SUBJECT : CORR at Brindisi

TO : RPSO Region II

1. With reference to your letter of 6th April 1944 (ref. 73 19) asking for an increase in Brindisi Province.

2. This matter has been discussed with the General Commanding CC.RR.

3. The authorized strength of CC.RR in Brindisi is 3 officers and 142 men. The present strength is 4 officers and 225 men, that is 1 officer and 83 men over strength.

4. No extra CC.RR are available and the strength in Brindisi Province can only be increased at the expense of CC.RR in other districts within the Bari Legion.

5. The General Commanding the CC.RR has sent orders to the Bari Legion to consider whether or not CC.RR can be taken away from their duties for service in Brindisi.

You should maintain liaison with the Legion Commander on this matter.

Dear Colonel Kirk,

I enclose for such action as you may deem necessary four documents which have been brought to this Headquarters by Gen. Picche's Liaison Officer, Capt. Franchi.

All of these concern Region II but in view of our proximity to Gen. Picche's Headquarters he finds it more convenient to bring them to us rather than to communicate with you through official channels.

Nos 1 and 2 relate to the transfer of a non-commissioned officer which the higher command of the CC.RR wish to make, for reasons stated, but which is opposed by the S.C.A.O. Matera.

No. 3 concerns the refusal of the local Military Police to allow the removal of a certain motor car from Matera.

No. 4. Gen Picche wishes to say that he agrees with this suggestion and is taking action accordingly. Although he does not raise the question, you may not altogether approve the peremptory tone of this letter.

For your information I may add that the D.C.C.A.O. has instructed me to prepare a directive for C.A.Os operating in this Army Group area indicating the procedure to be followed regarding appointments, transfers and removals of CC.RR. personnel.

TO: General Lush, AME 15th Army Group.

On Jan. 5, 1944, the Legion of Bari transferred W.O. Cervane Vincenzo from S. Mauro Forte to Miglionico for having participated in political meetings.

The Commanding Amgot Officer of Matera has opposed the execution of said order on the ground that the Area is subject to the control of the Allied Command and that no transfer can be made without its consent.

There are no objections to any orders of the Allied Command which it deems necessary for the service but is it possible, without any prejudice to the Allied authorities, to allow transfers for disciplinary reasons? Unfortunately, many cases have occurred whereby non-commissioned officers have learned that by appealing to AMGOT that they can nullify orders of their superiors and thereby causing loss of prestige on the part of the superior command.

Col McCaffrey's view in this matter correct. His approval, under Regional type of organization should be had before transfers of personnel for such reason be sent into his area. Still open to CCRR superior to discipline U.O. by fine, reduction, or transfer 583. elsewhere within King's Italy.

The "Milizia della Strada", (Street Militia), has been dissolved and their duties have been assigned to the Arma of C.C.R.R. I, therefore, ordered the concentration of many vehicles in Bari so that they could be used in the new section of CCR for highway service. I ordered an automobile No. 1100 in Potenza be brought to Bari so that it could be used by the officer in charge of the Nuclei being formed in the capital and which will command the motorcycle unit.

An officer was ^{entrusted} interested to get the car when an American M.P. intervened and ordered that the machine could not be moved from Matera. I believe that said order was provoked by Crocetta, an engineer of A.A.S.S. who abusively retains said car in the place of his own which was stolen by the Germans.

It is possible that the engineer is in need of an auto; in that case he will apply to the Minister of Public Works for a car, but it isn't fair for him to take another car already in service.

I will be grateful for your intervention so that my order can be executed.

Dear Col Crook,

This is an informal communication to keep you current as to the disposition of matters which have been the subject of previous correspondence.

1. Dr. Medica's proposal regarding compulsory domicile is opposed by the acting director of the Interior Sub-Commission. It has, in substance, received my approval and is now in the hands of the Administrative Directorate. Copy of my memo on this subject is enclosed.

2. No developments as yet regarding the procurement of equipment or clothing for the new battalions. The additional pay allowance has received the O.S. of the Finance Sub-Commission, as applied to the new battalions only, and on the grounds that they will be charged with missions of a specially hazardous nature.

3. Request for 300 additional GCM will probably be met if military operational plans do not supervene. Same applies to Guardia di Finanza, although the prospect of your receiving them is much more dubious.

4. Based on communication of AFM, Advanced Section, dated 12 December, 1943, 8 type rations (British) for the GCM have been authorized on the grounds that "The whole safety of Italy depends in great part on this corps, which, it is considered part of the Italian Army, ~~and therefore they should be fed by us.~~" Gen. Haisino has been advised to make representations to Gen. Plesche, and through him, to the Military Mission with a view to securing a similar provision for the GCM in Sicily. If effected, the problem of distribution will have to be set in view of transportation limitations. Our efforts regarding clothing and equipment are directed along the same channels.
