With reference to the attached correspondence, the following information has been obtained in regard to the above-named individual:

1. MANCA, Vladimiro, born Biella, 16/2/24, Law Student, resident at via Cole di Merzi 111, Flat 9.

He was arrested on 30th June, 1944 by S.C.I. (176 F.S.S.) as a post-operative agent of the Sicherheitsdienst. His name having been given by Ernest Bisognio, who described him as a member of Group V of the Sicherheitsdienst. MANCA was described as the head of the Political Section of this group. On interrogation MANCA admitted the following:-

In May 1944 he met Conte Massimo UFFREDUZZI and was introduced to Agostino and other members of Group V. He was informed that UFFREDUZZI was organizing a new Republican Fascist Party under Herman auspices for all Italy and that he - MANCA - should stay behind in Rome as a political agent. His exact orders would be sent to him in due course and he would transmit his reports via a W/T set which would be controlled by Cevaldo SCACCIA. MANCA shortly after made contact with SCACCIA (who was in fact an Allied Agent).

Later on in May MANCA recruited GATTOLA Francesco as another agent to work with him. The night before the Allies entered Rome MANCA went to the office of Group V in the via Antonelli and found that the whole place was in confusion and the furniture being sold.

It is not felt that he would have been a very effective agent even if "Group V" had been able to function as intended; but as the leaders are still in North Italy, and are still trying to make contact with their sympathizers in Rome, it is considered he should be interned for the duration.
