SUBJECT: Italian Fire Service Rest Home at Borgo a Buggiano, (Pistoia)

TO: Walter Doherty, Lt. Col., Chief of Public Safety, AMG, 5th Army —

1. According to the instructions in your letter as well as in the one from Headquarters, A. C. C., Public Safety Sub-Commission I have secured the desired information.
2. Instead of using an Officer from the Florence Fire Brigade I contacted an (Ing. Ardia Giuseppe) who has been the Director of this institution for many years and was in charge before, during and after the Germans occupied these buildings at which time they were used as a hospital.
3. The reason this information has not been compiled into one report is the fact that the first report that the Director submitted was not complete and I instructed him to prepare a more comprehensive report. The two reports that he has submitted together with a report from the Commandante of the Florence Fire Brigade will in my opinion furnish the desired information.

SUBJECT: Firemen Home, and camping.

Referring to your request, and according to the report I have already sent you with the inventory, I inform you as follows:

On May 30th 1944 the children and personnel of the rest camp were transferred to the Province of Brescia, by order of the Ministry. The Firemen rest home, after the occupation of the German Army, was transferred in the Villa Bartololo in Borgo e Buggiano. At the end of June the Germans requisitioned this Villa to and we were obliged to move in a building belonging to our rest camp in Bellavista, which was still free. But we were not allowed to stay here either, therefore, after agreement with the Florence Fire Command, the old pensioned firemen were brought by a truck to their families in Florence. Only four firemen were left, because they did not have any family and we arranged to set them in the Old men rest home in Montecatini, temporarily at our own expenses. The firemen that were here for a cure were sent back to their own Corps. Actually we have in service only 4 firemen, which belong to the 66th Corps force.

The civil personnel working for the maintenance of the homes was Dott. Pirolo Francesco, doctor of the commune of Buggiano; Maggiere Lari Baldino, replaced later by Mrs. Capetti, Rev. do Don Legrini Camillo, priest of Stignano, in charge for the Services at the home's Church, Tellegrini Giuglielmo, wardenkeeper; Cirianni and Lenzi, washer women; they have been paid until the 31st July, date on which ceased the function of the home. They are waiting orders to regularize their administrative situation.

They are waiting orders to regularize their administrative situation.

To make clear what precces, we inform you that from the 1st of June to the 31st of August, the firemen were sent from the different Corps to our Rest Home, in turns for cures. The functioning of this home was only suspended during this difficult period waiting the liberation in order to be reopened. For this reason I remained on the spot with some firemen, and could save some clothes and other equipment necessary for the functioning of the home.

SUBJECT: Disabled members of the Vigili del Fuoco

Sir:

I have been informed by the Commandante of the 66° Corpo in Pistoia, Capitano Donatelli, about two aged Vigilis who are being cared for near Borgo Buggiano.

These Vigilis are permanent members of the Vigili del Fuoco and have between 20 and 25 years of service to their credit. Their names are Falcone and Barbaro. Falcone is nearly blind and Barbaro is suffering from a leg disorder of some kind. They were previously in the home with their families until the Germans turned them out. As they both formerly lived in Messina and are members of that Corpo they are desirous of returning to their homes.

Hoping that you can get this letter to the proper authority for consideration as I think this case warrants immediate attention.
