SUBJECT : Rations for Police.

TO : Provincial Public Safety Officer, Elba.

1. Reference is made to your letter dated ~~2nd~~ September, 1944, which was received to-day.

2. CC.RR are entitled to Italian Army rations. Finance Guards, Public Safety Agents and Forest Guards are entitled to the special scale of rations shown on the attached memoranda.

3. The 53 CC.RR in Elba are included on the ration strength of the Leghorn Legion and are authorised to draw Italian Army rations from the nearest Italian Army centre on the mainland. Any difficulties should be referred to R.P.S.C. Region 3.

4. The other Police agencies will draw the special scale of rations from the local alimentation officer. Food sub-Commission, A.C.C., state that if directives have not already reached the Provincial Commissioner, the enclosed two directives are sufficient authority to authorise the special scale of rations.

SUBJECT: Rations for Police Agents.

TO: Public Safety Division,  
Headquarters, Allied Control Commission, A.P.O. 394. U.S. Army.

1. Upon the occupation of the island of Elba the Supply Officer for the AMG Detachment had a directive laying down the civilian ration of Flour/Bread at 300 grammes per day. This was varied so that normal consumers received 200 grammes and heavy workers 350 grammes per day.

2. The Police Agents of the island were included in this ration and received the supplementary amount. Whilst this was available I was of the opinion that it was inadequate and needed no further supplementing. Now, as and from the 1st of September the ration for all has been reduced to 200 grammes per day, and I am informed that no supplementary ration can be given them.

3. It is well known on the island that the CCR on the mainland are receiving military rations and that other Police Agents are receiving a supplementary allowance. I have therefore received urgent request that the matter be taken up with the appropriate authority to bring conditions on Elba into line with those of the mainland.

4. The following is a list giving numbers of Police Agents on the Islands of Elba and Pianosa.

5. It is requested that information be forwarded as to the policy at present in force in Italy and if the military rations are available, an authorisation be issued in order that these rations may be drawn from some military unit nearby or the mainland eg. Piombino.
