1. Reference previous correspondence, subject and number as quoted, dated 11 Jan. 1946 and 12 Jan 1946, there is attached a copy of the denunciation made by the Questore of Naples against 19 men for participating in the demonstration and other illegal activities on 10 January 1946.

2. It will be observed that several of the men have criminal records and that others are much too young to have been soldiers.

On the 7 January 1946 among the group of unemployed who daily assemble at the Labour Office in Via Duomo 219, it was mentioned that the press had published episodes of violence committed by unemployed ex POWs in Firenze, Roma, Milano and Cetanzero. The most excited unemployed incited also the others to do the same in this city, making them believe, that would be the only way to obtain help for the ex POW on behalf of the Government.

Among those present some individuals, then identified for the e/m CORSINI, MESSINA Salvatore, TIRONI Antonio, PENTINO Vincenzo and BRISSETTII Gaetano nominated themselves members of a so-called Deputation to which was assigned the task to act without going to the representatives of committees legally recognized (Ex PCW Committee) and they started among those present and at the city shops to get a collection together with the e/m FUNZO, CIRIO, SORENTIC Pellegrino, RUSSO Luigi and BOTTAIO Vincenzo, and were able to get 6500 lire, assigned to print 1000 clandestine leaflets at the printing press of CARIDEI Alfonso fu Vincenzo in via Divino Amore N. 11, with which the ex POW and veterans all unemployed were called to assemble on the 10 January 1946 at 0900 hours in the Galleria Principe di Napoli, "for communications of general interest". The following day, 8 January 1946 the same individuals to whom GUADAGNINO Passuale, mentioned in subject, united himself with the same ideas, started personally without any authorization to post on the city walls the leaflets. At 1700 hours of the same day the e/m individuals components of the so-called Deputation got together in the residence of CORSINI where MESSINA brought the order of the day prepared by himself, inciting the unemployed ex POW to commit acts of violence. A speech was prepared to be said during the meeting and seven points were prepared to be said, the Prefect during the manifestation which was to take place in the square below the Government building.

This Political Office which had ascertained the above and identified CIRSLINI Osvaldo, TRONE Antonio, PIZZINO Vincenzo, MULADIGLIO Pasquale, PUNZO Ciro, SORREZZO Pellegrino, RUSSO Luigi, and BONITTO Vincenzo, was able to detain them between the 8 and 10

From the domicile searches besides finding the samples of the leaflets in CORSTI's house also leaflets of the speech and the order of the day were found and seized. The persons detained when questioned admitted what was found out with the investigation.

From the domicile searches besides finding the above samples of the leaflets in CORSINI's house also leaflets of the speech and the order of the day were found and seized.

The persons detained when questioned admitted what was found out with the investigations.

Notwithstanding the measures adopted the morning of the 10 January 1946, in the Galleria Principe di Napoli about 2000 ex POW, veterans and unemployed assembled, MESSINA by means of a megaphone spoke to them, then with BRISSETT they organized the people in a procession which increased on the road with evildoers and good-for-nothings. They all went to the Piazza Plebiscito in front of the Prefettura building. A deputation was formed to which MESSINA, BRISSETT and SPECTALI took part, and they were admitted to speak with the Prefect; meanwhile the crowd already greatly excited tried to enter the building of the Prefecture. They were pushed back by the Police Force, and even after having ordered the dispersement of the demonstrators by means of bugle calls, the crowd attempted again to invade the building, some of the most excited scaled the side

of the building and were able to reach a balcony. Among these the s/m SPECIALE was identified, whom the Police was hardly able to have abstain from committing further violent acts. Others below with a lange pole were trying to break into the big door of the Prefettura until the decided intervention of the Police was able to prevent this serious danger.

After these demonstrators were dispersed, others from the crowd with stones broke window panes from the Prefettura windows and threw them against the Police and the Military Police, they damaged the nose of the firemen who seven out of eight were injured.

Besides SPECIALE among the more excitable the a/m BORGIA Giuseppe, CARACCIOLI Osvaldo, PIORTILLO Giovanni UOCELLO Alfredo and D'URIA Carmine were identified, who, after the demonstrators had been dispersed by the Police, assembled again in the Galleria Umberto I and devastated and looted the wooden stands placed there for the ex POW Fair. There again the Police contacted the demonstrators and was able to arrest BORGIA Giuseppe armed with a club which he was waving against the police, and CARACCIOLI Osvaldo. Also UOCELLO Alfredo was arrested, who was found in possession of a bag stolen from an unidentified person.

Along a street in Piazza Montesanto FIORTILLO Giovanni arrived with the leg of a table was arrested as he was at the head of a gang of scoundrels. Later this Political Office was able to identify and arrest the a/m MESSINA Salvatore, BRISSETTI Gaetano and SPECIALE Vincenzo.

On the evening of the 10 Jan. 1946 in Piazza Bentivego in front of the Office of the Veterans Association the 380 dependent V/Brigadiere PAULINO Rosario and the guard CLINICO Alfredo and GENTILE Antonio noticed an individual, identified later for D'URIA Carmine inciting the haranguers to repeat on the next day the same violent acts. D'uria was arrested the next afternoon, the 11 Jan. 1945.

During the morning of the 11 Jan. 46, notwithstanding order of the Prefect forbidding meetings and assemblies of persons, groups of isolated unemployed ex POW or persons calling themselves such, tried to incite and form a new procession to go to the Prefettura building in order to repeat the acts of the previous day.

The Police quickly intervening dispersed them, and in Piazza Carità V/Commissario AGS. of F.S. Dr. MARTUSCELLI Enrico and the Lt. Of the F.S. Guards Dr. VITALE Lamberto arrested the instigators identified for CLINICO Veroirendo,

Besides SPECTALE among the more excitable the a/m BORGIA Giuseppe, CARACCIOLI Osvaldo, FICRILLO Giovanni UCCELLO Alfredo and D'ANIELA Germine were identified, who, after the demonstrators had been dispersed by the Police, assembled again in the Galleria Umberto I and devastated and looted the wooden stands placed there for the ex POW Fair. There again the Police contacted the demonstrators and were able to arrest BORGIA Giuseppe armed with a club which he was waving against the Police, and CARACCIOLI Osvaldo. Also UCCELLO Alfredo was arrested, who was found in possession of a bag stolen from an unidentified person.

Along a street in Piazza Montessato FICRILLO Giovanni armed with the leg of a table was arrested as he was at the head of a gang of scoundrels. Later this Political Office was able to identify and arrest the a/m MESSINA Salvatore, BRISSETTI Geetano and SPECTALE Vincenzo.

On the evening of the 10 Jan. 1946 in Piazza Dante³⁸ in front of the Office of the Veterans Association the dependent V/Brigadiere PALUMBO Rosario and the guard CINTINO Alfredo and GENTILE Antonio noticed an individual, identified later for D'AURIA Carmine inciting the harsnguers to repeat on the next day the same violent acts. Dr Auria was arrested the next afternoon, the 11 Jan. 1946.

During the morning of the 11 Jan. 46, notwithstanding order of the Prefect forbidding meetings and assemblies of persons, groups of isolated unemployed ex POW or persons calling themselves such, tried to incite and form a new procession to go to the Prefettura building in order to repeat the acts of the previous day.

The Police quickly intervening dispersed them, and in Piazza Carità V/Commissario Agg. of T.S. Dr. MARTUSCETTO Enrico and the Lt. Of the P.S. Guards Dr. VITALE Lamberto arrested the instigators identified for CINTO Ferdinando, BOCCIA Amendo and PINDINELLA Rolando.

I denounce to your Procure the arrested persons for the normal law proceedings according to the crimes committed by each mentioned in subject, I communicate that they are detained in Poggioresale Prison at disposition of your Office, all except UCCELLO Alfredo who is detained in S. Erramo Prison for minors.

I enclose the investigations statements made out by the functionaries Dr. MATAZZE, IACOTTA and TRACE and by the dependent COOs and guards PALUMBO Rosario, TAMARO Ettore, DI PATRIO Costantino, GENTILE Antonio, CINTINO Alfredo, ALFIO Giuseppe, DI CARO Vincenzo, NOVACA Sabino and MESSINA Giuseppe,

the statements of the arrested persons, the arrest reports, and the somicile search reports, the leaflets, the order of the day, the speech, in all 43 documents duly listed and deposited in this Secretary Office, also the samples of the leaflets seized from CENSINI, the bag seized from UCCILLI and the leg of the table seized from FLORILLO.

I add that from these records appears:-

- 1) PRISMI Gennaro detained for security measures in 1940 and repatriated with obligatory travel orders;
- 2) BOTTE Vincenzo sentenced by the Tribunale Militare di Guerra of Taranto dated 21.10.1941 to 6 months imprisonment according to art. 145 n.2 and 147 n. 2 C.P. Militare Guerra;
- 3) BONI Armando sentenced for swindle and denounced for illegal possession and aggravated theft;
- 4) RONDINELLA Rolando denounced to the local Prefatura for walking off the job;
- 5) CALACCOLO Osvaldo in 1945 arrested by the local Military War tribunal for not answering military service call.

Today, at 1030 hours, a deputation of ex POW was received by the Prefect. The meeting, to which also a representative of the Labour Office attended, lasted until 1400 hours.

The following program was established :-

- 1) Dismissal of the women temporary employees at the local public offices and employment of an equivalent number of ex POW.
- 2) Institution of a charity mess of a cooperative shop for the ex POW.
- 3) The Prefect in a few days will go to Rome to decide on the matters with the competent Ministries.

Today the Veterans Association in Piazza Dante will hold another meeting among the leaders of the ex POW.

SUBJECT: Meetings and Demonstrations -

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission
(Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission).

1. Further to telephone conversation (Col. CHAPMAN -
Capt. WILSON) at 1530 hours, 10th January, 1946, there are
transmitted herewith copies of reports received from Questore
and Carabinieri on the demonstration by Italian Prisoners of
War at Naples on 10th January 1946.

2. Prior information of the demonstration had been
received and arrangements were made by Civil Police to deal
with such contingencies as could be foreseen.

3. The Provost Marshal, P.B.S. was also informed
verbally and in writing so that steps could be taken by him
to prevent damage to Allied Property, injury to Allied
personnel and disruption of Military Traffic.

4. Very soon after the demonstration commenced it was
very evident that the Officials at the Prefecture were more
than alarmed and at about 1100 hours the Capo Gabinetto
requested Col. PENNYCICK to arrange for the intervention of
Military Police. This request was not approved and Colonel
PENNYCICK made it clear that the responsibility for maintaining
law and order rested on the Prefect and Questore and that the
Military Police were concerned with safe-guarding Allied Military
property and personnel.

5. In the vicinity of the Prefecture there are several
military installations including a large vehicle park and M.P.s
had been posted in this area. When the demonstration was at
its height the M.P.s assisted in dispersing the crowd from the
vicinity of the car park and thereby considerably eased the
strain thrown on the Civil Police.

2. Prior information of the demonstration had been received and arrangements were made by Civil Police to deal with such contingencies as could be foreseen.

3. The Provost Marshal, P.B.S. was also informed verbally and in writing so that steps could be taken by him to prevent damage to Allied Property, injury to Allied personnel and disruption of Military traffic.

4. Very soon after the demonstration commenced it was very evident that the Officials at the Prefettura were more than alarmed and at about 1100 hours the Capo Gabinetto requested Col. PENNYCULLICK to arrange for the intervention of Military Police. This request was not approved and Colonel PENNYCULLICK made it clear that the responsibility for maintaining law and order rested on the Prefect and Questore and that the Military Police were concerned with safe-guarding Allied Military property and personnel.

5. In the vicinity of the Prefettura there are several Military installations including a large vehicle Park and M.Ps had been posted in this area. When the demonstration was at its height the M.Ps assisted in dispersing the crowd from the vicinity of the car park and thereby considerably eased the strain thrown on the Civil Police.

6. This particular incident is not considered serious but will probably be the forerunner of others unless the position of P.O.Ws is satisfactorily settled.

This morning at about 1030 hours, roughly 300 ex PCNs assembled in Piazza Plebiscito and Piazza Carolina with threatening intentions. About 150 of them pushed their way through a window situated at the first floor, succeeded in entering the building, but they were soon stopped by Police Safety Officers and Carabinieri who had been kept ready for such since early morning, in anticipation of possible disorder. During this police operation a few rifle shots were fired by the Police forces in the Prefettura courtyard within the object of intimidating the demonstrators. Such action induced the mob to give up the idea of forcing the main entrance of the building which was closed.

Representatives of the demonstrators were then received by the Prefect. They protested against the moral and material treatment that ex PCN, war invalids and war veterans have received up to now, and demanded better possibilities of employment and for women to be dismissed from public and private employment. After having invited these representatives to abstain from disorders and to keep calm, the Prefect promised to take up the matter with the central and local authorities so that these problems could be solved; but as made it known that as he had no power for doing so, he could not bring pressure on private firms to dismiss female employees.

After a somewhat heated debate the representatives with the Prefect's approval, decided to assemble at the Teatro Nuovo to make known and explain to the demonstrators the results of the meeting and to proceed with the appointment of a central commission. This meeting started at 1200 hours and was over at 1330 hours without incidents. A.Z.S. Agent, a Carabiniere, a sailor and a civilian were slightly wounded following the disorders which took place when police forces intervened at once to disperse the demonstrators.

Other demonstrations were simultaneously attempted at the S.P.E.A.L and at the Labour Regional Office, where Carabinieri and P.S. Agents were able to prevent further trouble.

Locating attempts also took place at the market of Porta Capuana. Were the prompt intervention of the Carabinieri succeeded in preventing damage and in dispersing the demonstrators.

At 1400 hours the situation was near to normal and completely under C.U.R. and Public Safety control.

A complete report will be forwarded today.

P. QUESTURE DI NAPOLI

TO: U.S. A.O. Public Safety Liaison Office, Naples.

Today at 0930 hours about 2000 ex POWS collected in the Galleria Principe di Napoli di Lissone, where a few among those who remained spoke, proposing that a deputation go to the Prefecture to make their requests known to the Prefect.

They all went towards the Prefecture and while a deputation entered the building to speak with the Prefect, the others, as if they had already planned the action, assaulted the building, throwing stones, and tried to scale the lower floors, at different points. A few of them, the most excited, succeeded in entering without menacing attitude but were stopped by the P.S. agents and Commanderi on duty inside the building.

The Police Force outside the building was, at the same time, actively engaged and after repeated attacks preceded by 38 J.S. prescribed bugle signals, and with the help of the Allied Military Police were able to disperse the demonstrators.

Other demonstrators in the Galleria intent to devastated the stalls of the 'Fiera del Reduc' (Fair of the Ex POWS) (the goods having already been taken away by the sellers), in order to take clubs with the wood. The Police also intervened there, and fired a few shots in order to intimidate them, thus preventing further serious incidents.

Also at the offices of the SEPRAL and Labour in Via Duomo, groups of demonstrators and rascals who intended to commit violent acts were strongly opposed by the Police Forces.

Other groups scattered in the various sections of the City, threatening to invade the shops and stopping the traffic of vehicles and carts and other fittings took place with the Police, who showing great courage, were able to prevent the shedding of blood.

Up to now, 7 Firemen and 2 CO.PP. have been conveyed to the City Hospitals. This Office has detained 16 individuals, three of them charged with inciting and instigating people to commit criminal acts.

Vigilance continues.
