3. Information respecting the families of the two subjects residing in Catanzaro is as follows :

A certain FLORIS Wanda di Alexander and Mole Maria, born at Taranto on 4-1-1918 and married to Mannino Fernando arrived in this City from Palermo in 1935 and resided at the Largo Banca d'Italia No.14 until 1936 when both she and her husband departed for Massa, Tuscany.

A second member of the family FLORIS Enrichetta di Eugenio and Mole Rachelle, born at Naples on the 12-7-1910, a teacher by profession resided in Catanzaro at the Via Principe Umberto 22, between the years 1935 - 9 when she departed to Florence from where it is believed she originated.

4. Nothing in addition to the above is known of the family who, it is reported, whilst residing in this City, conducted themselves in an normal manner. There is no other member of the family now residing in this City.

He transferred in 1939 to the Adriatica Shipping Co., and remained with them until 1941 except for a short period of internment by the French in 1940. On the occupation of Syria by the Allies he fled to Turkey and then to Italy. He returned to Athens as the representative of his old firm the Adriatica Company. His brother believes that he may now be at the family home at ~~Messina~~, Calabria, Italy. Giulio is described as a known fascist, and while he was at Athens corresponded clandestinely with his relations in Beirut.
