Towards 18.30 hours of the 17 Jan 45; at Pesaro, in the locality Mirafiore, two individuals still unknown, took advantage of the darkness and suddenly attacked with pointed pistols the CCRR CELLINI Franco and POLENTI Armando of Pesaro Station; there on duty for movement control. As the CCRR promptly reacted the unknown persons fired several pistol shots very close and then ran away in opposed directions. Carab. POLENTI who was severely injured in the belly and right leg fell to the ground; Carab. CELLINI in spite of severe injuries in the belly and left groin, promptly fired two musket shots without hitting the culprits.

The CCRR have been hospitalized at the British Military Hospital 12 C.C.S. Pesaro in very serious condition. The prognosis is reserved. Police operations and services have been immediately effected, with negative result.

Enquiries are being continued with assistance of allied police.

Whilst discussing the various aspects and problems in connection with, supplies, Food Rationing, and Suppression of Black Market, with Colonel W.J. Legg, this day, I mentioned that I thought that the institution of a Reward Fund for Police Agencies might be considered in connection with confiscation of "Contrabbando".

Col. Legg suggested that I forward to you this suggestion.

I think that the fund, could be easily administered, that it should be dispensed to individual officers, or group of officers concerned in meritorious cases of confiscation or sequestration of contraband cargoes.

The fund could be supplied with its source of income through an allocation of a percentage of the value of the food stuffs, confiscated. The value being the agreed value by the Alimentation Office revealing the property on confiscation.

I instance as a case in Reggio Province, Police this month confiscated 17 tons of Olive Oil. I have no doubt, that it will be readily agreed, that if the men concerned in this confiscation, had chosen to be dishonest or corrupt they could have accepted a considerable bribe to overlook this case of contrabbando.

The question of the institution of a Reward Fund may raise the question of weakening morale of the Police System, but I would bring to notice that a system of Commendations and Rewards is still in force in the Metropolitan Police Force, London, and that the Revenue Office grants similar rewards in cash payments to Police Officers who have detected Revenue Offences.
