1. It is considered that the case against GARIBALDI Ricciotti is NOT sufficiently strong to justify his internment on purely security grounds.

2. Since the Chief Commissioner had expressed the view that this man should be interned, (ref his letter to BCS(I) dated 22 May and your letter to this Branch dated 1/ May) we referred the case to you in order to confirm whether General MacFarlane did in fact wish us to effect the internment, irrespective of security grounds.

3. As it appears from your letter of 1 June that he has not confirmed this, we propose to take no further action beyond arranging for GARIBALDI to be kept under observation.
