- 2 Para 3. of 41A states that Police will remain on Embassies and Diplomatic Missions. No such exception was made on 20A issued by Executive Commission on 2 Sept. 44.
- 3 On 6A of AEE/14601/43/PS RAAC ~~also~~ for Italian Military Guards on the residence of Sir D'Arcy Osborne, British Minister to the Holy See. 41A has been replied to RAAC (see 8A) pointing out that 2 companies of Grenadiers are available for guard duties.

4 In view of the action taken by RAAC in Para 3 above, it does not appear to be necessary to take up with them the exception made in their Memorandum 41A

TO : V.P. Administrative Section.

1. No trace can be found of a directive from this Hqs to R.P.S.Os, stating that Italian military personnel must be substituted for Police employed on extraneous guard duties.
2. Letter 18B, dated 3rd May, 1944, was sent to A.A.I., but R.C. & M.C. state that no reply has ever been received.
3. No letter from M.M.I.A., can be found stating that they have agreed to Italian soldiers replacing police on guard duties.
4. However, the following minute signed by Col. Kirk appears in our file LCC/14619/PS.

"To M.M.I.A. At a conference held with you on the 26th July (General Browning, Col. Kerr and Lieut. Col. Noakes for M.M.I.A. and Col. Upjohn and Col. Kirk for A.C.C.) it was agreed that such requests as these, (i.e., guarding railway tunnels and bridges at the request of the Military Railway Service) should be met by Italian Military formations and not by CC.RR or other police."

No other record of this meeting can be found.

5. It would seem that instructions to this effect should now be issued by A.F.H.Q. to all military commands in Italy.
6. It is therefore suggested that a letter on the lines of the ~~attached~~ draft 18A, be sent to A.F.H.Q.
7. The correspondence at 10 C-F reveals the attitude of M.M.I.A. on this subject.

1. This HQ acknowledges receipt of your letter AC/14601/
26/PS dated 15 May 45 and enclosures from Commerce Sub-Commission.

2. The situation has been reviewed, but it is regretted
that Italian Military Guards are not available for this particular
duty. During contact with HQ PBS, Southern District, it has been
learned that recently approximately 900 Italian Military Guards
have been transferred for duty in the northern areas leaving only
about 300 for Naples - in the near future this contingent of 300
is anticipating transfer to the north also.

3. As is well-known the establishment of CC.RR in Naples
is seriously depleted and this has resulted in the Questura taking
over many of the duties previously undertaken by the CC.RR. I
would add that the situation has not been improved by the removal
of four companies of US Military Police from Naples.

4. In view of the vulnerable nature of these warehouses,
the attention of the Questore and the Colonel Commanding, Naples
Legion, CC.RR, has been drawn to the matter and their patrols are
paying special attention.

1. This Directorate has a contract with the Regional Commissioner, Lazio for the purchase of 4500 sheep.
2. Many difficulties have arisen, one being the movement of sheep from low land grazing to high land grazing. With this movement, the officials of the Regional Commissioner, SEPRAL, etc. are unable to maintain any check on the sheep.
3. They have requested, therefore, that this Directorate should approach the Italian Police Force with a view to obtaining their co-operation in stopping the movement of sheep from Lazio unless the owners, shepherd etc. are in possession of a letter or certificate signed by an official of SEPRAL of either ROME RIETI, or Viterbo, stating that the owner, shepherd etc., has handed over to the SEPRAL concerned, the necessary percentage of sheep.
4. It is requested, therefore, that you approach the Italian Police on behalf of his Directorate, with a view to obtaining their co-operation.

On the 20th March, 1945, Major Erickson of G-2, ARHQ, telephoned to me and asked if 8 CC.RR could be used at a G-2 Installation near Naples. He did not mention the name of the installation for security reasons. He said that the Legion Commander was willing to supply the 8 CC.RR, but that Major Richardson, the R.P.S.O., had said that authority must be given by Public Safety Sub-Commission.

I asked Major Erickson the nature of the duty on which the CC.RR would be employed and he said that it involved security. I asked him if it was guard duty and he replied that it would be partly guard duty. I explained to him that no CC.RR could be employed on guard duty, but that if he would explain in writing the exact duties which they would be required to perform and if this Sub-Commission was satisfied that the duty could only be performed by trained CC.RR, then the application would be given sympathetic consideration. If, on the other hand, the duty did not require trained policemen, he should make application for Italian military guards.

Major Erickson then said that the military guards being used at this installation were not entirely satisfactory and did not command the respect which would be given to CC.RR. I pointed out that while we agreed that CC.RR could perform guard duty better than Italian soldiers, nevertheless CC.RR could not be used for these purposes at the expense of maintaining law and order.

TRANSLATION

Subject:- Guarding of Depots in FRATTAMAGGIORE and FRATTAMINORE

Following our letter 1854/c dated 4th Dec 1944, transmitted to Ministry of War, detachment Office Recupero with letter 1872/c same date.

The H.Q. Legione Territoriale Carabinieri Reali in Naples has notified that it is not possible to reinforce adequately the guard detachment in Frattamaggiore to assure a better service at the military depots of Frattamaggiore and Frattaminore.

In fact, only 4 carabinieri have been assigned to the said depots, and that number is absolutely inadequate for the military necessities and to maintain public order.

The general situation at Frattamaggiore and vicinity has not improved regarding its "gangster" phenomena. This seems to be increasing. Stealing continues on the railroad station of Frattamaggiore and the shipping of clothing to the Italian Divisions is carried out mostly by rail.

Wagons loaded with clothing, sometimes remain in the station during the night, awaiting the departure and it has been ascertained that the escorts sent by units in Naples are inefficient.

The Carabinieri stationed at Frattamaggiore have already notified their superior authority that clothing has been sold by the military personnel escorting the rail wagons.

The Allied authorities have for their part, called attention to the Italian War Ministry regarding the critical deficiency of the clothing items to be issued to the Italian Army and that every item stolen is an item taken away from the troops, causing a direct hindrance to the war effort. (Letter LPSC AC (MILIA) Rome AQ/6 dated 31/1/45 attached to dispatch War Ministry 10/1/RP dated 3 Feb 1945 sent to S.E. Commanding Officer Naples Area).

Thus H.Q. has adopted all possible means to assure the internal guarantee of the establishments. But, in the evening, these establishments are provided armed civilian personnel, on whom one cannot surely rely.

The undersigned therefore thinks it absolutely essential that a guard platoon be stationed continuously in such place.

Furthermore, it is necessary that the Carabinieri now stationed at Prattammaggiore be given 4 bicycles, military type, so they can transfer themselves from one place to another more rapidly, improving their duty.

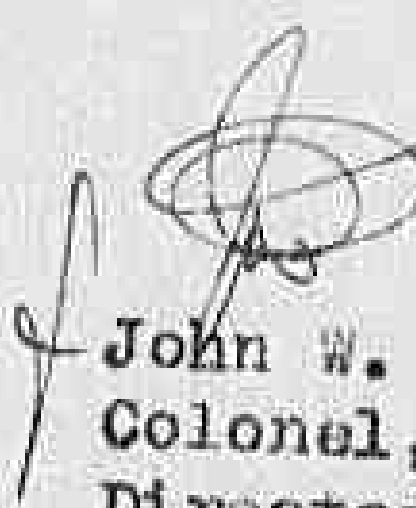

The continued employment of a large number of CCRR is due to the fact that the Rear Army Control Line is still in the Province of Ancona, and for security reasons it is intended, if possible, to use members of the CCRR on this duty until such time as the line moves forward.

The majority of the GGFF, it will be noticed, are employed by the Military. The main class of employment under this heading is the guarding of the coastline from Porto Recanati to Senegallia. It is considered this duty is important from a security angle, and is being performed at the urgent request of the Port Security Officer."

There are 1300 Communes in the Region, 3 complete CCRP Legions and a part of a fourth, 4 GGFF Legions and 15 Questore Agencies - spread out over a very large area with troops and Allied Headquarters sprinkled thereover. Under these circumstances it would take many weeks to collect accurate statistics of the exact number of Police returned to normal police duties.

2. As far as is known, no important numbers of any of the various Police Agencies are now employed on non-police duties except Guardia Municipali who are generally so untrained that they are possibly best employed as door guards. It is hoped that this general information will suffice you. If, on the other hand, accurate figures are required, instructions will be issued to the Legions and 1300 Communes to send in returns.

I should like to call your attention to Executive Commissioners Memo reference 302/218/CA dated 21 Sept 44 on the above subject.

As you will notice, trained policemen will not be used in the future for guard duties or any kind of work other than regular police duty. In the case of police employed by Italian agencies in Italian Government territory, Regional Commissioners are limited to advising the competent police authority.

Difficulty is being experienced in finding sufficient CC.RR for the north, together with the necessary clothing and equipment. Our needs have been made known to the Director Army Sub-Commission. While he is giving us support he is known to have remarked on the large number of CC.RR on purely guard duty on various buildings in Rome. There is no doubt that CC.RR ought not to be used for this sort of duty.

It would be very much appreciated if you would give special attention to this matter in Rome, where the result of the Executive Commissioners instruction will no doubt be carefully watched by interested parties.

SUBJECT : Police employed on Guard duties.

TO : Allied Force Headquarters.

1. On 3rd May, 1944, the enclosed letter was addressed to A.A.I. on the subject of trained Italian police being diverted from their proper duties to guard military installations: buildings, etc.
2. No reply to our letter has been received.
3. With the occupation of new territory, where Carabinieri and other Italian Police have already been disbanded or withdrawn by the enemy, the police manpower situation has become extremely serious.
4. At a Conference between M.M.I.A. and Administrative Section, Allied Control Commission, it was agreed that Italian Police should be used only for their normal functions and that extraneous guard duties should be performed by Italian Military personnel.
5. It is therefore suggested that instructions should be issued by your HQ.s to the effect that all Italian Police employed on guard duties at the request of Military Units will be replaced by Italian military (not CC.RR) personnel and that no applications for trained Italian police to be used on other than normal police duties will be entertained in the future.

SUBJECT : Use of Carabinieri.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy.

1. I am directed by the Chief Commissioner to invite your attention to and co-operation in the solution of a problem that is becoming acute. At present upwards of one thousand Carabinieri and smaller number of Guardia di Finanza and Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza are being used as guards on public buildings, dumps and warehouses, generally at the request of military formations.

2. As you are no doubt aware policing of occupied and unoccupied territory is, so far as Italian civilians are concerned, normally carried out by these three agencies:-

- (a) Carabinieri Reali (CCRR)
- (b) Guardia di Finanza (GCF)
- (c) Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza.

Of these the Carabinieri are essentially soldiers who are specially and highly trained in police duties, and by virtue of their traditions were, and still are, greatly respected by the civilian population. It is considered that the use of such highly trained policemen on what is a military function, such as guard duties, is extremely wasteful. Furthermore, the number of these police bodies is quite insufficient to perform their present duties and would be more than insufficient to cope with the problems which will arise if a rapid advance were to be made. It is thought that other and less highly trained Italian Military personnel than the Carabinieri should be employed for guards, thus leaving Carabinieri free for their proper functions.

3. The other two bodies, paras. 2(b) and (c) above, also have specialised duties and while their use of guards is less common and perhaps not quite so undesirable as in the case of the Carabinieri, it is nevertheless objected to on the grounds that it diverts specialist personnel which can ill be spared from their proper functions.

4. It is suggested that the use of Italian Army personnel or of Allied troops from Replacement Depots, if the former should not be considered as sufficiently reliable, should be considered. As it is necessary to return trained police personnel to their proper duties as soon as possible, the Chief Commissioner would be grateful for your comments on this letter at an early date.

3. Increasing demands for train guards make it impossible for military police of this organization to be placed on such duty.

2. In accordance with my directions meetings took place between the Royal Carabinieri and the Questore of Naples, and full discussion has taken place. The Questore now reports that the necessary accord has been reached with the Carabinieri, with the aim of bettering, in every way possible, the services of the Railway Police of the Central Station, Mergellina Station and the departments of the FF.SS.

3. The discussions and exchange of views resulted in the decision that the P.S. Authorities should take over the control and that the Royal Carabinieri, commanded up to now by Major Fera, should gradually be substituted by police dependent from the Questura di Napoli.

1. This report is in continuation of my PS/3.1. of 24th July, 1944, and deals specifically with Royal Carabinieri employed on special duties.

2. I have gone carefully into the whole matter with the Legion Commander and he has supplied me with the following:-

- a. List of CC.RR. personnel employed in services in the Port of Naples. 4 Officers, 18 N.C.Os and 243 CC.RR.
- b. List of CC.RR. personnel employed on Railway Police duties. 1 Officer, 28 N.C.Os and 178 CC.RR.
- c. List of CC.RR. personnel employed in various other special services. 1 Officer, 22 N.C.Os and 208 CC.RR.

It will be observed that there is some variation between these figures and those shown in pars. 4 (e) and 5 of my previous letter. This, apart from the slight day to day variation, is accounted for, in the main, owing to the fact that in the latter only the actual force at the Port of Naples was shown whereas in list (a) is given these figures plus those engaged on various services which operate from the Port such as the guarding of certain food warehouses, etc. The difference was shown under 'Various' in my former letter.

3. It should be remembered that for some time past efforts have been made to reduce the number specially employed and last May the whole matter was thoroughly gone into and a considerable saving effected. Even during the last fortnight a further reduction of 23 N.C.Os and men had been made;

4. The result is that it is doubtful whether much more can be done to cut down the number of those specially employed for the reasons given hereafter. It is of paramount importance to recognise the fact that

Carabinieri are soldiers and policemen and it is the latter aspect that is of major consideration as far as I am concerned. It is absolutely impossible for ordinary Italian military to perform the majority of the duties now being done by the Royal Carabinieri and any attempt to make such a substitution would have dire results.

5. Dealing separately with the three lists I have the following observations to offer:-

- a. Personnel employed by the Allies in the service of the Port of Naples - 4 Officers, 18 N.C.Os and 243 CC.RR.

In normal times this was not a service performed by the Royal Carabinieri. It was done by the Port Militia, a specially trained body engaged solely on Port duties. Since the latter were disbanded the work has fallen on the shoulders of the Royal Carabinieri who have done good work. Most of the duties require police experience and every day numbers of offences are discovered and many people are arrested and prosecuted. Naples Port is undoubtedly the busiest and most important spot, from a supply point of view, in the whole of Italy and only the best available man-power (e.g. Royal Carabinieri) should be used in guarding and policing this important place, which by reason of its extreme value to us is still a military zone under AMG. The Authorities have even established a Port Provost Office and the Port P.M. is warm in his praise of ^{the} work of the Carabinieri and states the Port would not operate effectively without them. Any attempt to replace them by ordinary Italian soldiers would meet the strongest opposition from highest Military commands.

I agree with the Legion Commander that it is not possible to abolish this service at the present time, or even to reduce the number of Carabinieri employed.

- b. Personnel on Railway Police Service - 1 Officer, 28 N.C.Os and 178 CC.RR.

In normal times these duties were in part discharged by the Royal Carabinieri and treated as normal routine work. It was not then necessary to employ so large a body as the main functions devolved on the now suppressed Railway Militia and Public Safety Officials. When the Allies took over orders were given that the whole Railway service should be performed by the Royal Carabinieri, hence the comparatively large force at present employed. Quite recently, however, the Questore of Naples has received orders from the Italian Government to co-operate with the Carabinieri and to take over those functions which devolved on his office in pre-war days. 67

Discussions are at the moment taking place and it is almost certain that as a result some saving of Carabinieri man-power will be effected.

At the same time, however, it must be borne in mind that the Railway Service, owing to the importance of safeguarding Allied Military goods in transit, will need more personnel than in pre-war days, and, therefore, too large a reduction of Carabinieri cannot be made without detriment to Allied interests.

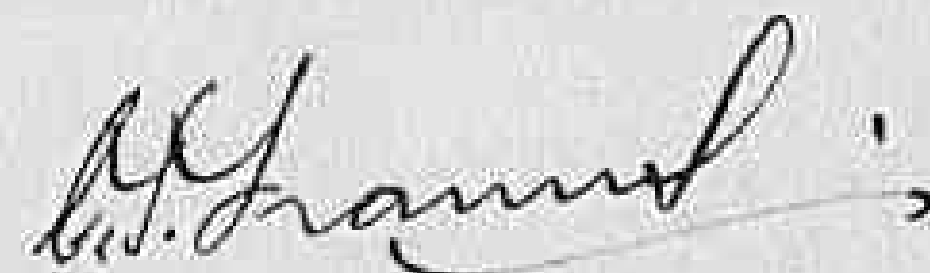
c. CC.RR. personnel employed by the Allies in various services -
1 Officer, 22 N.C.Os and 208 CC.RR.

These figures are greatly less than they were a few months ago (see par. 3).

Of the total at present employed 1 Officer, 17 N.C.Os and 119 CC.RR. are actually performing duties which would in normal times fall to the lot of the Royal Carabinieri. 5 N.C.Os and 89 CC.RR. are doing work which is not a normal Carabinieri function but which has been specially requested by the Allied Forces. Most of these duties are still essential and many of them could not be done other than by trained Policemen.

After a careful review a further saving of 2 N.C.Os and 27 CC.RR. is likely and steps will be taken to effect this.

6. The result, purely from a point of view of securing a reduction of numbers of Carabinieri specially employed, may sound disappointing but I am absolutely convinced that to attempt to replace Carabinieri performing police functions with ordinary soldiers would be a most unwise step; would lead to a great increase in crime, would be prejudicial to Allied interests and would involve difficulties out of all proportion to the importance of saving a few Carabinieri specially employed.

1. The CC.RR are being used for many duties not only with AMG/ACC, but by Army units.
2. This is, in my opinion, an unnecessary drain upon their manpower, especially in view of the demand for forward areas.
3. For example, I have enquired into one section only (Aquila City) which revealed the following:-
 - (a) the available strength of CC.RR in the city is 77.
 - (b) each day the services of no less than 52 CC.RR are required for AMG (Region & Province) and 151 Sub-Area duties. An additional 12 are performing military guard duties at an Allied Petrol Point, recently established here.
 - (c) This leaves 9 Carabinieri for each tour of duty for their normal police work.
4. Could not these CC.RR be replaced by paid Patriots. ACC instructions are that Patriots should be found employment.
5. If this number is absorbed in Aquila alone, there must be a terrific drain on them throughout the country.
6. Could the matter be considered by higher authority and a directive issued to both ACC/AMG and Army. I am endeavouring to check it here.

SUBJECT : Use of Carabinieri.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy.

1. I am directed by the Chief Commissioner to invite your attention to and co-operation in the solution of a problem that is becoming acute. At present upwards of one thousand Carabinieri and smaller number of Guardia di Finanza and Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza are being used as guards on public buildings, dumps and warehouses, generally at the request of military formations.

2. As you are no doubt aware policing of occupied and unoccupied territory is, so far as Italian civilians are concerned, normally carried out by these three agencies:-

- (a) Carabinieri Reali (CCRR)
- (b) Guardia di Finanza (GGFF)
- (c) Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza.

Of these the Carabinieri are essentially soldiers who are specially and highly trained in police duties, and by virtue of their traditions were, and still are, greatly respected by the civilian population. It is considered that the use of such highly trained policemen on what is a military function, such as guard duties, is extremely wasteful. Furthermore, the number of these police bodies is quite insufficient to perform their present duties and would be more than insufficient to cope with the problems which will arise if a rapid advance were to be made. It is thought that other and less highly trained Italian Military personnel than the Carabinieri should be employed for guards, this leaving Carabinieri free for their proper functions.

3. The other two bodies, paras.2(b) and (c) above, also have specialised duties and while their use as guards is less common and perhaps not quite so undesirable as in the case of the Carabinieri, it is nevertheless objected to on the grounds that it diverts specialist personnel which can ill be spared from their proper functions.

4. It is suggested that the use of Italian Army personnel or of Allied troops from Replacement Depots, if the former should not be considered as sufficiently reliable, should be considered. As it is necessary to return trained police personnel to their proper duties as soon as possible, the Chief Commissioner would be grateful for your comments on this letter at an early date.
