"Considerable public reaction has been aroused by the mass entrance of former members of various Milizias into the Carabinieri.

The following list is of former members of the Milizia Stradale who have recently entered the Carabinieri. To have become a member of the Milizia Stradale a person must have "proven to be of absolute Fascist spirit and to have demonstrated particular Fascist merit."

Pasquale GRAUSO - Former Captain of the Milizia Stradale, now a Captain in the Carabinieri and probably stationed at Bari. GRAUSO joined the PNF in 1937, was chief of the young Fascist of Caserta 1937-8, was decorated with the cross of the Knight of the Crown of Italy, is accused of having after the Armistice rescued from arrest by Allied authorities Renato della VALLE (musketeer of Mussolini, Federal Secretary of Benevento, Vice-Secretary of the Fascist Party). He utilized Nicoala CALCONE, one of his Highway Milizia members who was already known to Della VALLE, to transport della VALLE in a motorcycle or automobile to a city from which he could flee into German-occupied territory.

Giovanni FRANZA - former Capomanipolo in the Milizia Stradale, now a lieutenant of the CCRH of the Sezione Staccata per i Servizio Stradale in Naples.

Paolo Francesco PALMIERI - former Capomanipolo of the Milizia now a lieutenant of the Arma CCRH and adjutant to his Excellency the Commandant General of the CCRH.

Guido RUGGIERI - former Sergeant-Major of the Milizia, now Sergeant-Major in the Carabinieri.

Rodrigo VENTRICE - former Brigadiere of the Milizia Stradale. VENTRICE was paid for the month of January by the Carabinieri of the Sezione Staccata per i Servizio Stradale of Naples and states that he has been told to purchase a Carabinieri uniform. At the present time he is on a fifteen to thirty day leave from the Carabinieri service. VENTRICE has been accused by reliable sources of selling bad contraband liquor to Allied troops. He was a Squadrista.

Enrico INGUSCI, Luigi IAVARONE, Gerardo DE SCORPIO Generoso SPAGNUOLO - all former Brigadiers in the Milizia Stradale who have entered the Carabinieri.

Gaetano CASALE - former Vice-Brigadiere of the Milizia.

Garmino DE CASPANO - former corporal of the Milizia.

Francesco LASKO, Carlo ACIENNO, Giovanni CIANCARELLI, and Nicola CALACONE - all ordinary members of the Milizia Stradale. CALACONE is the person who cooperated with Pasquale GRAUSO in aiding the escape of Renato DELLA VALLE.

ADVICE FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

SUBJECT: Pasquale GRALIO, via Marin del Belice, 32,
Caserta, Province of Naples.

R.E.: Recent entrance in the Carabinieri Organization
with rank of Captain.

Upon instructions from the Officer in Charge this Agent on
25 February 1944 conducted an interview with Captain QUATTROCCHI of
the Caserta Carabinieri regarding statements made by several citizens
of this city to the effect that Subject had recently become a member of
the Carabinieri holding the rank of Captain. Captain QUATTROCCHI in-
formed this Agent that the statements were true, and that to the best of
his knowledge Subject is presently stationed at Bari.

A check of the files of this office reveals that Subject's
name appears on a Caserta "blacklist" (see Note for the Officer in Charge,
Subject: Caserta Blacklist, dated 1 November 1943) with the names of
other persons considered unacceptable for employment in any position with-
er affecting the Allied forces; (2) unacceptable for any Italian military
or civil position; and (3) undesirable associates for all allied military
personnel.

An C.I.A. report, Subject Pasquale GRALIO, submitted to this
office on 15 January 1944 states that Subject joined the FA in 1937, and
was from 1937-38 the chief of the young Fascists of Caserta. He was deco-
rated with the Cross of the Knight of the Crown of Italy. The following
information is cited from this report:

"Uncertain of his position, he remained at his post
to throw himself in with the Badoglio government and to try
and have himself admitted into the military. He now is in the
course of being enrolled in the ranks of the Carabinieri which
has a special band Police. But, while doing that, he has tried
to maintain good connections with the past regime, personally
rescuing DELLA VALLE Renato (born at Luocianello, a suburb of
Caserta), magistrate of Mussolini, Federal Secretary of Benevento,
vice-secretary of the Fascist Party, from arrest ordered by the
Badoglio government after 25 July. He accompanied him in a car
to Terralla dei Lombardi (Avellino) and thus afforded him the
opportunity of reaching Roccarase and Rome.

This DELLA VALLE man and is considered a very ~~dangerous~~ **377**
person.

In summation, GRALIO, who has not completely renounced
political past, has shown himself by his double dealing to be a
