9. The large increase in the issue of permits for this period is due to two reasons. The first is the Vatican convoy of twenty three persons, who were *all* given individual permits (Your cable CG-3256 September 9 refers); and the second reason is due to the Exhibition which is going on at Prague and for which many people desired transit permits to Prague. As an Austrian visa takes at least two months to obtain the majority of people going to Czechoslovakia go via Switzerland and Germany for which visas and permits can be obtained in a week at the most.

TO : E.G.I.T.O. (ORMOA) ITALY
APO 3. 551, C.M.F.

1. Further to our letter reference GBI.389-506/40 dated 10 September 1946.
2. Further investigation reveals the following on the issue of permits for travel to Germany to Civilian representatives of E.G.I.T.O.
3. Military permit Officers are authorized to issue Military entry permits for Germany and/or Austria without reference to the Allied Military authorities, provided they produce evidence of clearance for the Zone to be entered. In the case of travel to the U.S. Zone of Germany or Austria the clearance will be in form of travel orders issued by the U.S. Military Attache, American Embassy, Brussels, or by authorized Weston Base Section agencies.
4. However transit of Germany is another matter and paragraph 5 of our memorandum of even reference forwarded under cover of our letter GBI.389-506/40 of 10 September 1946 still applies.

SUBJECT : Travel from Italy to Germany.

1. With effect 16 September 1946 applications in respect of all nationals desiring to travel to Germany will be handled by the American and British Embassies in Rome.
2. Applications for the United States zone of Germany will be dealt with by the Military Attache's Office of the American Embassy, and for the British zone by the Travel section of the Visa Department of the British Embassy; applications for the French zone of Germany, as in the past, will be dealt with by the Commandement Militaire Francaise, (Securite Militaire) at Palazzo Guidoni, Rome. However, if a person desires to visit the United States zone, or the British and French zones, the American or British Embassy will make application for the French zone clearance at the same time as they refer the case to their respective zone clearance.
3. It is the policy of the occupying powers to restrict travel into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel to Germany are specifically not permitted at the present time.
 - (a) Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the body or visit the grave of a relative killed in Germany.
(Visits by French nationals to graves in the French zone are now allowed by the French authorities.)
 - (b) Travel to repossess or locate property looted by the Germans.
(Reparations, restitution of Delivered Sections of the French, British and United States Control Commissions have been established to arrange for the restitution and location of property looted by the Germans. The work of these sections cannot be accomplished if individuals are allowed to enter Germany to locate and remove such property on their own account. All necessary descriptive detail should be forwarded by the Government concerned to the Reparations, Restitutions and Deliveries Section of the Control Commission Council of the zone concerned.)
 - (c) Travel to Germany of businessmen, except those travelling under a scheme of sponsorship arranged by the Government of the occupying powers of the zone to which they are proceeding. (The policy to be adapted with regard to private trading is still under review, and, pending a decision, journeys of this nature cannot be approved.)
4. All other applications, other than Allied Military personnel travelling on duty, should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and in the cases of approval the necessary Military entry permit will be issued.
5. The categories of travel for transiting Germany are of a far more lenient nature, though transit of Germany is only allowed for essential journeys and when petrol, oil, lubricants, transport, food or accommodation requirements are desired in Germany; in all cases the valid passport or visa for the country of destination is also required before an application can be considered.

6. Here again all applications complying with the above requirements should be forwarded to the respective Embassy for decision; and the issue of a Military entry permit for the approved cases.
7. The above is passed for information, and attention is drawn to the necessity of all applicants being in possession of passports validated for travel in Germany.

SUBJECT : Travel from Italy to Germany.

TO : The Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

1. Reference your letter 6/2680/1128 dated 10 August.
2. Your attention is drawn to the fact that neither this Headquarters, nor any other Military Headquarters in Italy, have any control over the categories of persons permitted to enter Austria or Germany.
3. As was outlined in our letter of even reference dated 29 July 1946, the question of travel to Austria should be taken up with the Austrian Political representative in Rome.
4. And in the case of travel to Germany, the Allied Military authorities in that country will not permit, under their existing regulations, travel to Germany for private or personal reasons; neither will they consider at the present time repatriation from Italy of German nationals (non-conscious or otherwise) nor other nationals normally resident in Germany.
5. However Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission of this Headquarters have been approached by this office with a view to them making representation to the Allied Military authorities in Germany over this question of repatriation and they have advised to keep you informed of the final decision.

2. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs begs to call the attention of the Allied Commission upon the very serious situation in which are incurring the above mentioned Italian citizens on account of such a decision of the Allied Commission.

SUBJECT: Travel to Germany.

TO: Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

1. This office is receiving an ever increasing quantity of applications from persons desiring to return to Germany; many of these applications, both from German nationals, and nationals who were normally resident in Germany, can be considered compassionate cases.

2. However, under the travel control regulations laid down by the Combined Travel Security Board in Berlin, travel to Germany for private or personal reasons is not allowed, and in the case of repatriation of an individual, the reply to one of our cables was, that there was no repatriation to Germany of German (non-chaugions or otherwise) or other nationals normally resident in Germany, at the present time.

3. Therefore all applicants of these categories are advised accordingly, but it is never possible to give any indication when these strict regulations may be relaxed.

4. This however raises the impossible problem of such Germans in Italy, whose permesso di soggiorno the Italians refuse to revalidate. They are unable to return to their countries of origin and in consequence render themselves liable to the death with an undesirable alien.

5. It is therefore felt that the time is long past for some action to be taken on this matter and representation made to the Combined Registration Executive in Berlin, or other appropriate agency to clear up this question, particularly as regards German nationals. In this respect it is pointed out that at the present time they contribute through no wish of their own to the unsatisfactory large quantity of aliens already in Italy.

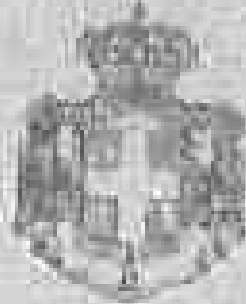

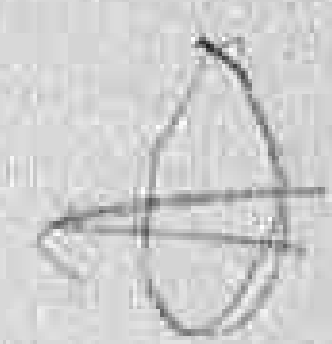

1. The Italian Liaison Section to the Headquarters of the United States in Europe, at Frankfurt, has requested that following be transmitted to the Cabinet of Italian War Ministry:

"N. 3475. Combined Travel Security Board concerned for issuing passes to leave Germany represents expedience of clearing travel to Italy for foreign citizens for the purpose of speeding procedure. Understand the Allied Commission in Rome agrees on this matter. Please inform urgently said Ministry for necessary instructions to cable to this section. Signed Colonel Bruno, Chief Italian Liaison Section."

2. As your Ministries are aware, this Commission has approved the procedure whereby all applications for persons other than American and British Service personnel to travel to Italy should be referred to your liaison officials at Frankfurt who could have certain discretionary powers to refuse or grant the necessary authority to enter Italy or forward the case to the Italian Government for their consideration; they would then give the necessary Italian Government's endorsement for the permit authorising entry into Italy. This procedure has been approved by the Allied Authorities in Germany in principle though the final concurrence has still to be given.

3. It is understood that Major Arno who is going to Germany to undertake this work has already been given the discretionary powers quoted above and it is therefore desired that this be confirmed. It would be appreciated if a copy of them could also be forwarded this office.

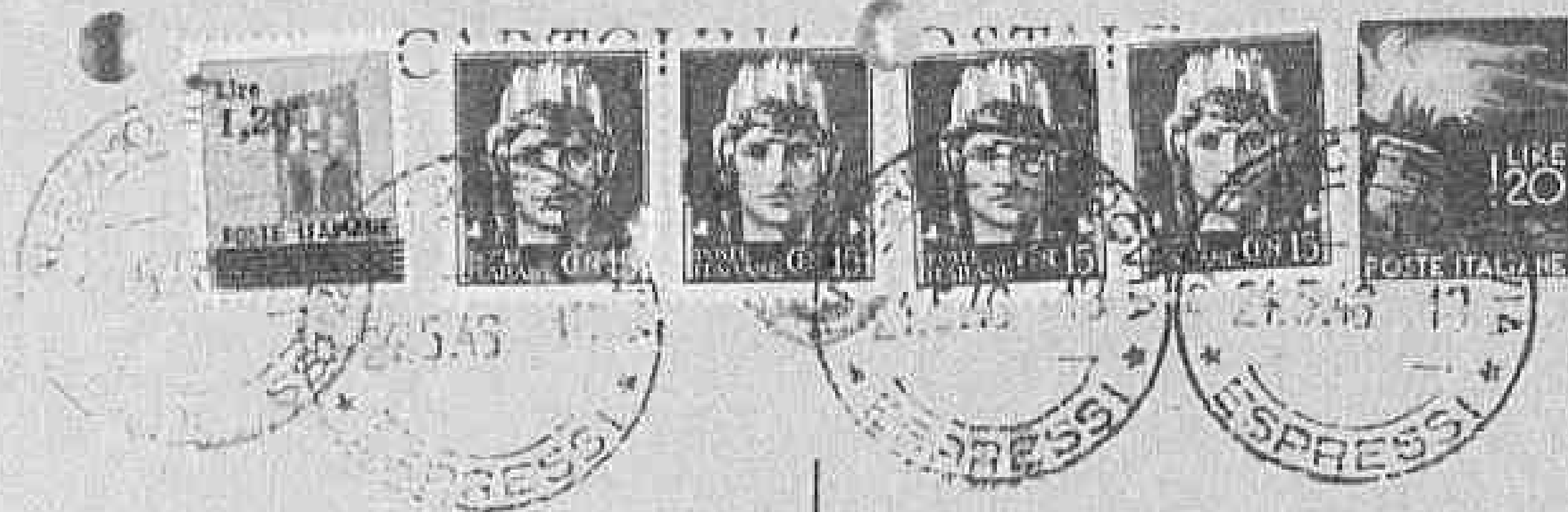

1. A further cable was sent the Combined Travel Security Board in Berlin reference the attaching to USFET in Frankfurt of Italian officials who would approve or disapprove applications for people desiring to enter Italy; A.F.H.Q. was on the distribution of this cable which was Number 3021 May 13, 1946.

2. And as regards Austria, we were informed by Colonel Hasbren of OSI(b) ACABRIT, yesterday, that the Allied Commission in Austria have approved the interchange of recognised representatives between Italy and Austria and that it should only be a matter of days before these representatives who are already in Vienna and Rome get their official status. As soon as this comes about all applicants who desire to travel to Austria will be referred to the Austrian Legation.

3. Meanwhile we still have approximately 350/400 applications still outstanding with the Italian Government for entry into Italy from countries where our MPOs were acting as travel agencies for Italy, but it is not thought that it will be long before these are finally cleared.

1. The following is a copy of instruction No. 11 from the directive issued by the Combined Travel Security Board Office of Military Government Germany regarding travel to Germany to locate looted property.

INSTRUCTION No. 11

SUBJECT : Travel not at present permitted.

1. It is the policy of the occupying powers to restrict travel into and out of Germany to the minimum. The following categories of travel are specifically not permitted at the present time:-

- a) Travel for private reasons, including travel to bring back the body or visit the grave of a relative killed in Germany.
- b) Travel to re-possess or locate property looted by the Germans. (Reparations, Restitutions and Deliveries Sections of the French, British and U.S. Control Commissions have been established to arrange for the restitution and location of property looted by the Germans. The work of these Sections cannot be accomplished if individuals are allowed to enter Germany to locate and remove such property on their own account. All necessary descriptive

detail should be forwarded by the Government concerned to the Reparations, Restitutions and Deliveries Section of the Control Commission/Council of the zone concerned).

- c) Travel to Germany of business men. (The policy to be adopted with regard to private trading is still under review and, pending a decision journeys of this nature cannot be approved.)

2. Additional categories will be added from time to time.

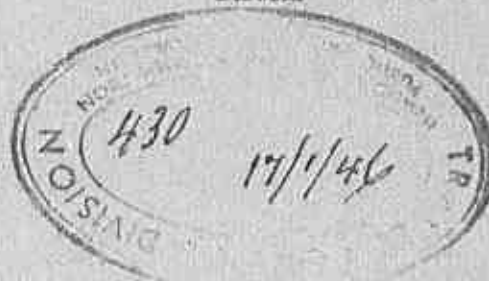

1. Reference your letter no. 300/53753-19-7 of 29 November 1945.

2. This Commission is gratified to learn that your Ministry is in agreement with the proposals under discussion for control of travel into Austria and Germany.

3. It is agreed that limitation of such travel is vital under present circumstances and the Allied Commands in Austria and Germany have decreed that only the following categories can be authorized:-

Entry into Austria:

- a) Journeys for urgent compassionate reasons after the facts have been verified by the authorities in Austria.
- b) Official commercial or industrial journeys likely to be of benefit to the Allied Administration or rehabilitation of Austria.
- c) Travel for personal reasons is not permitted.

Entry into Germany:

- a) Persons called forward by any one of the occupying powers.
- b) Repatriation or expatriation of Italian subjects can only be carried out under the auspices of Displaced Persons.
- c) No travel for compassionate business or personal reasons is permitted.

4. The cases you cite which you propose to take into consideration would appear to be covered by the categories permitted into Austria but not into Germany.

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5. It is noted that you specify Italian nationality in each case but it is assumed that you propose also to accept applications from other nationalities. Will you please confirm this.

6. A circular covering this procedure is now in preparation at AFHQ and will be submitted to you shortly.
