You will permit to travel out of Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) through your controls, only persons in possession of valid Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) section, this headquarters, with the exception detailed in paragraphs 4 and 5 below.

4. All travellers leaving Italy by direct means (that is, not transiting other territories on the way) to:

USA, UK, Egypt, or any other territories where British visa requirements apply, are exempt from requiring Military Travel Authorizations.

5. The following categories of travellers are exempt from requiring Military Travel Authorizations in all cases, irrespective of destination:

- a. Allied service personnel on duty
- b. ~~Allied diplomats and consular officers~~ *See 16A*
- c. British and United States civilians employed by and travelling on duty for, the following governmental agencies:

6. In respect of all travel under the terms of paragraph 4 above, you will enforce the US, British and Egyptian visa regulations (Egyptian visas are granted in Italy by the British consulates). These regulations are set out in Fort Security Instruction (Italy) No. 706, dated 22 November 1944, copy previously furnished you. You will refuse permission to travel to any individual proposing to leave for territory for which he requires a US, British or Egyptian visa, if he is not in possession of such visa. You will advise him to apply for a visa to the nearest US or British Consulate, as applicable, and you will report each such case immediately to G-2 (CI) section, this headquarters.

7. You will not permit holders of Military Travel Authorizations to leave Italy if they do not carry also the identity documents specified in the appropriate space (7) of the Military Travel Authorization.

8. You will withdraw from passengers departing, at time of embarkation, MTA's valid for single journey only where the passenger is proceeding to neutral territory, and you will withdraw from passengers arriving, at time of disembarkation, MTA's for return journey. MTA's so withdrawn will be sent to G-2 (CI)

9. In cases of emergency, you may apply by telegram or telephone (Freedom 188 or Freedom 203) to G-2 (CI) section, this headquarters, for permission to allow a non-exempt passenger not in possession of an MTA to leave Italy. In such cases you will be required to make a responsible recommendation, and to provide for record purposes the information called for in the MTA application form. This practice will be confined to cases of extreme emergency.

10. Your attention is invited to Port Security Instruction No. 709, dated 17 December 1944, concerning the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit requirements for persons proceeding from Italy to France.

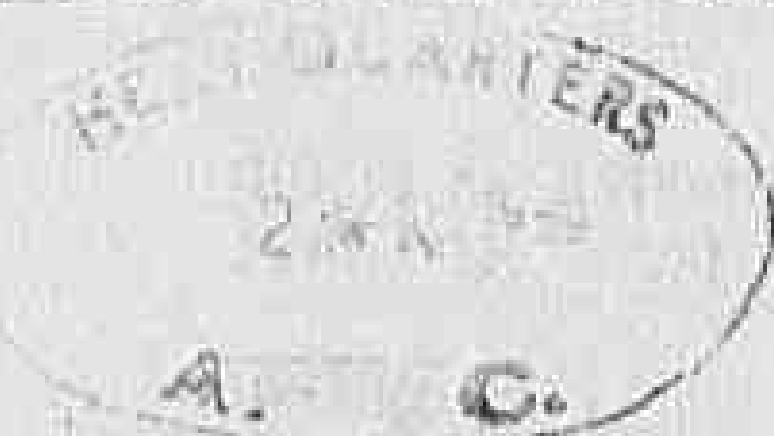

These permits will not be countersigned by the French Securite Militaire.

b. The exceptions are:

- (1) Allied service personnel on duty: but not Yugoslav nationals.
- (2) Accredited diplomats and consular officials of the Allied Nations but not:

 - (b) Yugoslavs.

3. GREECE

a. Effective 15 February 1945, all persons entering Greece from French North Africa must be in possession of an Allied Force Permit indorsed "Valid for entry to Greece" issued by the United States Consulate General, Algiers, in the case of United States nationals and in all others by the British Consul, Algiers, with the exceptions of persons listed in sub-paragraph b. below. These permits will not be signed by the French Securite Militaire.

b. The exceptions are:

- (1) Allied Service personnel on duty: but not Yugoslav nationals.

4. Inter-Allied Laissez-passer issued after 15 January 1945 will not be valid for entry to Italy or Greece. Inter-Allied Laissez-passer issued prior to 15 January 1945 will be considered valid for entry to Italy until 15 February 1945, after which date holders of Laissez-passer should not be permitted to land in Italy without clearance from G-2 (CI) Allied Force Headquarters.

5. Allied Force Permits will be the same as those issued by the Military Permit Office, London. Further details concerning them and method of disposal will be found in Port Security Instruction 710 dated 22 December 1944.

SUBJECT: Port Security Instruction (Italy) Number 711.
Travel from France to Italy.

TO : All Concerned.



1. With effect from this date, all civilians (ie persons not in possession of recognized United States or British, including Dominions, or Allied, Naval, Military or Air Force Identity documents), except those exempted in paragraph 3 below, travelling from SHAEF territory (at present France, Belgium, and Holland) to Italy, should be in possession of Allied Force Permits issued by Allied Expeditionary Force Travel Permit Officers, SHAEF, at Paris or Brussels, or by SHAEF Southern CI Detachment, Marseilles.

2. Any such traveller arriving without an Allied Force Permit is to be detained pending instructions from G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, unless you are satisfied that his/her journey is justified and that no security risk is involved. You will in any case submit a separate interrogation report to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters on Form SI 6, in respect of each such irregular arrival.

3. Allied Force Permits for travel from SHAEF territory to Italy are not required by:

- a. Allied Service personnel on duty (this does not include Italians).
- b. Merchant seamen serving in Allied or Allied-operated merchant ships.
- c. Merchant seamen, other than Italians, sent to join ships in Italy and holding appropriate written authority.
- d. War Correspondents accredited to this headquarters.
- e. Holders of Allied Expeditionary Force Permits indorsed "Valid for Italy".
- f. Holders of Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits indorsed "Valid for Italy".
- g. Holders of Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, indorsed for return journey to Italy.

4. Special arrangements, of which you will be advised if necessary, may be made from time to time for the repatriation of parties of Displaced Persons from SHAEF territory.

SUBJECT: Port Security Instruction Number 710 (Italy)
Travel Control (Great Britain to Italy - including Sicily
and Sardinia - Greece and the Aegean Islands).

TO : All Concerned.

1. All civilians and Allied Service personnel travelling individually, proceeding from the United Kingdom to Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) Greece and the Aegean Islands should be in possession of an Allied Force Permit Card issued by the Military Permit Office, London. The only exceptions to this rule are:

- a. Accredited diplomats and consular officials.
- b. United States and British Service personnel.
- c. Allied Service personnel travelling in formed bodies of troops.
- d. British and United States War Correspondents accredited to AFHQ.
- e. Merchant seamen as outlined in Port Security Instruction Number 559 (Italy) dated 20 December 1944.

2. Allied Force Permits will show the country for which they are valid on the front of Permit Card. Permits issued for Greece or the Aegean Islands will be marked "Valid for Transit through Italy" if the passenger requires to transit Italy.

3. The Allied Force Permit Card is linked with the passport or the Military identification document of the holder as follows, viz: - Passport number will be noted on the Allied Force Permit and the Allied Force Permit number will be noted on the passport. In the case of persons holding British Exit Permits the number of the Allied Force Permit will be shown adjacent to the permit stamp, and in the case of government officials who are not required to obtain an exit permit, a note will be made under the heading of "Observations" on page 5 of the passport as follows:

"Holder is in possession of Allied Force Permit Number _____ for entry to _____"

4. On arrival at an Italian Port of Entry the Allied Force Permit will be stamped by the security control authority concerned, ie, Port Security or Counter-Intelligence personnel.

5. Where the Allied Force Permit is marked for "single journey only" it will be withdrawn by the Counter-Intelligence Corps or Port Security personnel and returned to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters. It is essential that no single journey permit remain in the hands of the holder after arrival in Italy.

6. The Allied Force Permit is valid for exit from Italy unless indorsed "single journey". If the holder is returning direct to the United Kingdom the permit should not be withdrawn. If the holder is proceeding to any other country for which the permit is not indorsed as valid, and the holder has otherwise satisfied existing AFHQ instructions, the permit should be withdrawn and returned to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters.

SUBJECT: Port Security Instruction (Italy) No 709 - Travel of Civilians
From Italy to France.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Inter-Allied Laissez-passer will no longer be required for travel by civilians from Allied-occupied Italy to France. This will be replaced by Allied Expeditionary Force Permits and Military Travel Authorizations in accordance with the following paragraphs.

2. Effective this date the following regulations are applicable:

a. Civilians who require Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, to leave Italy under the provisions of letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/013 GEG-O, subject: "Military Travel Authorizations", dated 7 November 1944, will also require French entry visas. Applications for Military Travel Authorizations will not be considered without production of a French entry visa.

b. All categories of persons exempted from Military Travel Authorizations under paragraph 4 of the above quoted letter, with the exceptions noted below, will in future require Allied Expeditionary Force Permits issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, on behalf of SHAEF, unless already in possession of Allied Force Permits, Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits, or Allied Expeditionary Force Permits. Persons already in possession of the above permits which have not been validated for France should apply to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, for the appropriate validation.

c. Allied service personnel will not require any form of military permit. This category includes British and US civilians employed by any of the Service Ministries in the UK or US who are in possession of AGO cards or British military, naval or air force identity cards.

d. War correspondents accredited to SHAEF or AFHQ, merchant seamen serving in Allied or Allied-operated ships, and merchant seamen, other than Italians, proceeding to France to join ships under proper authority, will not require any form of military permit for travel to France.

3. Persons who are not documented in accordance with the above will not be permitted to embark for France at sea or airports in Italy.

TO : All Concerned.

1. This instruction supersedes that of the same number dated 4 February 1944, amended 12 February 1944, which will be destroyed.
2. AFHQ Military Government Section instruction MGS 300.4-4, dated 4 January 1944, as amended, copy of which is attached to PSI Number 700 dated 4 February 1944, has also been superseded and will be destroyed. Attached for information is copy of letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEI-O, subject: "Military Travel Authorizations", dated 7 November 1944, which embodies the present instructions. Reference is made to paragraphs 3 to 13 of this inclosure for information as to conditions and method of issue of Military Travel Authorizations; in particular to paragraph 5, for guidance in the event of your being required to indorse applications.
3. You will permit to travel through your controls to destinations outside Allied-occupied Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) only persons in possession of valid Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, with the exception of persons listed in paragraph 4 below.
4. The exceptions are:
 - a. Allied service personnel on duty; but not Yugoslav nationals travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.
 - b. Accredited Diplomats and Consular Officials, including United States and British civilians regularly employed by the State Department or Foreign Office, but not:
 - (1) Italian nationals.
 - (2) Yugoslavs travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.
 - c. British and United States civilians employed by and travelling on duty for, the following Governmental Agencies:
 - (1) UNRRA
 - (2) Office of War Information
 - (3) Psychological Warfare Branch
 - (4) War Shipping Administration

- (5) Ministry of War Transport
- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United Kingdom or United States providing they are in possession of Service identity cards, eg, technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.
- (7) Combined Economic Warfare Agencies
- (8) Foreign Economic Administration.

d. British and United States civilians employed by, and travelling on duty for, any of the following organizations:

- (1) American or British Red Cross
- (2) YMCA
- (3) YWCA
- (4) USO
- (5) ENSA
- (6) NAAFI

e. War Correspondents accredited to this headquarters.

f. Merchant Seamen serving in Allied or Allied-operated merchant ships.

g. Merchant Seamen, other than Italians, leaving Italy to join ships elsewhere.

h. Persons already in possession of one of the following documents:

- (1) Inter-Allied Laissez-passer issued by GSI(b), North Africa District, indorsed "aller et retour".
- (2) Allied Force Permits indorsed valid for Italy issued by the Military Permit Office, London, the Allied Control Commission, Romania, the Allied Control Commission, Bulgaria, Supreme Headquarters, American Expeditionary Force Travel Permit Officers at Paris and Brussels, or SHAEF Southern CI Detachment, provided they are not indorsed "for single journey only".
- (3) Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits issued by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington provided they are not indorsed "for single journey only".
- (4) Allied Expeditionary Force Permits issued by the Military Permit Office, London for France, providing they are indorsed "valid for Italy" by a SHAEF Travel Permit Officer and are not so indorsed "for single journey only".

5. It is emphasized that a Military Travel Authorization is merely a permit to leave Italy and that it does not authorize the holder to enter any other territory, unless so indorsed by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters. You will not permit travellers to leave Italy if they do not carry also identity documents as specified in the appropriate space (7) of the Military Travel Authorization or

if they have not complied with British or United States visa requirements, in accordance with Port Security Instruction Number 706 dated 22 November 1944.

6. You will withdraw from passengers departing, at time of embarkation, MTA's valid for single journey only where the passenger is proceeding to neutral territory, and you will withdraw from passengers arriving, at time of disembarkation, MTA's for return journey. MTS's so withdrawn will be sent to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, with the relevant Forms SI 3 and SI 4 (passenger lists).

7. In cases of emergency, you may apply by telegram or telephone (Freedom 188 or Freedom 203) to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, for permission to allow a passenger not in possession of an MTA to leave Italy. In such cases you will be required to make a responsible recommendation, and to provide for record purposes the information called for in the MTA application form. This practice will be confined to cases of extreme emergency in relation to the war effort.

8. Your attention is drawn to Port Security Instruction Number 709, dated 17 December 1944, concerning the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit requirements for persons proceeding from Italy to France.

1. All travellers to US or British territory or Egypt should be in possession of US or British Consular Entry visas. Exceptions to this rule are British subjects travelling to British territories who will require a Consular indorsement, or American nationals travelling to the United States. No visas are required for British and Allied enrolled military personnel who are required to enter Egypt on official business.
2. US officials travelling to the United Kingdom should be in possession of British entry visas.
3. War correspondents travelling to the United Kingdom must be in possession of British entry visas with the following exceptions:
 - a. British subjects.
 - b. ~~US war correspondents who are US nationals and have been declared by the PRO to be members of the US armed forces.~~ See attached letter. 1B
4. Military personnel, other than American or British, should have visas. Members of the armed forces of Brazil may proceed to the United States without US visas. French naval personnel proceeding in transit through the US, and groups of French military, naval, and Air Corps personnel proceeding to the United States or the United Kingdom for training purposes, must be in possession of a block visa. All other military personnel, including Liaison Officers, (except as above), must have individual visas.
5. If a passport is not held by a traveller, as in the case of military personnel, the visa may be found stamped on the travel authorization, identity document, etc.; that is, French officers may have their 'Ordre de Mission' visaed, volunteers for the Allied Forces in the United Kingdom may have their identity document or other official document visaed.
6. Visas for the United States will be found stamped only on the reverse of State Department Form 257 which should be accompanied by the passport, or upon the passport itself, with the exception of group visas, which will be placed on a separate sheet of paper and which will be clearly labeled as being a group visa.

7. It is the responsibility of the Control Agents to prevent the departure to US or British territory, or to Egypt, of persons not in possession of all necessary visas, including those for territories to be visited in transit, with particular reference to Gibraltar.
