SUBJECT : Bari Legion CC.RR

TO : Commanding General CC.RR

1. On his return from a recent visit to Bari Major Wilcox of this Sub-Commission reported to me that he had been received with the greatest courtesy by Colonel MASONNE, Inspector of Schools, and Lt. Col. SUCCHIELLO, the Legion Commander.
2. The 150 CC.RR held at the replacement centre in Bari were smart and soldierly in appearance, and generally gave a very good impression.
3. The 500 CC.RR under training in the school at Andria had already been converted into a well disciplined body and appeared to be of a type which would prove a credit to the training staff and the Carabinieri.
4. I was very pleased to learn that very cordial relationships exist between the Legion Commander and Public Safety Officers in Apulia.

SUBJECT: Reports by CCRR to ACC.

TO : Regional Public Safety Officer, Region II.

1. It has been reported to me that Major REVELLEY, Provincial Police Officer, Bari, has requested the Officer commanding the CCRR Group at Bari to supply him with detailed reports varying from those ordinarily prepared in accordance with instructions from CCRR HQ.
2. While there is no objection to the Group Commander being asked by the Provincial Public Safety Officer to give verbally any information which is already in his possession, it is against the policy in unoccupied Italy for ACC officers to require him to prepare special written reports outside the scope of his normal routine.
3. Would you please convey the substance of this letter to Major REVELLEY and inform him that the Group Commander at Bari will give him verbally any information in his possession. If the information sought by Major REVELLEY is normally available at Legion Hqs., you may get it at that level.

1. Attached is the English text of a letter which will be sent by the General Commanding the GCR to all his subordinates in unoccupied territory.
 2. It is recommended that a copy of the letter be circulated to each Region for the information of Public Safety Officers.
 3. In the case of Regions which have not passed under the control of the Italian Government, paragraphs 1 to 4 will merely serve as a guide to the channels of communication which are desirable. Paragraph 5 will not apply.

 3. This General Hq. will maintain liaison with the P.S. Sub-Commission of ACC at Salerno.
 4. The Generals of Brigades and Divisions while having the power to intervene in cases where legions are lacking or uncertain in their relations with all other Commands with whom they are in contact, will limit their actions to coordinate the regulations adopted by the Commands of the various regions under their commands or jurisdiction. Difficulties which cannot thus be eliminated will be presented to this Headquarters for consideration and determination.
 5. Periodic reports to the P.S. Sub-Commission of ACC at Salerno will be a function of this command. Lower Hqs of CCRR will not make written periodic reports to P.S. Officers of ACC, though they will make available any reports, statistics or information which have already been prepared in the normal course of duty. They will also report orally on such specific matters as may be referred to them, informing the higher Hq of the CCRR as soon as possible.
 6. The foregoing regulations are applicable only to territory directly administered by the Italian Government.
