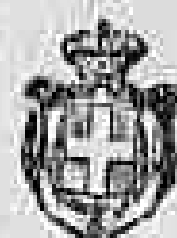

1. The Order of Battle for CC.RR. recently issued gives the strength of CC.RR. officers authorised for this Region as 98. Of this number 38 are absorbed by the Legion Head Quarters leaving a total of 60 for ordinary Station and Street duties. In the Region are 64 H.Q. stations normally commanded by officers, not including the Legion H.Q., and at present the number of officers available for these commands is 38. This means that some 26 main or HQ. stations must be commanded by N.C.Os., or not at all. Bearing in mind that the Region is understaffed in N.C.Os. to the tune of something like 150, many small stations do not function at all.

2. The Public Safety situation is not good. There is an almost complete absence of incentive among the CC.RR., a fear of the consequences should they take action. Officers and men alike have a feeling of insecurity. There are many reasons for this. Chief among these I place the lack of control due to absence of Officers and N.C.Os. A factor is the complete lack of uniforms in many cases, and the deplorable condition of the clothing of those who can sport some kind of uniform. It is not conducive to good moral for CC.RR. to walk about dressed in a miscellaneous collection of worn out garments and at the same time to see so called partisans parading the streets in British and American clothing. Now and again it has been possible to obtain odd pieces of equipment and clothing from a variety of sources, but this is only touching the fringe of the problem. I estimate that a thousand complete uniforms and ~~shirts~~ ^{shirts} are necessary in order to put the Region on a working basis.

3. It must be remembered that this Region, for a long time, was the centre of much fighting. The forces of law and order were completely disrupted and hooliganism was the only form of "control". For the past two months we have been reaping the harvest of that "control". Fortunately, there has recently been one or two good arrests, and a little stiffening of the CC.RR. morale is noticeable. I feel, that given some assistance by way of an increase in Officer and NON Commissioned Officer personnel together with an adequate supply of

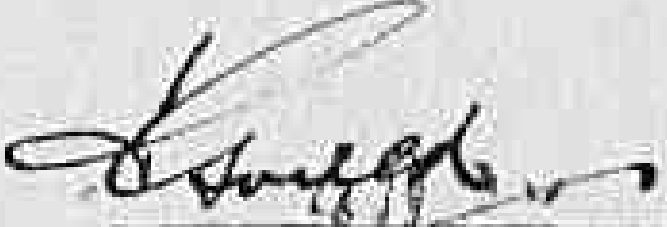

1. Attached for your information and action are
- (a) Order of Battle - Carabinieri
 - (b) Copy letters dated 25 May from APC, and dated 26 May from MMIA.

2. The Order of Battle shows the breakdown of the established strength of 55000 carabinieri. The APC letter of 25 May 45 authorized an increase of 3000 on the strength of 55000 CC.RR. In our cable 8870 dated 1st June 45 you were authorized to enroll 500 recuperated CC.RR. MMIA require as soon as possible a list of units to fill these manpower spaces.

3. The letter from MMIA suggests that new units will be formed as a result of the allocation of 3000 men. This is not so. At present the northern regions are 7500 below their 55000 ceiling. Accordingly the 3000 CC.RR will be used partially to activate existing units up to their 55000 ceiling.

4. Will you please supply as soon as possible a list of the companies in your region affected by the increase of 500 CC.RR. Your return should be a copy of certain companies shown in the Order of Battle with the number of men allotted to the company and totalled to 500. Please quote serial numbers.

5. It is understood that companies may not be completely reconstituted from the 500 CC.RR. For example Parma Company totals 296. You may have allotted 50 from spearhead, and a further 80 may now be allotted from your increase of 500. Your return would thus show :-

It would assist records in this office if you would show in the remarks column the number of CG-22 in the company already supplied from the south.

6. The return required is one of established strength. You may have arranged concentrations in certain areas above the established strength to deal with local conditions existing at the present time, but this would not be reflected in your allotment to Companies for the purpose of this return.

7. An Order of Battle is being prepared on a 65000 ceiling and a copy will be forwarded to you when approved by AFHQ. Increases from 55000 to 65000 will all be absorbed in the North, as the strength in the South is now approximately at the 65000 level.

4. A further 400 CC.RR. from Scuola Centrale, Florence, for duty in Emilia Region, and called for by 5 Army ANG, should arrive tomorrow 22 May. They would make a total strength for the Region of 3633.

This total is in excess of 3071, the number allotted under the 55,000 ceiling but is nearly identical with the figure of 3643 as allotted under the 65,000 ceiling.

As at present all CC.RR. are greatly needed, and in order to increase their morale I respectfully ask that the number of recuperated CC.RR. be taken on the strength of the Region as soon as possible.

1. In the occupation of Northern Italy the strength of CC.RR has been laid down in AC Directive No. AC/14601/21/PS, dated 17th February 1945.
2. These CC.RR are being supplied from Regions in AMG territory and liberated Italy by reducing them to the strength detailed in this directive.
3. In the absence of authority to increase the ceiling to 45,000 the total strength of CC.RR must not exceed 55,000 for the whole of Italy.
4. All Refugee Carabinieri found in the advance will be dealt with by using them as AMG police until such time as screening and adjustment of numbers in the south is effected.
5. In the interval of waiting the CC.RR will be given a police arm-band and paid and rationed from civilian sources. The rations will be those issued to public security.
6. A signal will be sent to this HQ as to the number of such CC.RR taken on duty, weekly.
7. A Directive will be issued by Finance Sub-Commission to Provincial Finance Officers to cover the payment.
