1. STARNINI, Oscar. Steps have been taken by the Prefect of Siena to replace this man as Sindaco of Rapolano. He has also been denounced by CC.RR. under the Penal Code, Article 629 for extortion and charged accordingly.
2. There is evidence that much of the money obtained was used by the Patriots to cover the cost of repairs to war damaged cottages occupied by Patriots. £ 50,000 only was obtained as the second 50,000 £ was not intact exacted from Mrs. Camaioli as anticipated.
3. There is no gang of 40 partisans wearing red stars and police armbands in Siena Province.
4. There are a few disorderly elements here as elsewhere but the partisan situation is well under control.
5. The Patriot Officers working in the province state these elements are not partisans, but a few persons operating under the guise of partisans. Patriot Officers are co-operating with CC.RR. with a view to affecting the arrest of these men.
6. There have been no further incidents reported from Rapolano.

TO : A.C.C., ROME

See 2A
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Information has been received to the effect that at the end of last June the communist partisan Oscar Starnini, ordered Mrs. Luisa Camaioli, residing at Via Pantaneto 17, Siena, the owner of land in Rapolano, to give him, within five days, the sum of 100,000 lire.

Because the Signora limited herself to yielding only half of this sum, Starnini, nominating himself in the meantime mayor of Rapolano, exacted the remainder from her.

Mrs. Camaioli now begs the protection of the Police, as she does not intend to yield to such an imposition.

In his capacity as Mayor, Starnini then ordered producers to sell wine at L. 2,50 per Liter.

It is further reported that about forty partisans of Rapolano still go about armed, wearing the red star on their caps, and some, bearing even the police band.

We deem it our duty to report this to the A.C.C., with the assurance that the intervention of the Allied Authorities will, in a short time, bring order and normalcy back to the Commune of Rapolano, too.
