SUBJECT: Arrest of Colonel Rossi Filipo

TO : Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section

1. With further reference to your communication of 15 Jan 46 (AGO/14759/PB) and reply thereto from AGO, AGC of 31 Jan 1946 (AGO/14759/PB), it has been ascertained that Colonel Rossi was arrested at Salerno on 18 Sept. 43, by No. 35 FSS; and on 22 Sept. 43 was lodged in the Civil Gaoi Salerno. He was subsequently transferred with other internees to No. 372 POW Camp, Saaf ti, where he is now held in custody.
2. Further enquiries in this case were referred to the Counter Espionage section of CGSA, by Capt Balter, 276 PMS, (now removed from Salerno) and Capt. Evans, who is now in charge of this section, has recently consulted Lieut. Gordon (Legal) AG Reg. IJ. with regard to the disposal of the case. This officer is taking up the matter at an early date with the Italian Minister of Justice whom, it is anticipated, a decision will be reached.
3. Translation of a report taken from his files which explains the reason for Rossi's arrest is attached hereto.

Report of Col. Filippo Rossi, C. O., of 15th Inf. Regt. "Savona".

Born in 1886, he is known as a prominent fascist. He has taken part in the "Marchia su Roma" with Mussolini, and has always shown strong fascist sentiments.

According to Braciale Vincenzo, belief in him questionable, the day after the armistice with Italy he has given 6 rules to a certain unit, probably the "Group Danzigerini."

One of his officers with whom I talked, Lt. Correntino Vittorio Emanuele, has admitted that Rossi has never lost the opportunity to show that he was a true fascist, also the same Italian has sworn that Rossi as a civilian is a very dangerous fascist.

Lt. Iocovo of the CGPR has reported that Rossi was very anxious to get news concerning the formation of the puppet government of Mussolini.

I have also been informed today that Col. Rossi while talking with one of his friends said, "It's a shame for me to see English tanks in my command, the same English who have killed my relatives". (I myself asked to see the person with whom the above conversation took place. I hope to meet him in the next day or two).

Rossi, a few minutes later, when stopped in the CGPR Caserma, said to Lt. Iocovo: "Please go to see my officer and tell him to destroy the documents which are in my drawer because they can be dangerous for me."

Lt. Iocovo has reported the above conversation to this office. One search has been made in the colonel's home, and among other papers a diary has been found with the following:

9 Sept.	the Germans resist.

12 Sept.	The Germans resist and the Anglo-Americans lost.

14 "	Same as above with addition, "soldiers run off", (probably referring to Italian troops).

On a Salerno plan (here included) Page 185 it, the territory occupied by our Forces is marked in blue and red.

On a Montecorvino Novella plan (here included), Page 163, 181, the following references Nos. 315102, 325412, and 320408 and plan reference no 330427 are marked in red.

Col. Rossi was also a member of the Commission for the discipline of the Federazione Fascista in Palermo.

According to 2nd Lt. of the CGRR Lazzaro, Rossi was in friendly terms with the Federales, the Vice-Federales, Avv. Fruscione, Chief Inspector Federales Santoro and Avv. Parrillo (both suspects).

In conclusion Rossi has always dedicated his entire time to the P.M.F., therefore he may be the best organizer (if the Fascist Party so decides) to start an underground movement.

In my opinion he is very dangerous.

1. I have interviewed Major Green, PCAPO for Salerno Province; the Lieutenant in charge of CCRR at Salerno; Captain Abbetecola, of the Counter Espionage Section CCRR; and Sgt. Evans, who is in charge of FSS at Salerno, and there is no doubt in my mind that the person described in Col. Pickering's report of 24 Jan. 44 is not identical with the subject of the enquiry from AMG, HQ ACMF (see letter AMG/412/6 of 21 Jan. 44).

2. Colonel Rossi, (born 1886, Commander of 15th Infantry Regt.), was arrested at Salerno on 18th September, 1943, by No. 35 FSS, and on 22 Sept. was lodged in the Civil Gaol at Salerno. He was subsequently transferred with other internees to No. 372 POW Camp at Scafati, where, it is understood, he is still detained (although, from another source, I learned that he is in custody at a POW camp at Padula).

3. The case against Rossi was referred to the Counter Espionage section of the CCRR for further investigation by Captain Rafter, 276 FSS (now removed from Salerno) but Sgt. Evans (who is now in charge) informed me that he recently saw Lt. Barden (Legal) AMG in connection with the case, and this officer is taking up the matter early next week with the Italian Minister of Justice when, it is anticipated, a decision will be arrived at.

1. Colonel DI STEFANO, Antonio, was transferred by this office from Poggioreale Prison to PWG 325, Aversa on 21 December 1943 and has since been moved to PW Camp 371 in Padula, Province of Salerno. It has been recommended that he be tried by an Italian Military courts-martial on charges of collaborating with the German High Command during the period he held the position of liaison officer between the Italian and German armies.

2. There is no record in the files of this office on Colonel ROSSI, Filippo.

With reference to your letter addressed to R.C.A.O., Region II regarding the above named person, I have to inform you as follows:- COLONEL ROSSI FILIPPO was arrested at Salerno on the 18th September 1943, by No 35 Field Security Section and on 22nd September was lodged in the Civil Jail Salerno "for security reasons." He was subsequently transferred with other internees to 372 P.O.W. Camp at Salerno and later to the P.O.W. Camp at PADUA -<sup>15</sup> may reference T/4195, where he/now held in custody.

It is understood that the case against this man was referred by Captain Raftes 276 F.S.S. (who relieved 35 Section) to the Counter-Espionage Section of the Carabinieri Reali, Salerno.

With reference to your letter addressed to R.C.A.O., Region II  
regarding the above named person, I have to inform you as follows:-

COLONEL ROSSI PIATTI was arrested at Salerno on the 16th September 1943, by No 35 Field Security Section and on 22nd September was lodged in the Civil Jail Salerno "for security reasons."

He was subsequently transferred with other internees to 372 P.O.W. Camp at Salerno and later to the P.O.W. Camp at PADUA -

my reference T/4195, where he<sup>16</sup> now held in custody.

It is understood that the case against this man was referred by Captain HAZEL 276 P.S. (who relieved 35 Section) to the Counter-Espionage Section of the Carabinieri Reali, Salerno.

This man was a prominent and energetic Fascist and I am told that there is evidence that, after the Armistice with Italy and during the early days of the invasion, he collaborated with the Germans against the Allies.



Colonel ROSSI Filippo, ex-Commander 15 Inf Regt Depot, stated to have been arrested in Baudino, date not known, and Colonel DI STEFANO Antonio, ex-Liaison Officer 10 Italian Corps and the German Army, stated to have been arrested in Salerno, date not known, are believed to be confined in a Civil Prison in KM Camp.
2. Application has been made for their transfer to an Italian Military Prison and for the particulars of charges against them.
3. There is no record here of them having been arrested by either FISCI or MILITARY. MILITARY had it is thought these arrests may have been made after the FISCI MILITARY had handed over the cities.
4. Will you please have a check made and report all particulars which you may be able to find to this HQ as soon as possible.
