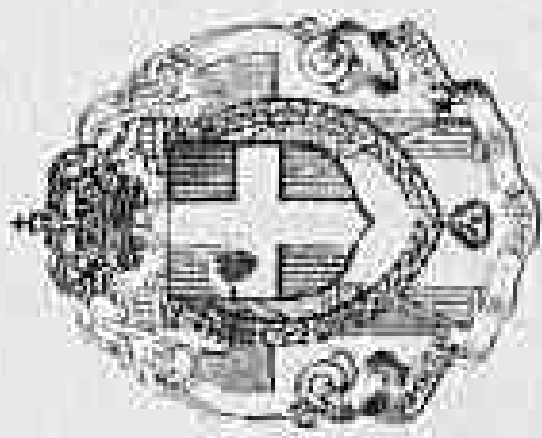

SUBJECT: Fire Station, Salerno.

TO : Rear HQ. ACC., Public Safety Sub-Commission.

1. On 2 May 1944, Captain Brannigan, Fire & Civil Defence Officer, Region 3, visited the Italian Fire Station at Salerno, to investigate the attached communication which originated from the Italian Ministry of Interior, dated 25 April 1944.

2. Conditions found on inspection were as stated in the communication.

3. At the present time the Italian Fire Brigade is short of equipment and for this reason it is felt that the Army fire brigade stationed on the premises is of great help to the Italian fire brigade.

4. The Palestinian troops are at present occupying the dormitory and kitchen of the Italian fire service which makes it necessary for the personnel of the Italian fire brigade to eat and sleep at their own homes, all of which causes great delay in getting manpower to a serious fire or other sudden emergency that might occur.

5. The following Officers were contacted and conferred with: Major Green, C.A.P.O. of Salerno. Capt. Kahanof of the Palestinian Troops. Sgt. Major Jackson No.1 Fire Brigade (British). Capt. Dorman G-3 and Major Hurley G-2 both of 94th. Sub-Area.

6. Result of the above conference is that at present there is no available billeting space to re-billet the Palestinian Troops, but in the near future it is expected that there will be and when such occurs the Palestinian Troops will be moved out and the Italian Fire Brigade Personnel return to their original quarters.

TO : RCPC Region III 1A

1. A communication has been received at this HQ from the Italian Ministry of Interior stating that the Fire Station at Salerno has been taken over by the Allied Military and the Brigade can no longer function. The situation appears to be as under:

a) The premises, with the exception of 2 small rooms have been taken over by the Army Fire Services and by 94 Sub-Area for the billeting of Palestinian R.A.S.C. troops.

b) Although the civil Fire Brigade is at present short of appliances this is a class "A" area under Operational Memorandum 40, AVHQ and it is considered likely that the Military Authorities may wish to supply the Brigade with new appliances under the terms of the Memorandum.

d) Fire Fighting is not the only service which the Brigade's personnel have to perform - they are also responsible for the rescue work in event of such incidents as air raids, collapse of buildings, rail or other accidents.

e) To maintain the services in an efficient manner it is necessary that the personnel, live, eat and sleep at the station, day and night. They should have a proper mess and the usual facilities enjoyed by such public services.

At the present time the men, after a heavy rescue or other duty, cannot bathe, feed or rest at their station and a great deal of their meagre ration value is lost because they cannot feed communally.

f) It is felt that the provision of alternative billeting for the Palestinian troops would present less difficulty than the provision of suitable accommodation as required for the Fire Brigade, and that it would be better to turn out civilians if absolutely necessary than to completely disorganize a public service which is in the process of re-constitution.

g) It is understood that the American Navy has now taken over

f) It is felt that the provision of alternative bill ⁴³⁴⁰ for the Palestinian troops would present less difficulty than the provision of suitable accommodation as required for the Fire Brigade, and that it would be better to turn out civilians if absolutely necessary than to completely disorganise a public service which is in the process of re-constitution.

g) It is understood that the American Navy has now taken over the workshops etc. of the Palestinian unit and in that event the need for the latter's personnel to be at that particular place would no longer hold good.

h) The Fire Station was re-constituted at AMC expense after bombing because of the importance of having an efficient Fire Brigade in Salerno.

2. It is thought that the Army Service would support these views since they could then have a proper Italian organisation with which to work.

3. It is probable that some considerable number of Italian firemen may shortly be brought in to Salerno for training for service further north. This training would be impossible without the Station facilities and accommodation.

4. It is requested that this matter be taken up with the Military authorities concerned and all efforts made to have the Fire Station returned to its proper use.

A report on the situation would be appreciated so that this HQ may be in a position to reply to the Italian Government.

With letter of Febr. 26th. 1944 No. 51 the local Command of the Fire Watcher's Corps has informed this Ministry of the occupation of the billet by English and Palestine troops, asking that at least the parts occupied by Palestine troops may be placed at the Corps' disposal for the necessary reorganization of the services.

With letter of March 2nd. 1944 No. 389/A/21 on which I have got no reply this Ministry, by reasons of service, has asked ^{Salerno} 94 Sub Area in an energetic manner to provide for the request of the Command mentioned above.

With letter No. 112 dated March 25th. 1944 this Command has communicated that also the remaining parts of the billet have been occupied by Palestine troops so that only two small rooms of the ground-floor remain at the Corps' disposal in which, as it is evident, it is not possible to lodge (place), neither during the day, nor during the night, few fire men.

It is evident that it is not possible in such a manner to continue the service.

Therefore the Allied Control Commission is requested to care about the quitting of the rooms which are indispensable for the reorganization of the Fire-brigade Service in this Province.

I am awaiting your notice of receipt of this letter.
