SUBJECT: Rations for CORI and GCF

TO : RC & MC Section  
(thru' Adm. Section)

The position is as follows:

1. Certain Carabinieri operating in forward areas are being rationed by the Armies to which they are attached. The particulars given in para 1 (b) of Col. Fiske's report do not tally with those given by SCAPO and fifth Army but can be accepted for the purpose of this memorandum.

It is suggested that all CORI performing duty forward of Corps rear boundaries should be attached to military units for rations, on the grounds of operational necessity.

2. Carabinieri serving in the remainder of occupied or free Italy are supplied with allied military rations from a bulk issue made to the Italian Army. This arrangement should continue.

3. In Sicily CORI receive a special ration on a higher scale than that of the ordinary civilian. No information is available as to the practice inardinia but it is recommended that all CORI wherever serving should be dealt with as in para 2 above it being considered undesirable to differentiate between sections of a national service.

4. As the Guardia di Finanza are accepted as members of the Italian Army for clothing and equipment it is recommended that they be treated in the same way as CORI in respect of rations also. The Chief Land Forces Sub-Commission has been consulted and supports this view.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Brigadier Lush

1. The matter of rationing of Carabinieri and Finance Guards appears to need re-examination. The existing situation is as follows: In Apulia they are subsisted on the regular Italian Army ration. In the 5th and 8th Armies they have been rationed similarly except,

(a) Carabinieri on the beachhead are subsisting like the refugees, on anything they can get.

(b) Following groups are subsisted on Allied Army rations:

- (1) 30 Carabinieri operating as a mobile group with 10 Corps.
- (2) 150 Carabinieri designated for service on the beachhead and now in route.
- (3) 500 Carabinieri designated for employment in the Cassino area.

(c) The following are subsisted on British Army rations supplied from 73rd Base Supply Depot, No. 2, R.A.S.C., Torre Innunjata:

850 Carabinieri and 500 Finance Guards brought from Bari and designated for eventual employment in Rome. These latter are, however, without soap, insecticide and cigarettes. 515

2. In Sicily the Carabinieri and Finance Guards are rationed the same as civilians. The bread and pasta ration has been increased to 300 grams and 40 grams respectively and an increase of pay has also been granted.

3. Present information is that elsewhere in Italy these elements are rationed by the Italian Army. Royal Carabinieri and Royal Finance Guards are an integral part of the Italian Army and might properly be rationed as such. The Economic Section objects to this on policy and states that the existing situation in Sicily is satisfactory.

4. I am informed that subsistence of these troops on Allied Force rations is contrary to specific directive from A.F.I.U. For operational reasons, however, it may be a necessity, especially on the beachhead and in certain forward areas where the Italian army supply service can not function.

SUBJECT: Feeding of C.C.R.R.

TO : Col. Fiske

1. I have consulted Lt. Col. Pollock, police officer with the Fifth Army concerning the feeding of C.C.R.R. He informs me as follows:-

(a) Since 1 January all C.C.R.R. in the regions and Apulia have subsisted on the regular Italian Army Ration.

(b) The C.C.R.R. in the 5th and 8th Army areas have been similarly fed, except for the following groups:-

(v) Any C.C.R.R. in the beachhead when we landed are subsisting like the refugees on anything they can get. There may be few, if any, C.C.R.R. in this category.

(z) Thirty C.C.R.R. working as a mobile group for Major Giffin at 10 Corps., 150 C.C.R.R. sent for 5th Army work at the beachhead in lieu of M.P.'s. and 300 C.C.R.R. to be sent to the Cassino area for work directly for the 5th Army. These groups are subsisting on Allied army rations.

2. Lt. Col. Pollock is very strongly of the opinion that all C.C.R.R. in the Army areas should receive Allied Army rations, as they are really unable to count on receiving any other type of ration with regularity.

MEMORANDUM: Concerning Rations for Carabinieri in Sicily.

TO : Colonel Norman Fiske, Deputy Executive Commissioner.

1. Two cables were sent from Brindisi concerning rations of Carabinieri in Sicily. No. 2050 was sent from Fatima from Fiske signed MacFarlane and was dated 21 January 1944, the other No. 2248 was sent from Fatima signed MacFarlane 2 February 1944. Copies of both cables are attached.

2. The problem of rations for the Carabinieri was carefully considered by this Headquarters at Palermo. G.C. # 5 HQ. AMG dated 13 November 1943, ordered the bread and pasta rations of the Carabinieri in Region I increased to a maximum of 300 grammes of bread and 40 grammes of pasta daily. The Carabinieri also were given an increase of pay at approximately the same time by G.C. # 14 HQ. AMG.

3. Issuance of army rations to the Carabinieri is not considered advisable because of the general policy against issuing such rations for an organization of this nature and also because of the system of messing the Carabinieri which allows them to eat at home.

4. It is felt that the above action makes adequate provision for the Carabinieri in Sicily in view of the present level of food rations available to the general public.

RECRUITING OF CARABINIERI.

1. In accordance with the verbal approval of MAJOR GENERAL LORD PENNELL and BRIGADIER GENERAL MCSHEE NY, the Commanding General, 3rd Division Royal Carabinieri, NAPLES, (General Ernesto Sennino) is authorized to recruit and train initially, one Battalion of a strength of 500 members, C.C.R.R.
2. The recruiting of other Battalions is authorized as conditions in other parts of Italy may warrant.
3. The first Battalion will be recruited in Sicily and trained at Palermo where arrangements have been made for housing and training space in the Bersaglieri Barracks adjoining the C.C.R.R. H.Q., Palermo.
4. The Commanding General Royal Carabinieri will furnish the necessary instructors from the personnel of his present organization.
5. The Public Safety Officer, Region 1 will supervise the training and instruction of these new members. He will make arrangements for the acquisition of any additional space that may be required when it becomes necessary to organize and train other Battalions.      505
6. An indemnity of nine (L 9) lire per diem in addition to regular base pay and allowances is authorized for these recruits.

SUBJECT: Carabinieri Recruiting.

TO : Administrative Directorate.

1. The question of increasing the Strength of the Carabinieri in Region I and in other parts of Italy was discussed with Major-General Lord Rennel by General Sannino after he had been appointed Commander of the Third Division, CCRR, with Headquarters in Naples and comprising the Fifth and Sixth Brigades, the Fifth covering certain parts of the Italian mainland and the Sixth covering Sicily. The suggestion received the approval of Major-General Lord Rennel. This conference was held late in November or early in December 1943.

2. The matter was also discussed at a conference with Brigadier-General McSherry on or about 6 December 1943 which was attended by the Chief of Public Safety, Hq. AMG, and Col. Spofford at which time Gen. McSherry gave his verbal approval to the plan which he had previously discussed with General Sannino. During the conference the RCAO, Region I, came in and was informed of the plan.

3. Plans were then made to secure housing space and training space in the vicinity of Carabinieri Headquarters in Palermo. A recruiting circular and personal history form were prepared by the Commanding General, CCRR, and forwarded to Provincial CCRR Commanders for distribution. This recruiting campaign was started about the middle of December 1943.

4. No information has been received from Region I regarding the program of recruiting. A report on this matter has been requested by letter from the Chief of Public Safety, AMG, addressed to Public Safety officer, Region I. General Sannino informs us that he has had no report from General Branca in Sicily, but he believes that recruiting is progressing favorably.

4. The question of uniforms and equipment may be a serious handicap to recruiting. Uniforms and equipment are not available in CCRR stores. A cable was sent to AFHQ early in December requesting the assignment of stated quantities of captured enemy material and equipment for this purpose. The request was denied with the statement that such material was being used for operational purposes. The matter has been presented to the C.G. Carabinieri at Bari with the suggestion that it be taken up with the Military Mission to the Italian Army.

6. Hq. AMG should issue the necessary instructions putting the additional pay of nine lire (L. 9) per day for these CCRR recruits into effect.

7. We have no record of the number or names of CCRR officers and other ranks who are being detained in Africa as Prisoners of War, nor, ~~otherwise~~, do we know the name or location of PW camps where they are being held. General Sanmino has submitted an inquiry to the C.G. CCRR at Bari to ascertain the necessary information. We will be informed of the result of such inquiry.

Subject: Enrollment of 500 auxiliary Carabinieri.

To all Command Officers: sections and dependent stations.

The Allied Military Command has authorized the voluntary recruiting of 500 auxiliary carabinieri for the period of the duration and six months thereafter to be drawn from corporals, lance corporals and soldiers; single, married or widowed from all the branches of the service of the Royal Army or from the discharged classes of the service of the Royal Army or from the discharged classes of 1912 to 1922.

The enrollment of youth from the classes of 1924 to 1925 has also been authorized, who have not been called into the army but who presented their application for enlistment as career carabinieri. For the latter candidates, they shall be called directly by this Legion for a medical examination if at the present time they possess the requisite moral standards.

The auxiliary candidates must present evidence of completion of at least elementary schools and must measure at least 170 cm in height and they shall assume the obligation to remain in the service for the duration and six months thereafter.

Besides possessing the requisite physical standards which shall be certified by the interested command by means of a preliminary medical examination, the Commandant of the station must attach all other requisite indicated in the moral fitness certificate.

Youths of the above mentioned classes who desire to become members of the carabinieri; will make their application in their own handwriting (tax free paper) to the commands of their own jurisdiction, supplemented, for those who have already rendered military service, by their discharge papers or in the case of imprisonment a certificate of completion of the term or any other documents which show military status or scholastic standing.

The youths are urged by active and realistic propaganda, to enter our ranks, stressing the economic advantages especially the relevant increase of wages made possible by the allied Government.

It should be provided immediately for the posting in the municipal buildings the attached manifest and which shall also be distributed among the pre-mentioned classes.

The application must be accepted by section and officer's Command within ten (10) days and must be submitted to this Legion upon the completion of the following documents which shall be collected by the said commands.

I authorize, therefore, the Sections and Officers Commands to forward the application and allied papers excepting those which are not possible to obtain.

Youths of the above mentioned classes who desire to become members of the carabinieri; will make their application in their own handwriting (tax free paper) to the command of their own jurisdiction, supplemented, for those who have already rendered military service, by their discharge papers or in the case of imprisonment a certificate of completion or the term of any other documents which show admittance status or scholastic standing.

The youths are urged by active and realistic propaganda, to enter our ranks, stressing the economic advantages especially the relevant increase of wages made possible by the allied Government. It should be provided immediately for the cost of living in the municipal utilities the attached manifest and which shall also be distributed among the pre-mentioned classes.

The application must be accepted by section head of Major's Command within ten (10) days and must be submitted to this Legion upon the completion of the following 10 documents which shall be collected by the said Commandant. I authorize, therefore, the Sections and Officers Commands to forward the application and allied papers excepting those which are not possible to obtain immediately.

A copy, if any, of the parent's previous criminal record and a copy, if any, of the record from the insane institutions.

(1) The Group Commands will take such necessary steps so as to facilitate the issuance of said records immediately.

(2) 1 certificate "mod. 20 bis" from competent and criminal tribunals.

(3) A Certified copy of the birth certificate.

(4) Certificate of Italian Citizenship.

(5) Scholastic standing, (a certificate of promotions to fourth grade elementary school is sufficient.).

Between 2 candidates, one physically, intellectually and morally mediocre and with a five family background and the other whose family reputation is bad who is intelligent and alert, latter will prevail over the former.

I want to thank all the Commands for the action taken in this most important task. A pecuniary reward will be given to the Commandant who have distinguished themselves in the enrollment of the aforesaid.

REGULATIONS FOR ENROLLMENT OF AUXILIARY CARRY STERI.

The Auxiliary Company has authorized the voluntary enrollment of 500 auxiliary carabinieri:

- a. Among lance corporals, corporals, sergeants, married, widowed soldiers, coming from all branches of commands and specialized or the Royal Army, or from the dissolved militia of the classes from 1912 to 1924;
- b. Youths of the classes 1924 & 1925 who have not been called into the military service;

III the candidates must:

1. Exhibit evidence of having obtained elementary school diploma (scuola elementare);
2. Must measure at least 5 ft. 5 1/2 in. height and 2. St. 10 in. thorax;
3. Must have the necessary requisites, "physically and morally".

The candidates must assume the obligation of service for the duration and six months thereafter.

The advantages of this enrollment are many:-

- a) The candidates who are recognized as morally and physically fit shall be immediately appointed into the auxiliary carabinieri, and will wear the uniform of the carabinieri.
- b) Upon acceptance he shall receive a "enrollment reward" of L. 1000.00;
- c) A daily salary of 39.50 lire. For those who are married or widowed with children, a family compensation ranging from Ls. 5 lire, minimum to 35.50 lire, maximum;
- d) Shall have training for three months at the territorial Legion of the Royal carabinieri at Palermo.

## COMMAND OF THE DIVISION OF ROYAL CARABINIERI.

Palermo, Dec. 6, 1943.

CONFIDENTIAL MEMORIAL for the General Brigadier Frank J. McSheerry.

Deputy Chief of Civil Affairs Officer.

For attention: Colonel Carlo Foletti - Chief of Regional Civil Affairs.

On December 1st the Superior Command of the Royal Carabinieri of Sicily, which was instituted by me at the time of the occupation of Sicily, ceased functioning to substitute the General Command of the Royal Carabinieri in Rome, with which it was impossible to correspond.

Reconstructed such command, although with the denomination of Command of the Carabinieri Arm of freed Italy with Seat at Bari, it has been also possible to reconstruct the Command of the 3rd Division of the Royal Carabinieri with Seat at Naples which already existed before the occupation.

By superior orders and with the approval of the Allied Government since Dec. 1st I have taken command of the above-mentioned Division with its two (2) subdivisions Palermo and Naples. The Brigade of Palermo (6) commanded by General Branca and includes the Legions of Palermo and Messina; the Brigade of Naples (5) is formed by the Legions of Naples, Catanzaro and Bari; temporarily the Legion of Bari depends from the General Command.

Under my command the Legion of Cagliari, which comprises the whole island of Sardegna, has been placed.

Service of the Royal Carabinieri in Sicily.

It is well known what great difficulties the carabinieri encountered at the time of the occupation; many of them were mistreated, arrested, disarmed; their barracks destroyed by bombardments and pillaged. Taking advantage of this state of confusion, the unscrupulous peoples mistreated them and the Allied Government, misinformed and not knowing the regulations, decided to transfer or substitute the personnel, promotions to higher grades, etc. causing a state of bewilderment and confusion as to paralyze the service of the carabinieri.

Fortunately this sad period lasted a short time on account of the clear comprehension on the part of the P.S. of the Allied Government, especially on the part of Colonel Boles and Lieut. Colonel Snock, who in short time settled matters with utmost satisfaction.

With prestige and authority restored the service again undertook its normal functions, but soon thereafter new difficulties arose. The rapid rise of the cost of living and meager salaries

-2-

( twenty-five cents per day) the carabinieri were subjected to many privations which rendered life intolerable. After 4 months they obtained a slight increase in wages, although not sufficient to cope with the higher cost of living, yet it was a slight amelioration.

The present condition of public safety and public order in Sicily are bad and I am personally convinced that these conditions will be worse if the police machinery is not placed in absolute efficiency.

Robberies have noticeably increased while public demonstrations on public squares have multiplied, sometimes assuming character of rioting with devastations, fires, etc.

The principal causes of these conditions must be attributed to food condition of the Island and rapid rise of cost of living, on which circumstances troublesome & political elements try to incite the people to perturbation of public order. It is necessary to consider that the communist party is particularly active and must not be excluded that the fascist elements profit the present difficulties to show the people that the conditions were better during the fascist regime than now.

Many arrests were made by the carabinieri during the riotings. I herewith advice to give particular severities in judgements at the trials; exemplary sentences are necessary and I do not exclude the opportunity to give some capital executions in the cases where carabinieri or polices of the Allied Government are overwhelmed and killed.

If, for internal political reasons, it is advisable to have a certain indulgence, it must also be considered that sometime severity is justified by the fact that the Allied Government has already shown its good will to help the people by sending the necessary food; therefore, it cannot and must not consent any manifestations that far from expressing the liberty granted, represents instead the most reprobating permission.  
Provisions taken by the Arm to face the Situation.

With my notes dated 7, 13, 16, 27 Oct. 2 & 4 November, I have already described the conditions of the Arm and the necessary provisions which should be taken, one of which is the constitution of a battaglion of 500 auxiliary carabinieri. Such constitution was requested by me on Sept. 1st and determined on Nov. 9th with official order No. 22 by the Chief of Civil Affairs of /D - Sicily. The reasons for this delay are several and I believe now useless to repeat them as now the matter is already settled.

Nevertheless, the notice of enrollment has already been publicated and is now in course of an immediate actualization.

(- 3 -)

I wish to make present, in order to save time, that the following must urgently be decided upon:

1. Permission to withdraw from the Italian warehouses existing in Sicily, 500 complete uniforms, arms and equipments, as without these the enrolled men cannot dress.
2. Permission to obtain necessary barracks, preferable selected the ex-barracks of the bersaglieri, near the barracks of the carabinieri legion.
3. To draw from the said military warehouses the necessary barrack furnishings (cots, blankets, sheets and mattresses).
4. Authorization to give P.S. indemnity (lire 9 daily for carabinieri) only to the carabinieri belonging to the battaglion. It is only a modest expenditure yet it represents a recompense for the hardships and dangers the carabinieri risks during the public order services.
5. To constitute another battaglion of 500 carabinieri, for which must also be granted the same provisions as in Nos. 1, 2, 3,& 4.
6. The immediate return of the officers of the Royal carabinieri who are in Libia as prisoners. It must be kept present that, in Sicily as well as in the freed Italy, many vacancies have been verified and partial have been filled with officers on leave or complements that for their advance age or for unexperience are not able to command their subordinates, just at this time that particular energy, resistance and professional capacities are needed.

In the meantime, the Commander of the Brigade, General Branca, with full approval of the Italian P.S. authorities and Allied Government, has ordered an immediate constitution of 14 police nucleus for the repression of crimes. But, also for these are necessary rapid means of transportation and horses. It results that in this case the Prefects of the various provinces have provided to facilitate the necessary requisitions.

I want to make evidence that telephone communications do not exist anymore, therefore, the commands of carabinieri are not connected. A grave fact that stops any possibility to immediate reach the place where disorders are manifested, as the interested commands are always informed behindhand.


