SICILIANS,

Although the feeling of the independence of our land has always been in the hearts of the people, it never was so strong and general as during the year which is going to close. This year will be considered in the history of our Island as that of the revival of the civil and political consciousness of our strong and generous people and of the affirmation of their incoercible wish of freedom and justice.

The Italian Government, the Liberation Committees (which are nothing but assemblies of ambitious and incapable men) and the recognized unity parties are vainly trying to oppose your wish that the Sicilian Country may rise again and make its way towards a better destiny. Mr. Churchill, the great British premier, was right to say that no one of those persons is troubling himself about their not having been elected by anybody and that no one of them can be held responsible by his electors. This is why we do not recognize to them the right of ruling us; this is why we are their deadly foes and will give them no quarter.

The Sicilian Independence Party, which can rely on 600,000 members, is master of the situation and one movement would be enough to smash down the staggering governmental structure. As you know, we have abstained from moving out of respect to the Allies. Our strength is proved by the cowardice of the so-called Authorities, who run away during the recent riots and came back, haughty and slandering, as soon as they realized that there was no further danger.

I wish now to recommend you to keep quiet, as I did on that occasion. Victory is near and we are ready to lay down our lives to gain it. but we must give the Italian Government to commit any further massacre and murder.

~~no occasion~~ The Italian Government is deceiving itself by thinking that they will be once again able to seduce us with their usual and useless promises. Instead, they are unconsciously continuing to dig a moral abyss that nothing will be able to fill up any more.

The Italian unity which has been the cause of all our misfortunes and miseries, is finished for ever. Sicily has broken it irremediably.

To SICILIANS,

1945 will be the year of the shining triumph of the sacred cause to which we have consecrated ourselves. Deserve it! Owing to your productive work, Sicily will have again an honourable place in the world as well as progress and prosperity, which are the symbols of democracy. God wants this.

Hurrah for the Sicilian Independence!

SUBJECT: Separatist Activities - Sicily

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission  
Attention: Public Safety Sub-Commission

1. With respect to possible connection of Separatist movement with recent disorders in Sicily, I do not have definite information but I am forwarding here-with a report on the latest Separatist movements based on: Report from F.S.S. (A) attached, and leaflets (B & C) attached received from the Italian police.

a. The report (A) attached refers to a meeting of the National Committee held on the 15th and 16th of January and the action taken by it.

b. The leaflets (B & C) attached were received by this Headquarters from the Italian police after the receipt of the report from F.S.S., and in general confirm the information contained in the report. The leaflets were placed on the walls in two principal streets of Palermo during the night 21-22 January.

2. This latest information seems to confirm previous persistent rumors that the Separatists would not conform to the present or any Italian government and that they wanted Allied Military Government to return. While it has not been reported that the Separatist movement is definitely identified with recent disorders in Sicily, the leaflets, unless falsified, indicated a hope on the part of the Separatists that general disorder beyond control of the Italian government would further their purpose, whether or not the Allies conceded to any request to consign to them the government of Sicily.

SPECIAL REPORT on the SEPARATIST MOVEMENT.

On the 15/16th inst. the following decisions by the Separatist National Committee were taken at their Headquarters.

The Committee was summoned to examine the general political situation and this meeting was brought about by the fact that, as we have already reported, in the various provinces the local exponents of the Movement have had strong pressure brought to bear on them to cause immediate and violent action. At the meeting of the National Committee more than 40 delegates of all the provinces of the Island participated. After four long laborious and animated sessions, the National Committee decided in view of the attitude adopted by the Allies towards the island, which has been one of agreement with the Italian Government, to send an ultimatum demanding -

- (i) either the handing over of power to the Separatist Movement, or
- (ii) Military re-occupation of the island on the part of the Allies.

To this end a stirring Order of the Day was approved, which is attached with its complete text. In the event of neither of the two proposals being accepted, the National Committee decided that the Movement would seize power with all its forces, proclaiming an independent Republic of Sicily. For this purpose the National Committee gave full powers to an Executive Committee, who should be responsible for organizing. This Committee already started its work on the evening of the 16th January, sending inflammatory communications to all the Provincial sections of the island, to the Separatist Youth League were communicated precise instructions to initiate intense propaganda, particularly writing large Capital with clay, chalk and coal on the tramways, trains and walls everywhere. It was further decided that in the preparatory phase of the struggle against the Flag (by which they mean that all Italian Flags wherever they are flown should be torn down) and disfigured with ink, chalk or coal. One Squad left on the evening of the 16th to carry out operations on the Flag flown outside the Lega Italica.

Text of the ORDER OF THE DAY

The National Committee met in plenary session on the 15th January with the representatives of all the Provinces of the Island. They took into consideration the situation created on the island by the Italian Government by making regulations which did not correspond with public necessity and which acted against the interests of the people, causing outbreaks of indignation which can only please the enemies of Liberty. It considered -

- that the Bonomi Government shows itself more clearly every day to be more violently anti-democratic and reactionary than any Government which has come to power in Italy, and which has determined to deny to the Independence Movement - which identifies itself with the Sicilian people - every liberty in spite of repeated warnings

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- that the Bonomi Government shows itself more clearly every day to be more violently anti-democratic and reactionary than any Government which has come to power in Italy, and which has determined to deny to the Independence Movement - which identifies itself with the Sicilian people - every liberty in spite of repeated warnings of the Chiefs of the Allied Governments concerning the granting of fundamental liberties to the people.

that the Italian Government is determined to support the interests of the Monarchy in war and in peace, the Monarchy which has covered itself with shame.

that the so-called Committee of Liberation, which is without any following in Sicily, supports and encourages the authorities on the island in their liberty destroying conduct, and is striving to maintain their own illegitimate position of dominance.

that the High Commissioner, instead of looking after the well being of the people, occupies himself in gaining support for his political parties and does not try to carry out the work in accordance with the views of the people, with serious injustice to collective needs.

that persecution of the adherents of the Movement has been intensified with decidedly Fascist methods and that the independent Mayors nominated by the Allied Command from among the most worthy elements on the spot have been substituted and that all employees registered with the movement have been dismissed.

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that in Sicily the Italian Police have adopted the most abominable and most inhuman methods of the past regime and have shown the complete incapacity of the Italian Government seriously to help Sicily and to maintain public order, and have done nothing but harm to the Sicilian people who are desirous of being governed by their own men liberally chosen.

that for the island to remain under the inept Italian Government, loathed and despised by the Sicilian people, either at the hand of in local Government, constituted a grave danger for Sicily.

that the pretended promise of autonomy is a new and ignoble swindle of the Italian Government, which the Sicilian people have already rejected, considering that the Italian Government has given and is giving with its incapacity a daily demonstration that Italian unity cannot be maintained and has itself dug a ditch between Sicily and Italy.

that the people is firmly decided to create a new sovereign independent state of Sicily and to confederate eventually with the state or states which will rise in Italy and that this supreme aim will be achieved at the opportune moment at whatever cost.

The National Committee decide -

1. To send heartfelt greetings to the victims of the hatred of the Italian Government and to come to the aid of their families.
2. To appeal to the Allies because of the existence in Sicily of an absolutely intolerable state of affairs, which if allowed to continue, could give rise to a general insurrection.
3. To demand from the Allies the cession of the Government to the National Committee, the only and true representative of the Sicilian people, or failing that the re-occupation of the island on the part of the Allies.
4. To charge the executive committee to take all the necessary steps to carry out the deliberations of the present committee and above all to bring about independence for the Sicilian people, their temporal and spiritual right.

TRANSLATION

To H.E. Prince Bonomi,  
President of the Council of Ministers,  
and for information to the other Commissioner, Allied  
Commission, Rome.

I bring to attention the fact that there do exist  
Sicilians who, despite twenty years of fascism have not  
lost their moral sense or that of the solidarity of the  
human race, cost what it may.

It profoundly grieves me that separation is discussed  
on the political plane and not on that of the penal war code.

Liberty does not in any way mean licence, anarchy or  
consummate egotism or the self-sufficiency of one region or  
zone, but self-control and social understanding and  
collaboration as between men and not beasts.

So-called separation (mefia) is headed by the Bank of  
Sicily together with the landed proprietors, drugs of society,  
by the Sicilian Socialist Federation now absorbed into the  
Socialist Party as well as by the various democratic unions

In several meetings of the leaders, it has been noticed the financial difficulties set by the movement, since no account can be made on the help of rich categories of members, who have already given all what they could.

It was foreseen the issuing of ~~these~~ loan bonds, for sums between 1000 and 5.000 lire.

The idea was favourably accepted, but, as we are told, results are being very small.

Double receipt books ~~should~~ seem to have been printed, bearing the city of TIMBACRI; the detachable part is the bond.

It has not been possible to detect the people who places them and the one who buy them, since everything is done very secretly.

In order to finance the movement, it seems that the provincial committees have organised Sunday lotteries, with small prizes. Each ticket costs 5 lire.

Reference letters 3/GA of 13 JUN 44 and 15/93/GA of 25 JUN 44, with attached documents addressed to the Chief Commissioner and the Allied Control Commission.

1. The Sicilian Separatist movement in the person of FINOCCHIARO APRILE, a Watch List suspect, having inevitably clashed with the Communists at a Separatist meeting held at REGALBUTO (ENNA Province) on 30 MAY 44, protests in the name of free speech and liberty, and enlists A.C.C. support and sympathy against the reactions which Separatist doctrine provokes in the minds of Sicilians who are loyal to ITALY.
2. The late Badoglio government, and the former Minister of the Interior ALDISIO in particular, embarked on a policy to suppress Separatism in SICILY and difficulties were put in the way of holding meetings on the grounds of public security.
3. An application to A.P.B. Naples to publish a weekly newspaper was rejected on the grounds that the movement does not represent a recognized Italian political party.
4. Recent speeches by Finocchiaro Aprile have contained passages inciting farmers not to deliver wheat to the people's granaries and also against the Italian Army and military service. I am informed that the Italian government has been so acquainted.
5. I have informed Finocchiaro Aprile as follows:

(Translation)

With reference to the papers sent me on 19 and 20 JUN regarding the distressing incidents at REGALBUTO, it is contrary to Allied Control Commission policy to intervene in or interfere with the Italian Administration.

The sole concern of the Allied Control

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Commission is that SICILY, as co-belligerent, make the greatest possible contribution to the successful prosecution of the war and that it does not hinder the war effort, which imposes obligations upon all, with inopportune demonstrations, and that the consequences of the war be considered in their ultimate effect on every country.

6. The question is essentially one for the Italian Government to decide upon and in my opinion there is sufficient evidence to take action under the law.

7. If I were asked for a recommendation I should say that in the best interests of the war effort and public security in SICILY, Finocchiaro Aprile's removal to an internment camp, with other members of his group for company, is to be advocated.
