I can understand your natural interest in the welfare of an officer who has worked so well, but find myself unable to relax the firm policy of this Headquarters in such matters. In the days of AMG we exerted considerable pressure on the Italian authorities to speed up Epuration, and from time to time Italian officials who were giving us valuable assistance in the field became involved in proceedings.

On no occasion did this Headquarters ever interfere with the process of Epuration, nor can we do so now.

You will remember that I have spoken to you several times about the exceptional services performed in this Province by Lieutenant of Carabinieri CAROPPO Giulio.

In accordance with orders I have not further attempted to intervene in any way with the disposition of his case by the Commanding General, but I am addressing this personal note to you to let you know that it is with very great regret that I have heard Caroppo has been sent away altogether from Carabinieri Service as from 15th July.

Through the Prefetto I have obtained another reasonably good position for him, but his heart and soul are in police work and he is greatly distressed at having been compelled to leave the Carabinieri. It occurs to me that now the amnesty has freed so many political prisoners guilty of much greater offences under the Fascist Regime than merely signing an oath under compulsion to the Republican Government that re-consideration might be given to his case.

I am sorry to bother you with this subject again, but of all the young Carabinieri officers I have worked with during my three years in Italy I look upon Caroppo as the best and I consider his loss to the Carabinieri Service in present circumstances a serious one and a sad blow for the individual who has worked so well under AMG.

If nothing further can be done I shall quite understand, but I should much appreciate it if a recommendation could be put forward to the Commanding General for his case to be reviewed. He is most anxious to pass into effective service and in my view is exceptionally well qualified to do so.
