1. With reference to your letter AC/1460//10/PS of the 17th inst. I inform you that by Decree of the provisional Head of the State dated 13th inst., the PS Colonel Sabatino Galli, commander of the police units of the Veneto area, has been promoted for merits of war, major general inspector of the Corps of PS Guards, for high merits acquired during the fight against the nazi-fascists, merits well known by the Supreme Allied Command. The citation on his promotion states:-

"Valiant fighter of the war 1915-18, ⁶⁹³⁴ he is among the first supporters of the fight against the nazi-fascists since 8/9/1943. Imprisoned and deported, after long months, he succeeded in escaping and though widely searched for with a high reward on his head, he immediately took part in the voluntary formations of the Veneto area, first as a plain soldier, then as the commander of the "Montegrappa" zone. Guide and example in numerous successful actions of war and sabotage, he was appointed by vote of the 143 Brigades of the region, regional commander for his recognised qualities of valour, perseverance and sagacity. Co-ordinating hastily the action of the formations, he directed for many months partisan action within the sector of the English 8th Army, maintaining intimate liaison with the Allied forces.

He assumed the responsibility of the insurrection of the partisan forces when the Anglo-Americans had not crossed the PO and directed the action obtaining

such profitable and tangible results, as to provoke the admiration of the Commander of the 8th Army".

2. There is only one post of Inspector General of the Corps of PS Guards and consequently such officer, to fulfil his functions, must be in service at the Ministry.

3. Thus, only due to his promotion as General, Galli is being transferred to the Ministry to assume his new duties.







From investigations made concerning the position of P.S. Brigadiere VITALI Attilio and P.S. Guard MORELLI Giuseppe, the following has been ascertained:

Brigadiere VITALI and Guard MORELLI were attached to the Questura of Littoria (now Latina) and detached to the Ventotene Station HQ, because belonging to the crew of the M.23 Polizia motor launch, assigned to that HQ.

Later, the motor launch and crew, composed of five persons, were transferred to the Island of Ischia, by order of the Governor of the Islands of the Gulf of Naples, Captain J. WHITE.

Later VITALI and MORELLI were attached to the Naval British Base of Ischia. Said Base was functioning until 15 February 1946, on that date the Base was transferred to Malta.

VITALI and MORELLI also after that date remained attached to the British HQ as Agents employed in the vigilance of the Allied materials left in the Port of Ischia. They remained attached to that place until 8 March 1946 under the orders of British Police N.C.O. WILLIAMS.

On 13 March, the a/m Agents were assigned by the R. Questura of Naples to the P.S. Commissariato Marittimo Landing, where they are still attached.





In accordance with Commander-in-Chief's signal timed 201010/Nov., I have the honour to report as follows:-

2. When confronted with each other, Stoker WORRALL and the Italian DIVOLA both believed that the other had given the story away, and a full statement from each was secured. One other rating was implicated, and he also made a statement. These, added to the evidence already in my possession, and the evidence of the printers, built up a strong prima facie case against Worrall and the other rating, Marine Howlett. A circumstantial letter is being prepared, and will be submitted to you with a view to the trial by court martial of these ratings.

3. With regard to the Italians involved, charges have been laid against DIVOLA and the Printers with a view to trial before the Italian courts.

4. I regret to report that the Questura have informed me that DIVOLA has escaped from custody. I informed the Chief of the Questura that I attached the utmost importance to his recapture, and that failure to do so within forty-eight hours would involve a report being made to you.

Anyway, he does not even try to hide his poor financial conditions.

Our opinion is, that because of the fact that the allotments due to his brothers were not sufficient to cope with all the expenses, a/m Vice-Commissary is probably having recourse to illicit expedients in order to provide to the support of his mistress and of himself.

We add that, perhaps owing to his troubles, he is always worried and thus careless in his job: even the A.M.G. P.S. Director expressed his disapproval against aforesaid Official.

Accordingly, this Office asks your Ministry to interfere with the Allied Commission in order to obtain that Vice-Commissary LO FIANO may get dismissed as soon as possible, because his further permanence on service would only discredit the good name of the P.S. Officials."

As this Ministry agrees with the Prefect, we beg to ask your Commission to give disposals in regard of said dismissal and point out that, in accordance with D.L. Lgt. 31.8.1945 Nr. 571 a/m Official should anyway get dismissed as soon as Leghorn shall be restored to the Italian Administration, for he was only temporary kept in service by disposal of the local Allied Provincial Commissary.

Lo Scotto, della quale il Lo Piano è gelosissimo, è di famiglia uilata, niente, non ha mezzi di sussistenza, non esercita alcuna occupazione ed è mantenuta in pieno del funzionario, col quale essa va dicendo, senza alcuna reticenza, che quanto prima si sposerà.

Il Lo Piano per far fronte alle ingenti spese che una simile tresca comporta ed esige, specie in questi difficilissimi momenti, tenuto presente che dal 31 agosto scorso, data del suo licenziamento, non percepisce più alcun assegno, si è fatto cedere da suo padre, commissario di p.s. già in sede a Piombino e testè trasferito a Messina - la delega per riscuotere gli assegni dovuti a due suoi fratelli prigionieri di guerra. In tal modo è potuto venire in possesso di una certa somma, intorno alle 40 mila lire, con la quale ha potuto, soltanto in parte, sopperire alle ingenti spese del mantenimento suo, dell'amante e del figlio di questa.

Solo in parte, come detto, perchè è risultato che si è fatto anche prestare tremila lire da una guardia della sua squadra (alla quale consta che la somma sia stata restituita) e che avrebbe iniziato pratiche verso terzi per ottenere un prestito di alcune migliaia di lire, circostanza que-

ata che non è stata possibile accertare.

Sta il fatto che il Lo Piano si mostra assai preoccupato e non fa mistero delle ristrettezze finanziarie in cui si trova.

A questo punto è opportuno precisare che, dal momento che la somma riscossa dall'inverso degli assegni dovuti ai suoi fratelli non è stata sufficiente per trarlo dalle difficoltà di ordine economico in cui si dibatte, ed egli non ha altri proventi finanziari, si ha motivo di dubitare che per mantenere sé e l'amante possa ricorrere ad illeciti espedienti.

Al quadro poco edificante della moralità del funzionario ausiliario in esame, si aggiunge che questi forse in dipendenza del suo stato d'animo non è più sereno ed equilibrato, non dà più rendimento al servizio della squadra mobile di cui è dirigente, trascurando il disbrigo delle pratiche di ufficio e non adempie più ai suoi doveri con zelo, volontà e disciplina.

A completamento di quanto si aggiunge che il locale capo dell'Ufficio Prov. di p.s. dell'A.M.G. ha mostrato di volersi disinteressare del funzionario in discorso, dell'opera del quale non è più soddisfatto.

Riferito quanto sopra a codesto Ministero questo ufficio esprime il parere a che venga interessata l'A.C. perchè il Lo Piano sia messo senz'altro in libertà in quanto ogni ulteriore sua permanenza qui arrechierebbe disordine ed ombra su tutti gli altri funzionari di p.s. e si resta in attesa delle superiori determinazioni al riguardo."

Convenendo nel parere espresso dal Prefetto si prega codesta Commissione di compiacersi far conoscere se possa farsi luogo al licenziamento del Lo Piano, tenendo presente che, ai sensi del D.I.Lgt. 31.8.1945, n°571, il predetto funzionario dovrebbe essere licenziato allorquando la città di Livorno sarà restituita all'amministrazione del Governo Italiano essendo stato trattenuto in servizio in via del tutto provvisoria, a richiesta di quel Commissario Provinciale Alleato.

Doct. LO PIANO Aurelio was appointed to P.S. Vice Joint Commissary by the former Fascist Republican Government, and destined to Livorno where he started to work on the 8th May 1944.

Shortly after he got assigned to the direction of the CECINA P.S. detachment where from he was removed after the liberation of said Province because of his youth and inexperience.

The Livorno Prefect, on September 1944, asked this Ministry if a/m vice Commissary could eventually remain in service by that Questura.

Although said official is not compromised in any way with the Fascist Government, his dismissal was ordered all the same, according to law in force, which abrogates the appointments granted by the Fascist Republican Government.

Any way, the Livorno Prefect pointed out that the local Questura was in heavy want of personnel: for this reason afore said LO PIANO was allowed to remain in service with the due authorization of the Allied Government.

The service exigencies which caused said provision do not subsist any more; this Ministry thus intends to proceed to the dismissal of a/m, even considering the fact that he never gained any particular merit during his service. Besides he keeps an intimate relation with a married woman, and is consequently not well thought and spoken of.

./.

We beg to ask your Commission for the authorization to proceed to said dismissal, and point out that according to law N.571 issued on the 31st Aug.1945, a/m official should be anyway dismissed when Leghorn shall be restored to the Italian Government's Administration, for he was only temporary kept in service on request on the local Allied Commission
