The following information has been received from Eritrea
 concerning the above named. It is regretted that details are not
 available as to the present whereabouts of the various witnesses
 mentioned in the report.

1. A report dated 1 Oct 44 states as follows:

"An associate of RATTO, Amadeo Fioravante BENEDETTO, who
 was known to have been at the scene of the murder, said that
 LATILLA was killed by RATTO and SIGILLO. They fired at LATILLA
 over the top of a Balilla car. The crime had been planned in the
 house of Tullio PASSI, and there were present RATTO, FANTAPIE,
 SIGILLO, Dr. FERRO, BERSANI and others whose names escaped him.

It was so arranged that whereas RATTO and SIGILLO would
 actually have killed LATILLA, the organisation would bring before
 the police FILIPONI as the substitute killer with the job of
 clearing RATTO and SIGILLO should they be arrested. This is in
 fact what happened.

At the moment they were taken into arrest FILIPONI came
 forward, was arrested, and RATTO and SIGILLO were let free.

At the same time it was agreed in Karen at PASSI's house
 that once FILIPONI was arrested they would facilitate his escape
 in agreement with FORMICA and BRANCATO, prison officials, and
 therefore while Brig BRANCATO was taking FILIPONI to the tribunal
 for the last hearing, they fled together and went under the

protection of the RATTO-ALOISI group.

In December 1942 certain rumours went around that the Liberals of Asmara wished the LATILLA case reviewed. Fearing that FILIPONI would be recaptured and might tell the truth, it was decided to have him taken into Ethiopia with the idea of killing him. In the same month of December SIGILLO made a journey into Ethiopia accompanying FILIPONI, who seems to have been killed in the vicinity of MACALLA, and SIGILLO came back on his own to Asmara about a month afterwards via DJIBOUTI".

This account was told by BENEDETTO in the presence of Dr. CESARIO, Dr. VALLESE, ROSSI Ferdinando, FERRARI Luigi and Lt. PACE Paolo.

2. A former Lieutenant of the P.A.I., Angelo MICHELUGGI, once a fervent Fascist, when under interrogation by Lieut. Ward on the 13 Oct 1944, stated that he thought RATTO was responsible for the death of LATILLA. In fact investigations made by MICHELUGGI led to the arrest of RATTO and SIGILLO. However on instructions received from Capt. KRICH and Major SETTON, the Police, both British and Italian, were told not to take further action in this case. It has been noted that MICHELUGGI's enmity with RATTO was personal.

3. A statement, conflicting with the above accounts, was made on the 13 June 1944, by Settimo BONAVIRI, a noted anti-Fascist. He said that Francesco TALLARICO was driving the car when FILIPONI killed LATILLA. He was taken to DECAMERE by CARNEVALE who put him under the care of the BASSO brothers in SWITZERLAND. At the time of the murder, RATTO, BENEDETTO and SIGILLO were waiting on the one side of the fork in the road while a certain LAFAGE and others were waiting on the other side. This was confirmed during the journey on the train by TALLARICO himself. (Note: BONAVIRI was brought back from Erba after having lived in the same compound as RATTO and after having made the journey to Erba in the same compartment). He also states that someone killed FILIPONI and received 75 lire for it. This person is now in Italy.

4. Arcangelo SIGILLO, under interrogation stated that "the day after the murder (22 Sept 1942) he had visited FILIPONI and had asked him how he had killed LATILLA. FILIPONI replied that he had shadowed LATILLA for two days, and then when he saw that he always came home at the same time in the evening, he had decided to commit the murder.

In the evening, a little before LATILLA was due to get home, he broke with a stone the lamp near the ECCE building and then came back and hid under the kiosk. He waited there a bit and, when he saw it was time for LATILLA to come past, he loaded a pistol. A little later he heard a car, looked, saw it

was LATILLA's and took advantage of the car having to slow down and change gear. When this happened FILIPONI jumped on the running board, grabbed hold of the car with his left hand, said "AVV LATILLA this is the only way of getting even with you", and fired. He then went home.


A day or so afterwards RATTO and SIGILLO betrayed FILIPONI to Capt REICH and other officers. They told him that they would get him safely away from Asmara. As they were leaving, the car was stopped at a level crossing, as had been arranged between RATTO, SIGILLO, and Capt REICH, and FILIPONI was arrested.

According to SIGILLO, FILIPONI at first accused RATTO and SIGILLO, but later withdrew his accusation. As stated previously he escaped and was presumably murdered.

In the opinion of one interrogator, either FILIPONI was definitely unbalanced mentally, for no-one would behave in the extraordinary way described by SIGILLO, of first stating his intention of committing, and then later confessing to a murder of which he was not guilty, or else SIGILLO was lying in his statement, which seems far more probable.

5. In view of the confused statements of evidence, and of the difficulty of tracing witnesses, it is the opinion of this Headquarters, that this case should be considered closed. Before RATTO's repatriation to Italy, it was stated by the authorities in ERITREA that they were opposed to his return to that country. It is suggested that RATTO be released on parole pending confirmation from the authorities in ERITREA that they wish to take no further action against him. We have written to request that confirmation.





1. The Chief Commissioner has received through the Lieutenant General of the Realm an urgent request from Her Majesty the Queen of Italy for permission to send back to Frankfurt, Germany, Prince Enrico von Hesse (minor aged 18) who has been undergoing special surgical and medical treatment since his arrival in Italy on April 1st. This treatment has now been completed and it is desired that the Prince be returned to what remains of his family in Germany.

2. Prince Enrico is the son of the late Princess Mafalda who lost her life in a German concentration camp. Due to the present crisis which hangs over the Italian royal family, the authorities believe that the Prince should be moved back to Germany on or about 14 May. To reduce to an absolute minimum the political hazards that threaten the members of the Royal Family, the Chief Commissioner desires that his Staff Officer, Lt Col L. W. Stearns, personally accompany the Prince to Frankfurt and that this trip be made by air in as inconspicuous a manner as possible.

3. Accordingly, it is requested that clearances be obtained as soon as possible so that this journey can be undertaken. It is estimated that the over-all trip (including the delivery of the Prince in Germany and return of Lt Col Stearns to Rome) should not take more than a maximum of three to four days.





1. With the withdrawal of Allied troops from ITALY the responsibility for the control of the Italian frontier becomes a matter which directly concerns the Italian Government.

enter and search the premises and inspect the records of civilian organisations
from which at times are suspected of aiding and organising illegal movement.
This to include D.P. Camps with notice having first informed the Camp Commander.
4. The Italian Government should supply guards to take over
illegal entrants and escort them to guarded camps until such time as they can
be returned under escort to the country from whence they came.
5. The scale of rations for illegal entrants should be the
Italian refugee scale and such future illegal entrants should not be accorded
the status of Displaced Persons or Stateless Persons.
6. Immediate action should be taken to encourage the Italian
Government in the registration of all aliens in ITALY inside and outside
camps. This registration would assist in restricting the very large
unauthorised movement of aliens throughout ITALY.
7. These aliens who commit and are sentenced for offences
against Italian law should be liable to forcible repatriation by the Italian
authorities to their country of origin.
8. This forcible repatriation to be subject for the present
to an Allied Reviewing Authority, limited to those cases wherein by the Armistice
Treaty or other commitment, the Allies stand pledged against deportation
by force.

2. IT IS CLEAR THAT JUGOSLAVS DO NOT INTEND TO ISSUE IDENTITY CARDS BY 15 FEBRUARY NOR IS IT NOW PHYSICALLY POSSIBLE FOR THEM TO DO SO. IF WE IMPOSE CONTROL ON MORGAN LINE BASED ON IDENTITY CARDS ON 15 FEBRUARY THERE WILL RESULT SOME DISLOCATION OF NORMAL LIFE AS WORKERS IN RAILWAYS DOCKS ETC AND TRAFFIC IN WOOD AND OTHER COMMODITIES COMING INTO TRIESTE FROM ZONE B ARE LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED. THIS WOULD BE TURNED BY JUGOSLAVS TO PROPAGANDA ENDS AND POINTED TO AS AN ATTEMPT BY US TO RESTRICT CIVILIAN ACCESS TO ZONE A WHILE FOREIGN SECRETARIES DELEGATES ARE HERE. 



1. Regarding your GBI 389-506/18-E-8 of 9 January 1946, Subject same as above, this officer investigated the Yugoslav Welfare Society, Milan.

2. The Yugoslav Welfare Society is not officially recognized by No. 2 District.

3. The Milan branch is under the leadership of Lt. Col. Borivaje RADENKOVIC, a former member of the Central Committee of National Liberation and officer of the Royal Yugoslav Army. His secretary is Lt. SAVIN. The organization's office is located on Via CASTEL MORONE #11, second floor.

4. The central office is located in Rome, Via Angelo Secchi 19, fifth floor, telephone 878-077. The president is NIKO KREK, a Slovene from Lubiana. Dr. Zivko TOJALCOVIC is the general secretary.

5. The society is an organization composed of Royal Yugoslav refugees, both military and civilian. Its purpose is to aid people in the u/n category. The organization has no funds and is actually existing in name only.

6. Lt. Col. Nick Stepanovich, Asst. AC of S, G-2(CI) knew of the existence of the organization and members of the Society are well known to him.

7. This officer is personally acquainted with several members of the organization who have on several occasions provided him with information on the clandestine OZNA organization and the activities of members of the Yugoslav Republic in Northern Italy.

8. Lt. Col. Strachan, formerly with GSI, 2 District, promised to aid the Society by seeking its recognition from Caserta but was unsuccessful.

9. The organization has ceased to issue any sort of travel permits on orders from 2 District.



1. Reports have been received that the JUGOSLAV authorities at ZEMUN Airport, JUGOSLAVIA, have introduced a system of examination and search of outgoing and incoming Allied aircraft, including passengers, baggage, stores, equipment and official mail.

2. Pending discussion of this situation, all Allied military and civilian personnel proceeding to JUGOSLAVIA are warned that they may be subjected to examination.

3. Until further instructions are issued, the carriage of official mail by individuals will cease. Official mail for US addresses in JUGOSLAVIA will be deposited with the Office of the US Political Adviser; all other mail will be deposited with the Office of the British Resident Minister.

4. All concerned in BARI have been informed of the above situation by Rear MACMIS.

1. In view of our intention to impose movement control on morgan line on 15 Feb consider establishment of permit office in Ljubljana by that date most desirable. After discussion here on movement problems with Major Simmonds 24 January Capt Earle of this HQ will convey our views to BMA Belgrade as soon as permit for his journey is received.
2. Telegraphist and clerk cannot be found by this HQ owing to known shortage. If officer has to be found by this HQ this will have to be 1 of the only 2 Serbo Croat speaking interpreters in the corps. In this case he will have to cease his interpreter duties which fact we will accept in view of desirability of establishing permit office in Ljubljana. This officer however will only be able to work part time in Ljubljana and it will therefore be necessary to obtain definite Jugoslav agreement that he has unrestricted right to travel Trieste - Ljubljana.
3. Necessary equipment incl W/T for office in Ljubljana and link at this HQ will be provided by us.
4. Before any further action is taken by us it is necessary to have Jugoslav permission for (A) permit office in Ljubljana (B) W/T link at this office (C) Unrestricted travel to and from Ljubljana for office personnel. Will you inform us when this permission is obtained and also where telegraphist and clerk will be found.

General:

- 1) The month has seen the continuance of the effort of all parties to settle down and consolidate, with little attempt at active political demonstration. The Italian parties have made little progress. The political crisis in Rome failed to arouse any great interest, but served only to show that none of the parties has any strong individual programme whilst there is no strong desire or common bond which might serve to draw them together into the force that they might be.
- 2) The Communists on the other hand whilst loosing a few of their less fervent supporters have steadily consolidated the ground they already hold. Their main effort this month has been the continuance of their propaganda policy in the consistent and organized criticism of AMG in the "Lavoratore" and the "Primorski Dnevnik". During the first part of the month the "Lavoratore" was hard put to find material and had to content itself with pushing various small points in an effort to show that AMG always is and was out of touch with the "people"; e.g. complaints that the house of the "martyrs" in Via Ghega now occupied by the YMCA was used for dances - this causing unnecessary distress to the sorrowing mothers, etc; the forbidding of a proposed funeral given by the Communists to the S. Sabba victims - another example of how AMG "flout the will of the people"; the acquittal of Pagnini, ex major of Trieste, accused of collaboration, by the Special Court & another example of how Fascists escape while the real democrats are imprisoned. "Primorski Dnevnik", whilst also giving prominence to these and other points, continued to lay the greatest emphasis on its campaign, already well advanced in November, against the teachers in the

new Slovane schools accusing them of being Fascists, Collaborators, Cetnike and Balogardisti, and making specific attacks on the ANG Education Officer, Lieut. Simoni, and his right-hand man, Dr. Baraga. These attacks had culminated in a more than usually violent and specific one attacking Lieut. Simoni on 24th Nov., following which on 6 Dec. the "Primorski" was suspended - on the grounds that the editor had promised to publish a retraction, but did not fulfil the promises.

3) This suspension of the "Primorski" gave rise to the only big political action of the month. The "Lavoratore" based its headlines for days on this "negation of democracy" and UAIS finally organised a strike on the 15 Dec. in order to show ANG just what the people thought about it all. Unfortunately the strike was not a huge success. UAIS did not tie up things at all well with the FCG, and some of the officials of this latter body were completely in the dark right up to the eve of the strike. The Sindacati Giuliani refused to participate, on the grounds that the reason for the strike was political. Italians in general were completely apathetic. Thus, no great show of solidarity or union was achieved. However, the Communist, as usual, managed to extract all possible propaganda material from the incident - including sending the usual telegrams to the usual people. The "Primorski" resumed publication on the 24 Dec. and gave the "Lavoratore" a few more headlines.

4) At about the same date, on 16 Dec. a V.G. policeman, who appears to have been drunk at the time, got involved in a brawl in a S. Giacomo café and fired his machine gun, killing one and wounding two, one of whom died in hospital the following day. The "Lavoratore" made the fullest capital out of this incident, "proving" the man to be a Fascist and the whole incident just another "proof" of the reactionary and unchanged nature of the whole force, and ending with the usual demand for the dissolution of the Force and the re-establishment of the "popular bodies". The usual telegrams were also sent.

5) Enquiries into the background of the policeman in question, B i l o s l a v o S a l i c o, showed him to have been a simple farm labourer, never a member of the PNF, whose nearest approach to political action had been to be called up into the Italian army - during which period (1939-43) he served 5 months in Croatia ("rastrellamenti", of course, in the "Lavoratore").

3)

After the Amnistice he deserted and lived and worked at or near his home until he joined the Police. He had no connections or associations with the P.R.F., the Germans, the Jugoslavs or any Partisans. A further interrogation at the prison confirmed this story. Details of Biloslavo's life were then passed to "D" Section, AIS.

6) All these incidents were exploited as much as possible by all local Communist organs. No attempt was made to produce real, concrete evidence against any person accused. The Communists obviously find it better and more convenient to make and exploit propaganda rather than get down to the harder job of helping in the task which they advocate should to be done.

Control of civilian movement :

7) The confusion existing in Italy in reference to the issue of travel permits to Venezia Giulia would appear to have increased tremendously and has added a great deal to the work of this Section. A full report on the situation is attached as Appendix "A".

8) The Jugoslav Authorities are expected to finish issuing both new Identity cards and new Vehicle circulation permits for inhabitants of Zone B by the end of the year. A General Order will then be issued, probably on the 15 Jan 46, by AMG, making it an offence to be in Zone A without the necessary card or permit. In this way movement control will be easier to enforce and the authorities will have legal backing in their attempt to prevent Jugoslavs entering Zone A without an Allied permit.

9) Attached at Appendix "B" are some remarks and suggestions on the possibility of easing the restrictions on travel between Zone A and Italy for certain categories of non-Italian nationals.

10) Cases still occur of bus companies and railways, both in Italy and in Venezia Giulia, issuing tickets to intending travellers without ascertaining whether or not they are in possession of the necessary travel permits. When such cases have been discovered the companies have been warned. But it is impossible to ensure a complete check without some sort of control. As any such permanent control is impossible, it is suggested that a snap check is made - preferably by

FS - in order to produce evidence to use against these companies - in a strong warning "not to do it again".

12) Some time ago this HQ was contacted by MMIA and asked to make enquiries into the position of certain Italian military personnel, ex-member of the Fascist Republican Army, now employed in Trieste in an office dealing with the families and dependents of Italian Army personnel under the supervision of AMG. The enquiries were originated by the Italian Ministry of War and have since been taken up by 5 B.L.U. and the Italian Military authorities in Udine, 412 P.S. Section were asked to make further enquiries about the twenty accused officer and NCO's and have now submitted their report - from which it would appear to be highly advisable to remove all twenty from the positions they now hold. As the question is considered to be a Security matter it will be submitted to GSI (b) Main 13 Corps, for action.

Registration of civilians:

13) Most Areas have finished issuing the new identity cards and are now busy trying up the loose ends, e.g. invalids, etc. Complete figures for all issuing offices are not yet to hand, however. In those places where the issuing offices have now closed, the local Anagrafe has been authorised to issue cards to those people who for some good reason could not obtain their card previously, and to this end one of the Anagrafe staff

5)

has been trained by a Questura agent to take fingerprints. Where possible, the officer in charge of the original office has remained behind for some time in order to facilitate the transfer.

- 14) All duplicates of identity cards issued are forwarded to this Section and a start has already been made on the carding, both numerical and alphabetical, of such duplicates.

R u m o u r s :

- 15) The most consistent and widely spread rumour during the month has been that of reported clashes between Yugoslav and Allied Troops in the Northern part of Zone A and the consequent armed retaliation of one or other power - dependent upon which power is reported to have started the clash. The only reasonable explanation of this rumour - which is extremely prevalent and which crops up every three or four days - is that advanced by FSS Gorizia - viz. that it is the result of the commencement of artillery practise shoots in the Gorizia Area.

A r m s :

- 16) The only search during the month for hidden arms and ammunitions was made by GMP on the Solvay Works, Monfalcone on 19 Dec 45 where, above one of the machine shops, the following arms were discovered and confiscated :

- 40 Rifles : Italian and German make
- 1 Heavy machine gun: Italian
- 7 Hand grenades: Italian and German make
- 2.500 Rounds of ammunitions

- 17) Attached at Appendix "C" is a copy of a "Movement Order" issued to Capt. Jokic Spiro by the Milan Section of the Yugoslav Welfare service on 10th Dec. 45. Jokic travelled to Trieste without any travel permit and on the basis of this of this document alone. He could not get back to Milan across the Western boundary and reported to this Section in order to obtain the necessary permit. The "Movement Order" was confi =

located by this Section and Jokic given a permit for Milan with instructions not to return here. Could 13 Corps and Alcom please take the necessary action in order to stop the Yugoslav Welfare Service issuing such documents?

APPENDIX "A"Issue of Permits for Travel
from Italy into Venezia Giulia

1) The confusion mentioned in last month's report as existing in many parts of Italy over the regulations governing the issue of permits for travel from Italy into Venezia Giulia would appear to be increasing. IPSC's and Questure continue to send the permits and applications for approval. Some Questure send permits, some send only the applications. At the same time there are many indications that people are being refused permits by the Questure on the grounds that the applicants must first obtain permission from the Allied Authorities in Venezia Giulia. Furthermore, applicants are deterred by being told that it takes up to two or three months to obtain the permission necessary to grant the permit - and this happens even in Region XIII, where authority is held for the issue of such permits without reference to this HQ - and, again, are often advised, officially or unofficially, that the best thing to do is to first get the permission of the Authorities in Venezia Giulia and that the permit will then be issued immediately.

2) The result has been that this Section has been bombarded with telegrams from Questure and private individuals asking that permission be signalled for the grant of permits to X, Y and Z, that the office has been besieged with the friends and relations of people who have been told that they must first present their application to this Section and who bring the applicant's identity cards, application, etc., in order that the permit may be issued here and then be sent or taken back to the applicant.

3) These facts - i.e. ref. the Questure in Italy - may or not be true. All the evidence would suggest that they are true. For example; many people either working for, or in collaboration with, departments of AMG (directors, managers of Electrical Companies, etc.) have found it impossible to get permits

2)

to come to Trieste for such excellents reasons as e.g. transfer, to replace a manager who had died, and have finally had to apply to their department in AMG to get them to intercede for them.

4) Such is the position at the present moment. And it is considered probable that the situation will deteriorate when the Italian Provinces finally pass under the complete control of the Italian Government. It is therefore suggested that a new, high policy is needed which will explain to the Italian Authorities the regulations which must govern the issue of permits for entry into Venezia Giulia.

5) Before such a policy can be initiated the following question will have to be decided :

- a) Will Italian authorities (Questure, etc) be empowered to issue, over the signature of an Italian, travel permits authorising entry into Venezia Giulia? And will they be provided with stocks of the travel permit forms now used by AMG?
- b) If they are to be so empowered may they all, or any part of them, issue such permits without reference to this HQ?
- c) If they must first forward all applications to this HQ may it be noted that: this will mean a necessarily long delay in the issue of permits: it will entail the establishment of a new office within this Section, with additional staff.
- d) If (c) is to be the case, will this section simply approve the applications, or will it also issue and sign them? If it approves only, who will sign the actual permit? If it also issues and signs the permits then at least one additional officer should be assigned to this Section solely for this job - unless an Italian employee here is authorised to sign the permits. In this respect may it be noted that the Permit Office working under this section already issues an average of 1000 permits per day.
- e) May it also be suggested that, should all applications have to be forwarded to this HQ then the applications for travel to Trieste and destinations in zone B be forwarded to this Section, whilst applications for travel

to other destinations in Zone A (e.g. Gorizia, Monfalcone, etc) be forwarded to the AMG offices of the Area concerned where it is possible to check facts, addresses, personalities, etc. quoted in the applications. In this case location lists and official addresses would have to be circularised to the Italian authorities.

APPENDIX "B"Travel of non-Italian Nationals
between Venezia Giulia and Italy

1) Venezia Giulia in general and Trieste in particular, is still a harbour for hundreds of non-Italian nationals. The difficulty of obtaining permits for these people to enter Italy, and the length of time taken in obtaining such a permit is often a source of hardship to the people concerned. As examples, the following cases may be cited of people to whom might be granted the possibility of freer travel facilities:

- a) Exiles: People, usually Jugoslave who can not, for one reason or another, go back to their own country. Many of these are evacuated through the usual refugee channels. Many are now living and working here - an area in which they have friends, business and otherwise, who are willing to support or employ them. Such people, in order to live often need to travel into Italy - usually for business reasons.
- b) Students: of many nationalities, but particularly Jugoslav and Slovens, enrolled at Italian universities, and in possession of documents to prove this. Some sort of ruling is needed as to whether or not such students should be allowed to return to their Universities. If permission is given then they should be enabled to get the necessary travel permit quickly. These remarks apply also to priests of various nationalities working or studying in Italy.
- c) Business men: most of the non-Italians in Trieste are business men. Many of them have lived here with their families for a long time. To forbid them easy access to N. Italy is to cause them a great deal of hardship and to threaten the stability of their business - through no fault of their own, nor is such an action threatening to the swiftest possible development and reconstruction of the area.
- *) conducive

d) Divided Families: Because of the great number of foreign nationals in the area there are a great number of mixed marriages and engagements - many of which have been temporarily split by the war. An Italian may get a permit for Italy in five minutes, whereas his Slav (or Austrian) fiancée must wait five weeks, and may not get it at all. Many Jugoslav husbands are in Italy and their wives, waiting to join them, find it almost impossible to get the necessary permits.

2) As has been said, the present system by which permits are obtained for travel to Italy imposes a certain undeserved hardship on the above and on other categories. Many are in acute financial difficulties - and their only remedy is to indulge in the black market or some such other activity. Many attempt to make the journey without a permit & thereby covering other, more unwanted, crossings.

3) It is considered that many of the people in these categories, after being satisfactorily screened by FS, should be eligible to obtain reasonably quickly a permit to enter Italy. Therefore, the following suggestions are made:

- a) That the present regulations be revised so that members of the above-named, and other such categories when passed by FS and recommended by this Office are enabled to receive their permits quickly.
- b) To achieve this end the possibility might be considered of either detaching to this office a member of the Travel control staff, or of delegating powers to decide and issue permits in certain cases to a member of this B.
