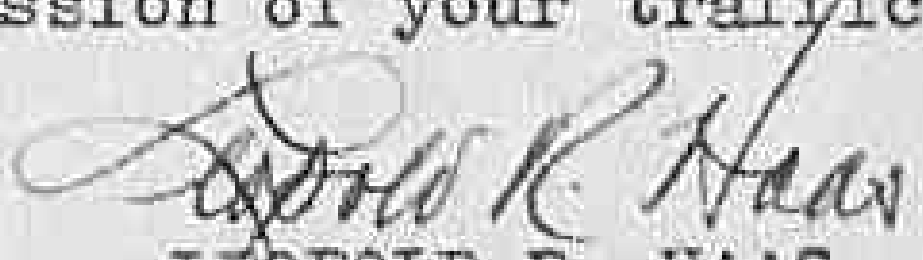
1. Ref letter your Office, GBI.389-506/O, dated 29 August 1946, subject "Non arrival of cables", following information is submitted.

2. Messages referred to in paragraph 2, basic communication, are both of a date beyond which our Message Center does not hold records. Therefore the required information, if affecting our Message Center, cannot be furnished. AFHQ Message Center was likewise contacted by us but messages were also too old to make any check on.

3. It was determined that Berlin traffic is transmitted via radio teletype, a process not at all 100% certain, and quite possible the source of these seeming transmission failures.

4. In view of the frequency of these services, it is recommended that the originator include the following phrase in the text of his message: "Please acknowledge receipt of this message". After a lapse of about three days (or a period of time to be determined by your Office) ~~and~~ required acknowledgement is not received, RAAC Message Center should be notified. In this way, we will be able to take effective action to determine the cause of the difficulty in the transmission of your traffic.

1. In reply to your query, reference GBI.389-506/O, dated 22 August 1946, the following explanation is furnished.

2. Inasmuch as all cables mentioned in your communication are more than one month old, some even five and one-half months, our records are not on hand to investigate said matters.

3. The following has been established:

a. Cables for OMCUS pass through four different transmitting stations before reaching addressee.

b. Cables for BERCOME and USPET through three.

4. In view of paragraph 3, above, the opportunity for errors is thus muchly increased. Both incoming and outgoing logs in the RAAC Message Center are carefully checked each morning by the Officer-in-charge, and any outstanding messages are immediately queried, and the necessary procedure undertaken to clear the logs.

5. It is agreed that errors do occasionally occur.

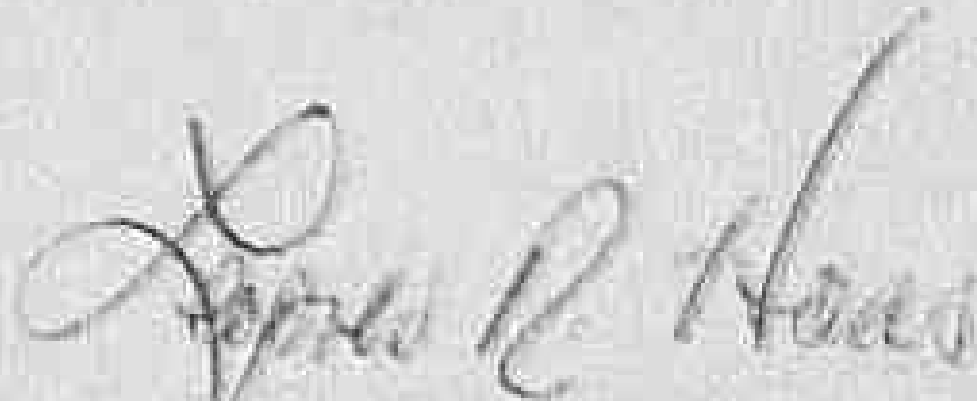

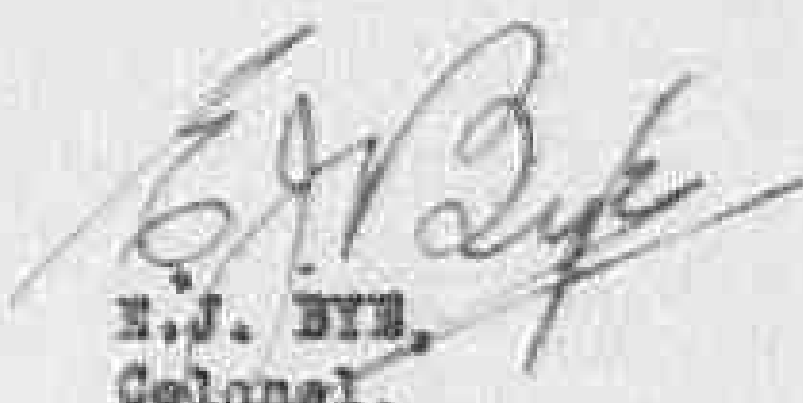

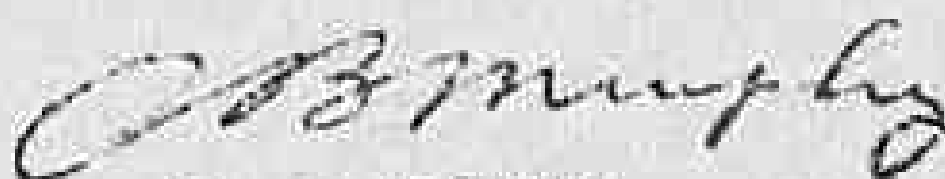

The purpose of these notes, which will appear occasionally and not at fixed intervals, is to serve as a means by which these matters can be brought to their attention.

3. RETURN OF INDIVIDUAL GERMANS TO GERMANY

P.W. & D.P. Division, C.C.G. (B.E.) have announced that they are prepared to accept in the British Zone German refugees formerly resident there who desire repatriation.

They stipulate, however, that individual applications will not be entertained and repatriation must be on an organized basis.

Instructions are being sent to the various Governments concerned through Foreign Office channels that all Germans requiring repatriation should register with the appropriate Department in the country in which they reside for their names to be included as members of repatriation parties.

M.P.O's should advise all applicants in this category accordingly.

4. APPLICATIONS REFUSED ON SECURITY GROUNDS

Instruction No.20 provides that these will be reported to the C.T.S.B. on the 5th and 20th day of each month.

M.P.O's should, of course, report any important case of a refusal on security grounds immediately if he considers it necessary.

5. RED CROSS IDENTITY CARD AFW 3051

This is recognised as a military identity card in the British and U.S. Zones in Germany but not in the French Zone. Accordingly Red Cross personnel in possession of this form travelling in the British and U.S. Zones only do not require Military Entry Permits. However, if they are required to travel into or through the French Zone in Germany they must be in possession of Military Entry Permits.

6. COMMUNICATIONS - Visitors Bureau, USEPT Main.

7. TRAVEL OF BUSINESS MEN FROM EUROPE TO U.S. ZONE OF GERMANY.

Business men wishing to visit the U.S. Zone of Germany must give full details in writing to the Economics Division, CMGUS, APO 742, U.S. Army, c/o appropriate American Embassy/Legation. When applicant can produce a written invitation by that office, an Entry Permit may be issued without reference to the C.T.S.B. The details to include type of transaction; type, amount and location of goods; and manner of payment. This does not affect the existing arrangements for clearance of U.S. nationals.

This supersedes Instruction No. 41.

8. SUBMISSION OF DUPLICATE APPLICATION FORMS.

Military Permit Officers are requested when submitting duplicate application forms at the ends of each fortnightly period to ensure that application forms for permits granted without reference are kept separate from those for permits granted after reference.

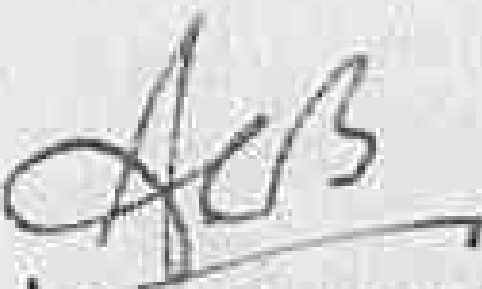

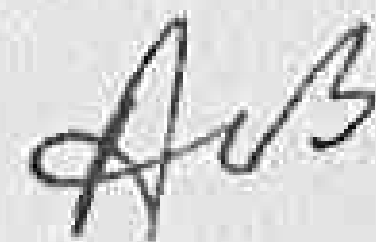

Statement by J/Cdr. M. WILLMOTT 263920 re Driver H. HITCHENS 4613659.

On Thursday, November 30th having been posted for duty with Allied Commission I was driven to Rome by Pte. HITCHENS in a Utility. During the journey I asked him whether he would be returning to Caserta the same or the following day. He replied that he would be staying the night in Rome and returning the next morning about nine o'clock. When asked if that was in order with his company and where he would stay he said it was all right and that there was a transit camp for him. As he was going to the Hotel EDEN to deliver a bird I suggested he should look at the notice-board there to see if anyone was needing a lift back to Caserta since he would be returning alone and this he said he would do.

In Rome he helped me unload all my kit and I dismissed him outside the Hotel Victoria at approximately 1700 hrs.

I have not seen Driver HITCHENS or his car since.

Dear Major Simmons:

Since it is extremely hard to get in touch with you by phone, I thought I would drop you a line in re: my coming to Rome.

When I spoke to over the phone last week in Caserta you agreed to my taking off a couple of days before I come down. Therefore I plan to be gone from the 8th to the 11th inclusive, and following that I'll try to liquidate things up here and be down in Rome about the 13th or 14th. Since I have not been able to do anything so far on the problem of housing, I am in hopes of dedicating a little time to that on my arrival and work that out, and then I can get my house put in order as it were, providing of course that you are in agreement.

In reference to the orders needed when I do come down, I would greatly appreciate it if Chief, CIC- AFHQ were to issue the orders, and be au courant as to my future activities, i.e. if I am to be on DS to G-2, AFHQ, etc. CIC be informed. The reason for this is to avoid a certain unpleasantness that has developed before, as a result of not keeping CIC in the picture completely as they desired.

In the next three days I am going to try to get complete information as to the PS activities all over the frontier, and thus be able within the near future to render a complete account. It goes without saying that even now the PS are doing the bulk of the work since CIC personnel is very critical and not type of replacements possible. I would appreciate being informed in advance if possible the actual date we turn over, and also whether or not we retain an advisory interest in the picture.
