of 159 Carabinieri of the original Rome party, left Naples
by train for Palermo, Sicily, to report to C.C.R.R Headquarters
there.3. A further detail of 41 Carabinieri entrained on 8th,
May 1944, for the same destination.4. This movement, which was made under control of Ital-
ian Military Authorities, completed the transfer of 200 C.C.R.R
for permanent duty in Sicily.

1. In view of the occupation of additional territory in Region IV, arrangements have been made to call on C.C.R.R. held in reserve for this purpose.

2. A reconnaissance was made by the Public Safety Officer of this unit to MINTURNO area on 16 May 1944, when it was tentatively arranged to house the C.C.R.R. in the Carcere, which is the most habitable building.

3. The Public Safety Officer of Region IV has been met and arrangements made to transport 40 C.C.R.R. and 2 Officers to MINTURNO on 18th or 19th May from which point they can be deployed as the situation develops.

4. The Mobile C.C.R.R. attached to this Army A.M.G. are moving forward with divisions and Corps, cooperating closely with Military Police and assisting the C.I.C. in the shepherding and screening of refugees which have come back from the forward communes and fractions.

Subject: Special Police Contingent for Rome.

To. : Brig. Gen. HUME

1. On 17th December, 1943, General EISENHOWER approved a Police Plan to take into the City a total of 3,000 Carabinieri and Finance Guards.

2. Of the above number, 200 were to be drawn from Sicily but in January last I was aware of certain troubles there with the civilian population and we refrained from transferring these men. From elsewhere in liberated Italy and Sardinia we gathered together some 2,800 Carabinieri and Finance Guards.

3. Last month we were ordered to send 200 of our Rome contingent to Sicily and in consequence of this shortage, together with sickness, venereal disease, etc., our special Police Contingent has become depleted.

4. On 9th May, 1944, Gen. MORICCA, of our Finance Guards called at my office, and was introduced to Brig. Gen. HUME.

In the course of the conversation, Gen. MORICCA said there were some 300 Finance Guards in Sardinia who could be spared for Police work in Rome.

We need these men badly and subject to approval I would send one of our Officers with a Finance Guard Officer to select 200 of the best Finance Guards available, also to arrange for them to be transferred to the mainland with 1200 Carabinieri awaiting shipment.

5. As time is short may I have approval to approach A.G.C. to approve this transfer.

2. On the same day, Capt. Coombs called and stated that the commanding was doing his work in an efficient manner, and I cannot understand good discipline.
3. I should like your views on the motor in working, so that we can know; what action, if any, is required by this HQ.
4. It was understood from Captain Tompkins that the O.S.C. 3377, was being exchanged for 300 to be transferred to 1400, and that it is a matter which very much concerns this Sub-Commission. This one of policy that who did have been engaged at this HQ.
5. If in fact, such arrangements have been made, I shall be glad if you will let me know what they are, and request that in future matters of policy affecting this Sub-Commission should be referred here.

SERVICE SITUATION OFFICE

To: Col. Pollock Chief, Public Safety Rome

May 15, 1944

I notice that the R.Guardia di Finanza for Rome which was previously agreed in Bari to be 600 has increased to 1300 men, while the Carabinieri who have been employed everywhere (Sicily etc.) have decreased.

I cooperated in the formation of the Rome contingent and with the same spirit I wish to state to you that:

1. The units of R. Guardia di Finanza are different from those of the Arma, different preparations and employment.
2. By diminishing the strength of the CC.RR which was at its minimum and increasing the strength of the Finanza might full-in the gap of the Carabinieri and thereby causing an overlapping and confusion of the service and its functions.
3. During normal times, there were 6000 Carabinieri in Rome against 5 to 600 Guardia di Finanza. In all the Services of restoring order the Finanza was never employed, it was the functions of the army to help the Carabinieri in case of need. The above employment, above all a wrongful employment, of the R.G. di Finanza would not only astonish but also incite the people when arrested by R.G. di Finanza.
4. Having taken away the G. di Finanza from Col. Perinetti of CC.RR it is clear that the Arma cannot assume any responsibility on the employment of the Guardia di Finanza.

Vedo che il contingente della R.Guardia di Finanza, concretato d'accordo a Bari in 600 uomini, è salito a 1.300 contro diminuzione di carabinieri che sono stati diversamente impiegati (Sicilia ecc.).

Poichè nel noto progetto di Roma ho collaborato, per lo stesso spirito di collaborazione, tengo a precisarvi che:
1°)-i compiti istituzionali della R.Guardia di Finanza sono diversi da quelli dell'Arma, diversa la preparazione e diverso l'impiego;
2°)-diminuendo la forza dei CC.RR. che era prevista col minimo ed esuberando quella della Finanza porterà questa a colmare il vuoto di quelli e vi conseguenza a misto e quindi confusione di servizio e di funzioni;
3°)-che in Roma in periodo normale si avevano 6.000 carabinieri contro 5-600 Guardie di Finanza. In tutti i servizi di ordine mai è stata impiegata la Finanza: era all'occorrenza l'Esercito che concorreva con 4000 uomini all'ordine pubblico in ausilio ed alle dipendenze dei carabinieri. Un sovra impiego e soprattutto un errato impiego della Guardia di Finanza porterebbe alme-

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no meraviglia a parte inconvenienti tecnici ed incidenti mal tollerando la popolazione ad es: arresti da parte di Guardie di Finanza;

4°)-avendo sganciato la Guardia di Finanza dalle dipendenze di servizio del Colonnello Perinetti resta bene chiaro che l'Arma non può assumersi nessuna responsabilità circa l'impiego della predetta Guardia di Finanza.

Herewith copy of notation received Commander of Carabinieri Groups at Cagliari:

"The services requested of these groups, thanks to the Legion Commander, have been restricted up to now to the commune of Cagliari so that the dispatching of the Rome contingent has been avoided and the possibility assured of embarking it upon 12 hours notice as previously requested by the Allied Command.

Since the High Commissioner of Sardinia guarantees the availability of the units to leave for the continent with one day's notice in advance, the writer refrains from expressing his doubts into the matter; but considers it his duty to communicate that if these units were to be in continuous use in future throughout the Island, notable damage would develop into its moral and material efficiency.

In fact, it would be quite difficult to elevate the morale of the personnel, which becomes daily more necessary in proportion to the delay ~~extensio~~ of the order to embark and cannot be continued methodically with concrete results so that these men may be equal to the important tasks which will be required of them.

Besides, these units would resent the lack of equipment, especially uniforms and shoes, which it is impossible to furnish them - after those granted them last January - because the Italian Quartermaster HQ of Sardinia, with its very limited supplies, must take care of other units of other Arms to be placed in readiness.

On the other hand, from the context of the letter of the High Commissioner, it seems evident that the above Carabinieri are being used, not ~~per~~ through definite necessity but only because they appear to be dispensable in the Island; so much so that we are ready to do without their services on one day's advance notice.

However, the undersigned, in order to avoid inconveniences, will continue to cope with the situation as long as these men are kept within their present limits.

Since, moreover, with the lengthening of their stay in Sardinia, the stronger becomes the desire on the part of military authorities to make use of them and further with the coming of spring, another serious menace faces the contingent in the form of malaria, it would behoove the competent Allied commands, in compliance with urgent insistence of "R" office, to order the immediate transfer of these subordinate units to the continent.

A propos, we notice the availability of Italian cruisers, which are employed in the transport of our troops from Sardinia to the continent; one of which possibly in a single trip could transfer the entire contingent, if the Allied authorities permitted."

Note of Commanding General:-

"I would request the Allied Control Commission to hasten, if possible, the sending of this contingent to the continent."

Spoke to Gen. Leche on 3rd May 1944. Told him

that the matter would be left in abeyance for a week or two.

Si trascrive la seguente del Comando raggruppamento carabinieri reali di Cagliari:

".....I servizi richiesti a questo raggruppamento, merce l'appoggio concesso al sottoscritto dal signor comandante della legione, sono stati contenuti, finora, nell'ambito del comune di Cagliari, in modo che è stata evitata la dispersione del contingente in appontamento per la Capitale ed assicurata la possibilità di imbarcarlo con un preavviso di 12 ore come in precedenza richiesto dal comando Alleato.

Poichè l'Alto Commissariato per la Sardegna garantisce la disponibilità dei reparti per la partenza per il continente con preavviso di un giorno, lo scrivente si astiene dal formulare dubbi in proposito; ma reputa doveroso comunicare che, ove il contingente venisse, effettivamente, in futuro, utilizzato in servizi d'istituto in tutta l'Isola, non trascurabile danno deriverebbe alla sua efficienza morale e materiale.

Infatti, assai problematica riuscirebbe l'opera di elevazione spirituale del personale, la quale si rivela più necessaria a misura che si prolunga l'attesa dell'ordine d'imbarco; nè potrebbe essere continuata metodicamente, con concreti risultati, l'istruzione in atto, per adeguare i carabinieri all'^{addestramento} solvimento degli importanti compiti per essi previsti.

Più ancora ne risentirebbe l'equipaggiamento, uniformi e calzature in specie, delle quali non è possibile sperare la ben-

chè minima assegnazione -dopo quelle ottenute nello scorso gennaio- perchè l'Intendenza del Comando Militare della Sardegna, con le limitatissime scorte di cui tuttora dispone, deve fronteggiare le necessità, invero sensibili, dei reparti delle altre armi in appontamento.

D'altra parte, dal contesto della lettera dell'Alto Commissariato appare evidente che si vogliono utilizzare i carabinieri di cui trattasi, più che per una reale, imprescindibile, necessità, per il solo fatto che essi appaiono disponibili nell'Isola; tanto è vero che si è pronti a rinunciare -previo avviso di un sol giorno- al loro servizio.

Pertanto, il sottoscritto, allo scopo di evitare gli inconvenienti accennati, continuerà ad adoperarsi affinchè l'impiego del personale dipendente venga contenuto entro i limitati attuali.

Poichè, peraltro, col prolungarsi della permanenza in Sardegna del contingente, aumenta, nelle autorità militari e varie, il desiderio di utilizzarlo, e tenuto, altresì, conto che, con l'inizio della primavera, altra seria minaccia per l'efficienza del contingente stesso è costituita dal pericolo dell'affezione malarica, tornerebbe molto opportuno che i competenti comandi Alleati, aderendo alle insistenti premure dell'Ufficio "R.", determinassero l'immediato trasferimento dei dipendenti reparti in continente.

In atto si nota una discreta disponibilità di incrociatori italiani, i quali vengono adibiti al trasporto di nostre truppe dalla Sardegna nel continente; per cui, se le Autorità Alleate lo disponessero, uno di essi potrebbe effettuare, forse in un solo viaggio, il trasferimento dell'intero contingente."""
