3. Public Safety Sub-Commission A.C.C. have no objection to the above proposal.
4. It is suggested that the first day for the GRANATIERI to take over should be Wednesday Nov 15th and then each subsequent Wednesday thereafter.
5. Timings of take-over and other details will be arranged mutually between R.A.A.C. and Public Safety Sub-Commission.
