1. Can see no objection to providing jugoslav authorities with specimens of identity cards issued in allied occupied territory. As these are already in possession of civilians their appearance and design is common knowledge and it is to be assumed that jugoslav authorities are already familiar with them. Moreover this HQ is intending to ask the jugoslav authorities for 200 specimens of jugoslav issued identity cards to assist allied road post personnel and police in checking movements.

2. Do not consider that discussions should be opened locally at this stage. Method of control was laid down in APPX H to D U I N O agreement. Prefer therefore to use existing machinery provided by the jugoslav military mission to this HQ.

3. As suggested in this HQ signal I 314 dated 8 Dec recommend jugoslav military mission also performs function of permit office for non residents of Venezia Giulia of Italian and other nationalities wishing to enter jugoslav occupied Venezia Giulia. The establishment of an allied office in say Ljubljana to perform similar function will also be necessary. Consider early decision on these proposals desirable on account of necessity of making full arrangements prior to date when control will be imposed.

4. Recommend that business men be subject to same restrictions as every one else and that they make application for permits as to decisions as every-

1. Can see no objection to providing jugoslav authorities with specimens of identity cards issued in allied occupied territory. 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4. Recommend that business men be subject to same restrictions as everyone else and that they make application for permits as outlined above. Decision as to desirability of their visit will be treated on its merits after general policy has been laid down by you.

5. Consider this whole question should not be confused with situation as regards Italian nationals who wish to enter Jugoslavia and jugoslav nationals who wish to enter Italy. Presume this will be dealt with by Italian and jugoslav governments but would like to be informed of what machinery exists or will be set up and what permits will be valid for travel through this territory.

6. Consider a visit by (BMA) Belgrade to 13 Corps HQ would now be most useful.

QM request approval issue permit to LUIS ALBERTO GULLON. Nationality Spanish. Born MADRID August 15 1915. Passport No. 951 issued at MOSCOW on 20 October 1945. Occupation Journalist. Permit requested for 2 months.

2. GULLON was Secretary to Minister of Finance MADRID, DON ENRICE JRAMOS before the Civil War. Served in Republican Army until 1939 then escaped to FRANCE came to USSR in April 1939. Employed in Radio MOSCOW Spanish Section May 1940 until January 1945. Husband of ADELAIDE PINNA. (My MIL 026 of 18 October refers.) Her application did NOT disclose that she had married a Spanish subject after being divorced from Soviet husband. His wife was working in the Italian section of the Soviet Information Bureau until September 1945.

3. He wishes to go to ITALY to get in touch with his wife's relations (Admiral PINNA) and the Spanish Minister in ROME to investigate possibilities of getting back to SPAIN.
