To : Chief Public Safety Officer, Region

NAPLES

The American Port Police in Naples requests 2 officers, 10 N.C.O. and 80 soldiers for duty in civilian clothes in the Port Area, to prevent thefts of Allied goods and acts of sabotage, or espionage.

By request of the above mentioned H.Q. these men can also carry out their services outside the port, to make arrests, searches, investigations etc.

Considering the high cost of clothes, we propose that they receive a free issue, and an indemnity for the upkeep of civilian clothes, in the measure established by the army who discharge services with the C.S. Center.

The first issue is as follows:

Officers	lire 4000.00
N.C.O.	" 2500.00
C.O.	" 1500.00

Indemnity for the upkeep of civilian clothes

Officers	lire 1800.00
N.C.O.	" 1200.00
C.O.	" 150.00
