2. Liaison have sent the following reply, to which, "A" Branch agrees:

" 1. It is regrettable that there has been a delay of six weeks between the original request being made and its receipt in this HQ.

2. It is obvious that nothing can be done to reunite this family in Italy before 2 Polish Corps leaves for UK. In any case, there are more than 5,000 Polish nationals in Africa and plans are well-advanced for the transportation to UK of dependents of Polish Corps personnel.

3. We recommend that a reply be sent to Allied Commission on the lines of the remarks in para 2 above."

3. A-1 Branch and G-2 concur with the suggestion in para 3 of Liaison reply.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: MAMDELAS Gregorio - Repatriation from South Rhodesia.

1. Gregorio MAMDELAS, son of the late Anastasio, born in Bari on July 25th, 1945, is a civilian internee (N.17241) of Camp 3, South Rhodesia.

2. His wife, who resides in Rome, Via Intezia 8, has recently received several letters which clearly indicate that his mental conditions must be unbalanced.

3. In said letters Gregorio MAMDELAS voices his anxiety concerning the business interests which he left unattended in Addis Ababa, where he was captured over four years ago, but he expressed the hope to be assisted in the future by his father and his uncle.

4. Since both the father and the uncle have been dead for many years, it is feared that the otherwise unexplainable alienation may be due to a loss of memory or incipient insanity, possibly caused by the serious kidney illness by which a/m is known to be afflicted.

5. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs should be grateful to the Allied Commissions if they would ask the competent authorities to kindly ascertain the present mental and health conditions of signor MAMDELAS, recommending an immediate repatriation should same be warranted by the circumstances.

6. The travelling expenses would be paid by the wife of Gregorio MAMDELAS.

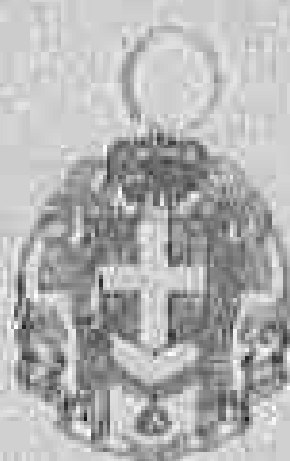

342771 Warrant Officer L.J. PEACH (MED) - RAF

1. The above named Warrant Officer has been locally released from the Royal Air Force and is now employed by ISLD as a civilian in ROME. As he is now an established member of ISLD that department is now responsible for arranging his transfer as required, and for eventual repatriation.
2. On 5th January, 1944, his mother and daughter, whose particulars you know, were compulsorily evacuated by the RAF from Jerusalem to South Africa and as he has been locally released we desire them to be transferred to Rome to join him. The RAF have agreed to transport them to Italy, as their final obligation to the family, provided we (ISLD) obtain authority for them to land in Italy and accept responsibility for their accommodation, transfer or repatriation as necessary thereafter. As we have undertaken these responsibilities, HQ, RAF, MEDIC have asked AMQ Italy (Movements) to arrange the necessary passage, but we understand that formal permission to land in Italy is required before the family can move.
3. Accordingly, we wrote to G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ, asking what permits were necessary. In reply, one of our officers was informed verbally that control of entry into Italy was being handed over to the Italian Government on 15th November, 1945, and that no more AFHQ permits were therefore being issued. An Italian visa was now necessary.
4. We have ascertained from a member of the Italian Foreign Office that there is no Italian diplomatic representative in South Africa. Consequently we have reached an impasse unless some special arrangement is made. It is therefore requested that G-2(CI), as a special case, will issue provisional authority to land in Italy, after which ISLD will complete the necessary formalities with the Italian Government.
5. The above summary of the case, most of which is known to you, is to give all addressees a clear picture of what has been done, so that the final step (permit to land) can be broadcast to all concerned and the

With this end in view, it is suggested that S-2(CI) Section (if they agree) issue the provisional permit to land direct to HQ, RAF, MEDAE, with copies to AMO Italy (Movements) and to this Unit. HQ, RAF, MEDAE can then, if they wish, inform the RAF Families Office in South Africa that permit for the family to land in Italy has been given, and the actual move could then be covered by their passport and a suitable document provided by the RAF Families Office. The ISLD copy of the authorisation could be used when the family is met at the port or airport in Italy concerned.

6. It is regretted that passport particulars of Mr PEACH's family, or suitable photographs for documents, are not held here and any attempt to get them from South Africa would only result in further delay. We suggest, however, that their identity will be sufficiently established during their journey by their passport and the document issued by the RAF Families Office.

7. We would be most grateful if you could assist us to complete this transfer at the earliest possible moment. RAF allowances to his family cease on 6th January, 1946, when his Release Leave period expires and the task of maintaining a homeless family at such a distance would then be of considerable embarrassment to him. He has no home in the UK. Moreover, Mr PEACH is employed as our Paymaster in Rome, and from an official point of view we prefer that his family should join him here rather than lose his services whilst he takes the long leave to South Africa or elsewhere which we could not, in common fairness, otherwise deny him. He has been separated from his family for nearly five years.

8. Relevant correspondence is quoted hereunder for convenience:

- a) Letter 112/91 of 11 Oct 45 addressed S/Ldr Swerwick, HQ RAF MEDAE, Caserta, from ISLD, asking for passage to be arranged for family.
- b) Letter MEDAE/2051/1/5/P1(2) of 25 Oct 45 addressed AMO Italy (Movements), copy ISLD, giving details of family, stating there is no objection to move of family at public expense, and asking them to make necessary arrangements.
- c) Letter 112/94 of 2 Nov 45 addressed S-2(CI) Section, AFHQ, from ISLD, giving details of family and asking what documents are required for family. Verbal reply is mentioned in para 3 above.
