1. Reference is made to your 319/7/CA of 7th April 1944 and 319/51/CA of 25th May 1944.
2. As a result of your letter of 1st April 1944 a disciplinary inquiry was held by the Commanding General CORR with the result that Brigadiere Tufariello Gennaro was awarded 10 days punishment.
3. In accordance with your letter of 7th April 1944 addressed to the Regional Commissioner (Region III) an independent enquiry was conducted by the local Public Safety Officer (Capt. Wrenberg). The result of his enquiry has now been received, through your HQs though covering letters from the Provincial and Regional Public Safety Officers were not enclosed.

4. This Sub-Commission is not in agreement with the views or the conclusions of Capt. Wrenberg which appear to be based entirely on the statement of Brigadiere Tufariello.

5. This Sub-Commission is satisfied that the allegation of improper conduct towards an Allied officer was properly investigated by the CORR disciplinary authorities and a suitable punishment inflicted. It is recommended that a reply be sent to APMJ letter MCS 014.12 in these terms.

Herewith attached find a statement made by Brigadiere Tufariello Gennaro, Frignano Maggiore. This is self explanatory. Also a copy of a CC.RR. report ordering Brigadiere Tufariello Gennaro 10 days punishment by his Commanding Lieutenant, CC.RR., is attached.

From investigation in this matter it is opinion of the writer:

1. Report of the theft of tires should have been given to the Civil Affairs Police Officer, Aversa, A.C.C., by the Army.
2. That interpreters should not be allowed to take action upon their own behalf to reprimand a Brigadiere of the CC.RR.
3. That the Brigadiere of CC.RR. did make an investigation as requested by the British Officer in lieu of the proper facts how the tires were stolen. That an armed guard was on duty when tires were stolen and statement has not been submitted.
4. The punishment to the Brigadiere CC.RR. was unjust because he did do his duty.

On account of the request of the RR.CC. Commanding Group in Caserta, the undersigned Brigadiere TUFARIELLO GENNARO, states as follows :

" In January, in a day that he cannot specify, came for the undersigned a British Officer (Captain), belonging to the 88 Workshops billeted temporary in Frignano Maggiore, accompanied with an interpreter, denouncing that often unknown stealers stole about 40 tires, of different size, stored on the floor and under a tend just near the camp.

At this denounce the undersigned promised that the CC.RR. will do all the possible to arrest the stealers and get back the tires.

After this promise, the Officer, always using his interpreter, who was also in uniform, made known that he would be back after few days to know the results. The investigation made quickly by the undersigned gave positive results, but not in the wished way, because after many searchings, interrogatories, etc. etc. it was possible to get back only 1 tube. The holder of this tube, knowing to be looked for by the Carabinieri, ran away from the town, and the undersigned had nothing more to do that denounce him to the Allied Summary Court in Aversa. On account of that, was drawn up a relative report, that can be relieved in the Frignano CC.RR. station acts.

After many days since the investigation, concluded as above said, went to the undersigned home only the interpreter who asked for the investigation's results. This interpreter was in uniform. 549 The undersigned said every thing of what was betid. The interpreter, after such my verbal relation, with proud and exasperate voice, said that it was not possible that the investigation had given such a result; and that the undersigned took no interest to the thing, and that he would take several measures on account of that.

The undersigned reminded to the interpreter to have a moderate language, also because he was in a private home in presence of all the family: not minding the words of the undersigned, he asked his generality

and the Tufariello refused to give it, saying that he was the Commanding Officer of the Frignano Maggiore Carabinieri Station, and that was enough. After this answer and always with arrogance he said that he would give a severe lesson on account of that, and went away.

The undersigned guesses that the above mentioned interpreter was a British officer but he had not the rank distinctives used by the British Army; but on the dark helmet he had a royal gold embroidered crown, and the Tufariello thought that this distinctive was the sign of an officially recognised interpreter.

Before the undersigned went away from Frignano Maggiore the undersigned charged the new Station Commanding Officer to prosecute the investigations about the tires-theft.

He denies to have had an insolent appearance and a feeling of no-cooperation.

It is not true that he said he would like the British Army lose every thing.

Nel mese di gennaio u.s. in un giorno che non posso precisare si presentò al sottoscritto un Ufficiale Inglese (Capitano) appartenente alla 88 WORKHIPS di stanza temporanea in Frignano Maggiore accompagnato da un interprete denunciando che a più riprese ignoti ladri avevano trafugato una quarantina di gomme per auto di diversa grandezza, depositate per terra e sotto un tendone messo nei pressi dell' accampamento.

A tale denuncia lo scrivente promise all'Ufficiale che l'Arma avrebbe fatto tutto il possibile per addivenire all'arresto degli autori e recupero della refurtiva. Dopo tale promessa fatta, l'Ufficiale sempre a mezzo dell'interprete che era pure in divisa fece conoscere che sarebbe ritornato dopo qualche giorno per informarsi dell'esito.

L'indagine praticata prontamente dallo scrivente diedero esito positivo però non nel senso desiderato perché attraverso le varie perquisizioni, interrogatori ecc. si potette addivenire al solo rintraccio di un cerchione di gomma. Il detentore di tale gomma saputosi ricercato, da noi Carabinieri si diede alla latitanza e quindi non restò altro al sottoscritto che procedere alla di lui denuncia alla Corte del Tribunale Alleato di Aversa. A riguardo venne redatto relativo rapporto che può rilevarsi agli atti del carteggio di Frignano Maggiore. Dopo diversi giorni dalle indagini conclusesi momentaneamente nel senso suddetto, si presentò nella mia abitazione solo l'interprete chiedendomi l'esito del furto. Detto interprete era in divisa. Lo scrivente mise minutamente al corrente il predetto di tutto quello che era avvenuto. Costui dopo tale mia relazione verbale, con voce altezzosa, ed esasperata disse che era impossibile che le indagini avevano dato simile frutto e che io non mi ero interessato del fatto e che al riguardo avrebbe fatto prendere severi provvedimenti.

Feci presente con energia al predetto interprete di aver un linguaggio

piuttosto moderato anche perché si trovava in una abitazione privata, ed in presenza dei miei familiari. Costui poco durante della mia ingiunzione, chiese senza altro il mio nome e cognome ed a ciò rifiutai dicendo che ero il Comandante della stazione dei CC.RR. di Frignano Maggiore e quindi bastava solo questo. Dopo tale risposta e sempre con arroganza disse che avrebbe data una lezione severa in merito e poscia se ne andò.

Penso che tale interprete deve essere un ufficiale inglese però non portava i distintivi di grado in uso nell'Esercito Inglese bensì sul casco portava una corona reale ricamata in oro e pensai che tale distintivo fosse il segno quale interprete riconosciuto ufficialmente. Prima di allontanarsi dalla sede di Frignano Maggiore incaricai il nuovo Comandante della Stazione per il prosieguo delle indagini circa il furto delle gomme.

Nego di aver tenuto a riguardo, contegno offensivo e privo di senso di collaborazione.

Non è vero che dissi che mi sarebbe piaciuto che i Britannici perdesero ogni cosa.

In fede di quanto sopra mi sottoscrivo.

OFFICIAL TRANSLATION.

NOCIVILETO - 7 February 1944.

About 20 days ago there was an investigation by the Comd. of 201 Guards Brigade with Maj. Taylor of 88 W/Shops into the loss by theft of 40 tyres and inner tubes.

I went to the Brigadier of Carabinieri of FRIGNANO MAGGIORE to ask him to initiate an investigation concerning the theft but the Brigadier refused to go.

I was surprised to hear the Brigadier's remarks to the effect that he would not go with me. The Brigadier then explained that probably these materials had been sold by the English soldiers.

I returned 10 days ago to FRIGNANO MAGGIORE to discover the Brigadier's intention on this matter - he was very abrupt and provocative. He showed me one piece of an inner tube and said "This is the result of my investigation". I remonstrated with him saying "Is this the only respect you have for the English military authorities".

I asked the Brigadier for his name but he refused to give it to me. I was of the opinion that the Brigadier Commandante la Stazione dei CCRR FRIGNANO MAGGIORE was not willing to co-operate in finding the missing materials which belonged to the English Armed Forces. During the whole proceedings the Brigadier appeared totally indifferent.

I certified that I was present while the above statement was made.

SUBJECT: Status of Naples Legion Carabinieri
Reference General McSherry's letter dated 17 October 1943.

TO : Colonel E.E. Hume, R.C.A.O., Region 3.

1. Generale De MARINUS, Gilberto, is at present in command of the 3rd Division. When the Allies were bombing Naples he was ordered by Rome HQ to move his HQ (then at Caserma Chiaia, Naples) to Benevento. It is believed that he has gone to Bari to join Marshal Badoglio.

2. There is no acting Divisional Commander of Naples. Marshal Badoglio ordered Colonel Romano DELLA CHIESA, commander of the Legion at Bari to assume supreme command of CC.RR in liberated Italy. This was before Bari was in contact with either Naples or Benevento.

3. Colonel Romano DELLA CHIESA's HQ is at Bari.

4. Colonel Armando CALABRO is acting Commander of 5th Brigade with the approval of Divisional Commander.

5. Colonel Armando CALABRO is acting commander of 5th Brigade and is the Commander of Naples Legion. Commanders of the other two Legions in the 5th Brigade are -

<u>Catanzaro</u>	Colonel DI BILIO, Umberto.
<u>Bari</u>	Colonel DELLA CHIESA, Romano.

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6. No CC.RR commissioned officers are absent without leave from their posts. Since 8 September 1943 the following transfers of Group Commanders have been made -

<u>Salerno</u>	Major FOLMICO, Domenico taken from Salerno now with CIC in Naples.
<u>Avellino</u>	Lt. Col. SENECA, Celestino, taken from Army Corps in Avellino and put in charge of Gruppo Avellino by Allies.

This information concerns Campagna only.

7. Arms

All non-commissioned officers and CC.RR should, with few exceptions, carry a pistol and rifle. However all rifles were taken off them by the Germans, so now they are left with pistols only.

7. (continued)

Officers carry pistols, and do so now.

Uniforms.

There has been no issue of uniforms to CC.RR for two years, consequently they do not look as smart as they should. No new uniforms are available at the moment owing to their stocks being totally destroyed by bombing.

Their pay is based on the standard of living of the Fascist regime when prices were ridiculously low. SO now, under AMG stabilised prices their purchasing power is seriously reduced.

The morale of the CC.RR is good. This morale has been constant throughout the time that they suffered atrocities and indignities at the hands of the Germans and has continued in spite of some brutal and humiliating incidents caused by Allied Troops.

It is urgent that as much of the above data as possible be made at once, therefore it will be satisfactory to have reply include what is promptly available, missing details to follow as they become available.
