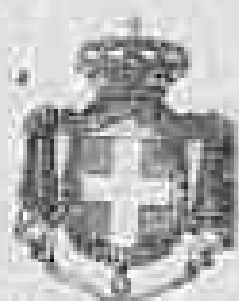

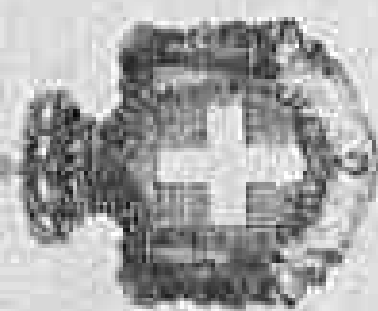

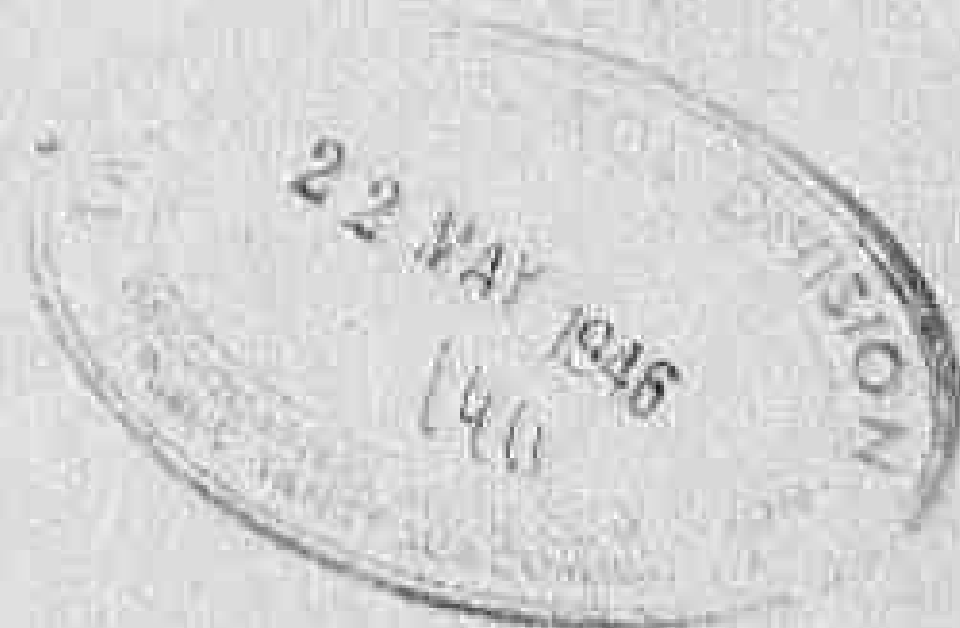

The Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs have agreed to the following temporary visa regulations for British subjects wishing to transit or visit Italy from countries where there is at present no Italian diplomatic or consular representative.

1. No repeat no transit visas required for British subjects in direct repeat direct transit through Italy by air land or sea. Should passengers be delayed by circumstances beyond their control they may obtain at the port of arrival from Italian travel control (PUBBLICA SICUREZZA) a PERMIS DE SEJOUR valid for 24 hours and renewable for further periods of 24 hours as necessary.
2. Visas for British Government officials travelling to Italy on duty will be approved within 24 hours of receipt of application by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The full name, official status and passport number of the official should be telegraphed to this Department. We shall reply quoting Ministry of Foreign Affairs visa authority.
3. Entry visas valid for periods up to two months for British subjects falling under the following categories will be approved within ten days of receipt of the application by the Ministry of the Interior.
 - a. business men whose journey is sponsored by the Commercial Counsellor ROME or by the Commercial Department of British Embassy or Legation or by the appropriate Government Department in the country or colony from which the journey originates.
 - b. journalists ordered to Italy on duty by the paper by which they are employed.
 - c. persons requiring special or urgent medical treatment only obtainable in Italy provided application is supported by medical certificates.
4. Entry visas valid for periods up to six months for British subjects falling under the following categories will be approved within 30 days of receipt of application by the Ministry of the Interior.
 - a. persons visiting Italy to protect patrimonial interests.
 - b. persons visiting Italy on urgent compassionate grounds e.g. death or serious illness of relative domiciled in Italy.
 - c. persons wishing to enter Italy in order to marry an Italian citizen.

5. Applications within the terms of paragraphs 3 and 4 must be submitted in triplicate to this department for onward transmission to Italian authorities concerned. Following particulars are required:-

Full name.

Place and date of birth.

Profession.

Home address.

Date, place of issue and number of passport.

Reason for the journey and name and address of person or firm to be visited.

Approximate length of stay.

Proposed method of travel.

6. The Italian government are unable to extend the foregoing advantages to persons of non-British nationality travelling by British aircraft in direct transit.

7. This telegram superseded all previous telegrams concerning travel to and through Italy but should be read in conjunction with Rome telegram No. 40 to Cairo with regard to difficulties of transiting Italy by land.

8. Please deal with outstanding transit cases in the light of this telegram.

9. Cairo please inform Consular posts in Egypt and copy to Jerusalem also to Addis Ababa, Khartoum, Beirut, Bagdad, Teheran with Rome telegram No. 40.

10. Caserta please pass to British military administration and British military mission Hungary.

Foreign Office please repeat to Algiers, New Delhi, Malta as my telegrams Nos. 4 unnumbered and 11 respectively.

The question of travellers from England to Austria requiring Italian transit visas as well as Allied Force Permits has been raised in London and this office has been requested to ask the Italian Government if they would be willing to allow holders of Allied Force Permits for Austria to transit Italy without having to obtain an Italian transit visa as well.

2. As you are already aware all travel to Austria is very limited at present and permits are only granted to bona fide officials on urgent business for the reconstruction of the country, wives of service personnel and similar restricted categories, and all applications to travel are carefully scrutinized both in London and Austria before permits are issued.

3. It is suggested that persons routed via Italy to Austria should have their permits endorsed "Valid Italy in Transit 8 days after entry only".

4. It is understood that a similar system is already in force for travel to Germany via France and Allied Force Permits are recognised by the French Authorities as valid during the transit journey in lieu of a French visa.

5. It would greatly assist the speedy documentation of travellers on urgent business if the Italian Government also would be willing to recognise Allied Force Permits endorsed as in para 3 above as valid in lieu of a visa for transiting Italy.

6. Your early comments on this proposal would be much appreciated.
