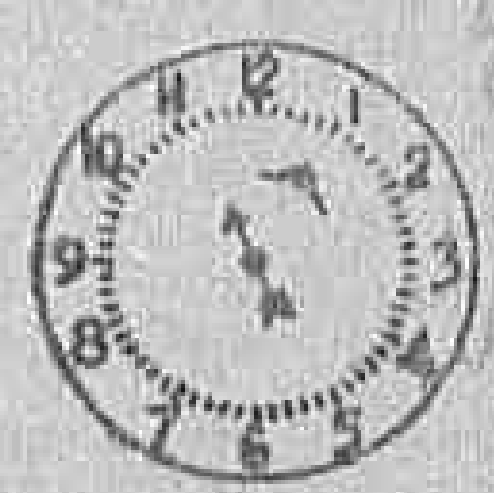

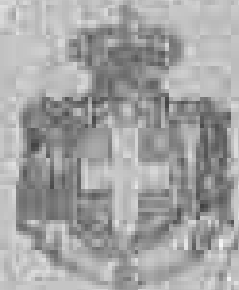

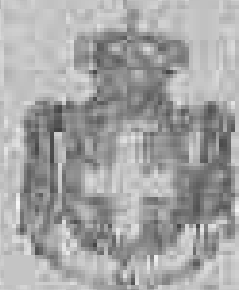

Dear Sir,

In reference to my letter of January the 5th 1946, concerning His Grace the Archbishop of Smila, I have today had a letter from the Archbishop, Most Reverend Dr. Sylvester Mulligan, O.F.M. Cap. from cathedral House, New Delhi, India, giving the approximate date when he would like to be able to report at the Vatican. He says:-

" I intend to pay my quinquennial Visit to the Holy Father this coming Spring and report on my Mission in India. I would like to leave about the end of February or the beginning of March 1946. There is just one difficulty in the way; it seems I must first have the permission of the Commander of the Allied Forces in Italy to visit Rome. The Government of India assure me that if I get that permission they will facilitate me in every other way. It seems the procedure is to secure the permission which will be cabled to the External Affairs Department of the Government of India, and, that once had, the rest will be done by them".

May I add that when the permission is granted I should be most grateful if the Allied Commission would kindly cable it to the Department of External Affairs of the Government of India?

 who also has his own business in the

Hence if we can get back my wife can take up her business again from where she left off, on the other hand feel sure of employment.

My wife and myself apart from her family are financially strong enough to keep going for over a year even in the case of no employment.

As it will be noticed that I have everything in my favour and my only problem is getting back, I therefore will be much obliged if you would do your best to help me.
