SUBJECT: Fire and P.A.D. Service.

TO : Public Safety Sub-Commission,
Rear H.Q., A.C.C.

1. A survey of LITTORIA (Littoria Province) reveals that the Vigili Fuoco Station is occupied by the 44 Corps V.F. and has one Commandante and seven of regular V.F. which has been increased by volunteers to a total establishment of 41.
2. The Station is not too badly damaged by shell fire.
3. The Germans took away twelve Engines and three pumps. The present appliances consist of a motor truck in need of overhaul, a hand pump capable of 200 gallons pm. There is an assortment of hose, nozzles and adaptors.
4. There is no telephone and no fire alarms. Calls have to be made by cycle or foot runners.
5. The Vigili Fuoco are available to act as rescue squads in event of air raid damage.
6. The U.N.P.A. does not now exist as the members fled to the hills. In the event of their return they can be reorganised if necessary.
