I -- ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

Announcement is made of the establishment of the Office of Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer. The Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will assume functions and responsibilities as representative of the Chief Commissioner, Allied Control Commission at HQ AAI.

II -- COMPOSITION OF OFFICE OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

The office of the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will be composed of a Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer; S.O. Grade 2; Representative, Economic Section, ACC; Representative, Food Sub-Commission, ACC; Representative, Transportation Sub-Commission, ACC; Representative, Civil Affairs Section, ACC.

III -- RESPONSIBILITIES AND FUNCTIONS OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

1. The Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will represent the Chief Commissioner at HQ AAI. He will be at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief, AAI for consultation on all matters connected with Civil Affairs in the Area administered by him as Deputy Military Governor, and will administer to the immediate needs of Army AMGs and Forward Regions in this Area.
2. Army AMGs and Forward Regions will continue to seek and take their general directions from HQ ACC. Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will, however, be in a position and has authority to give direction on urgent operational requirements. In this and HQ ACC will keep him fully advised on all matters.
3. Copies of communications between AAI Armies and Forward Regions and Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, AAI will be sent to HQ ACC.
4. All requests from HQ ACC for travel into Army Areas will be addressed to Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, AAI. All requests by Army AMGs and Regions within AAI territory for personnel to be sent forward will be addressed to Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer.
5. The major portion of the work of the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer at HQ AAI will be by personal contact with HQ AAI, Army Areas, Forward Regions and HQ ACC.

IV -- DESIGNATION OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

Designation of Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer IV

I --- ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

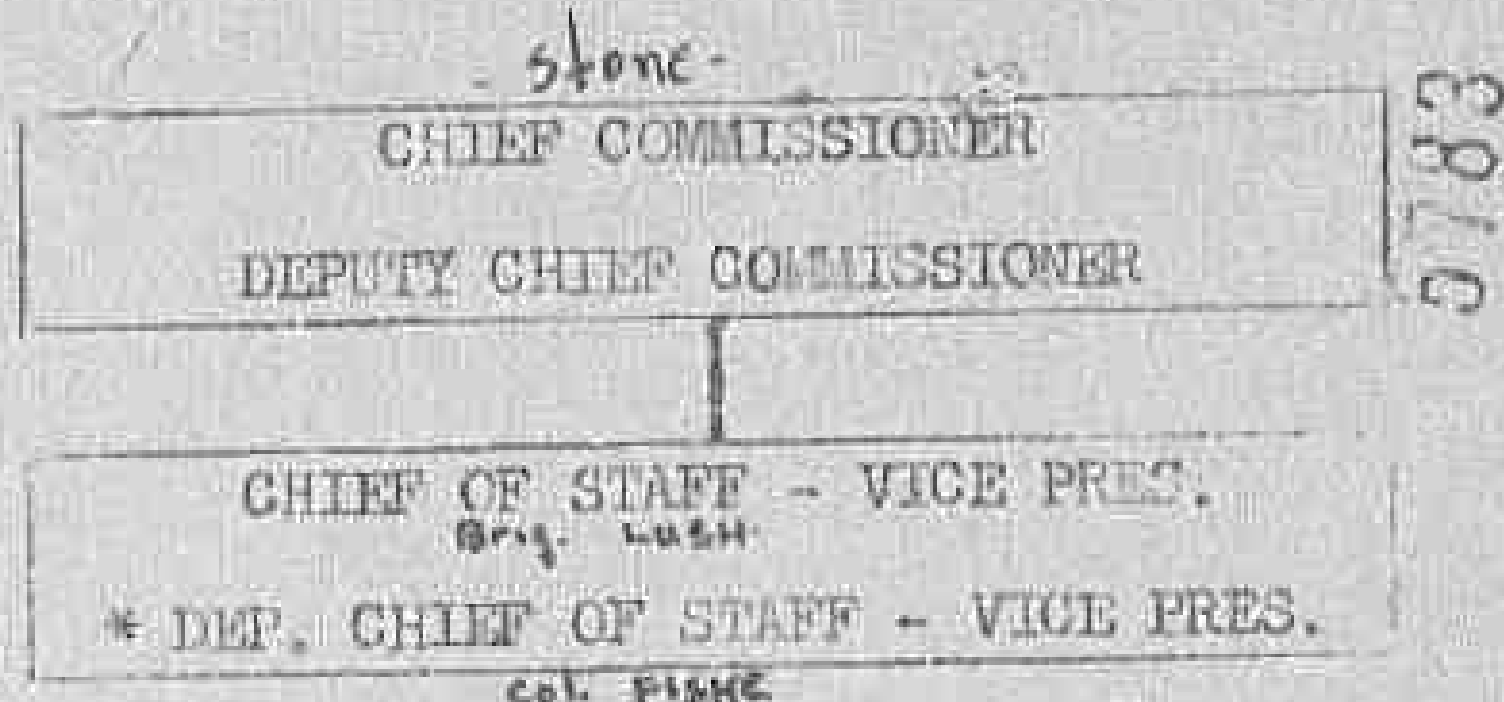

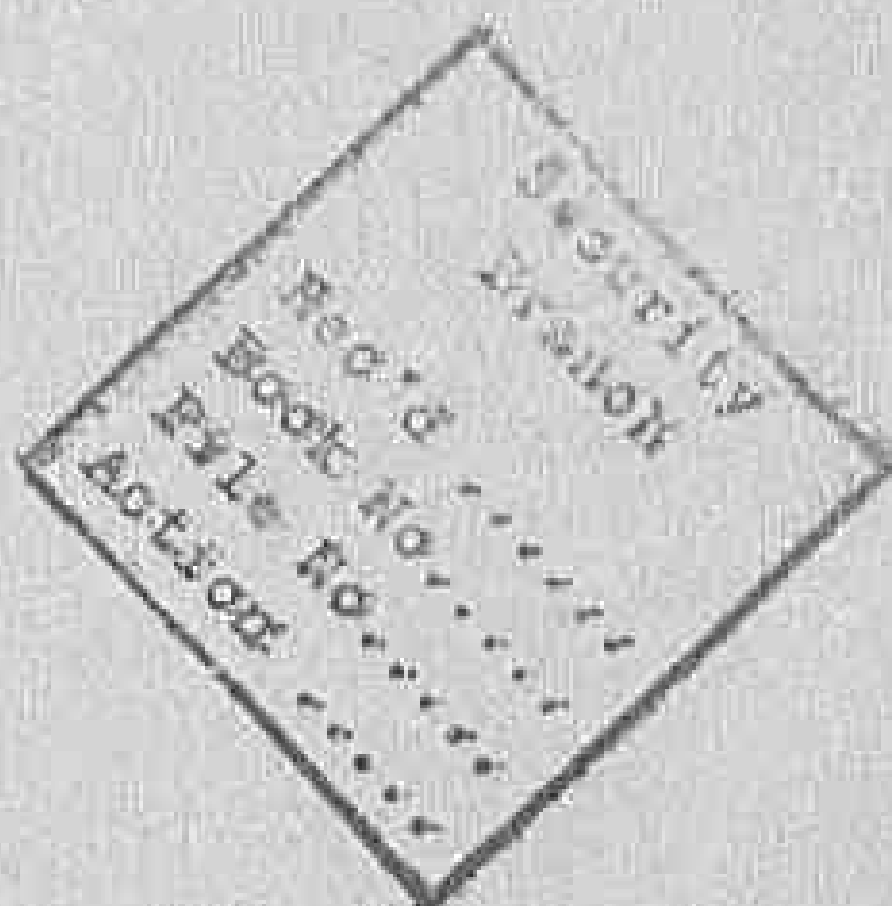

SUBJECT: Civilians attached to Allied Control Commission
TO : All Concerned

1. At the request of the Combined Chiefs of Staff, a strictly limited number of civilian representatives from U.S. and U.K. have been and will continue to be admitted to Italy, Sicily and Sardinia for specific work in connection with the development and export of sulphur, hemp, silk, citrus products and perhaps other commodities.

2. These civilians will for all purposes be considered personnel of A.C.C. and will come under the detailed superintendence and control of the appropriate Subcommittee of A.C.C. No purchases will be made by these civilians except for account of or by AFA, AMFA, ACC or AMG, as the case may be.

3. Accordingly, all civilians entering Italy, Sicily and Sardinia in accordance with paragraph 1 hereof will be supervised by the R.C.A.O.s of the various Regions in which they are operating or by the appropriate Subcommittee, if they are working directly out of Headquarters. In carrying out this supervision it is particularly necessary that all appropriate correspondence and reports from these civilian representatives be forwarded through official channels to these Headquarters with sufficient copies for transmittal to higher authority.

3. Generalissimo has been Italian in his mind. He has been over to Italy in 1947. The people have been in a state of confusion, provision of economic goods and services in Italian Governmental machinery. Generalissimo was not prepared to start a revolution. From Brindisi.

4. It was expected that the present organization of the economic and administrative section does not correspond with the Italian Governmental machinery. Pending any decision by the Vice President Committee, the following changes will be effected at a date to be notified later:

- (b) Administrative Director will parallel the Minister for the Interior and Control the Industries, Public Safety and Public Health Sub-Commissions only.

GENERAL EISENHOWER'S ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

Released at 2200 hours, 10 November:

As Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces, I wish to announce the formation of the Allied Control Commission for Italy which, following the Italian surrender, has today assumed the duty of carrying out the Armistice and of aligning Italian economy in complete support of the United Nations fight against Germany.

Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, USA, has been appointed Acting Deputy President of the Allied Control Commission with headquarters at the seat of the Italian Government. He is the active head of the Control Commission, operating directly under the Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces to whom he is responsible. The Commission has control of the military and economic activities of Italy, as envisaged in the terms of the Armistice.

Italy has a new role in the war. That role is to fight the common enemy—Germany. The Control Commission will see that all of Italy's economic resources and manpower are utilized where they can do the most good in that fight.

In all areas behind the combat zone, Allied Military Government of Enemy Territory will gradually be replaced by Italian Administration exercised under supervision of the Control Commission. We look to the Italian Government to broaden its political composition and strengthen its administrative structure, and the transfer from Allied Military Government to Italian administration will keep pace with this development. This does not mean the return of Italian territory to unrestricted Italian control.

Allied Military Government still goes forward with the 15 Army Group to organize the territory as the Germans are expelled. Allied Military Government continues to press forward as a spearhead, taking charge of communities disorganized by the Nazi retreat and destruction, restoring common civic life, once burdened with Fascism, and clearing the path immediately for further military movements towards the front.

When the Armistice was granted, the Allied Commander-in-Chief appointed a Military Mission headed by Lieutenant General F. W. Mason MacFarlane to the Italian Government. It functioned at the temporary seat of the Italian Government, and the scope of the Mission corresponded to many of the duties of the Allied Control Commission. The Mission's duties have been performed as planned, and it is now replaced by the Allied Control Commission.

General MacFarlane, who has rendered outstanding service, is returning to his post as Governor of Gibraltar.

Well in advance of the surrender, plans were made and personnel brought forward so that we should be prepared for the problem of Post-Armistice control. The Allied Control Commission was established. It is divided into four

sections: (1) Military; (2) Political; (3) Economic and Administrative; (4) Communications. Each Section, with its proper Sub-Divisions will operate in fields as so dictated by the times.

Personnel was drawn from especially military officers and civilian experts. Some of them were sent to this theatre for duties involving Civil Affairs. Others are technicians. Others were engaged in Allied Military Government work.

In all of this change it should be borne in mind that the Italian Government is bound by the terms of the Armistice which stipulates that "The Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces reserves to himself the right to take any measures which in his opinion may be necessary for the protection of the interests of the Allied Forces for the prosecution of the war, and the Italian Government binds itself to take such administrative or other action as the Commander-in-Chief may require."

Pursuant to the agreement reached at the Tripartite Conference at Moscow, an Advisory Council for Italy has been established in conjunction with the work of the Allied Control Commission for Italy. The Advisory Council will deal with day-to-day questions other than military preparations and will make recommendations to coordinate Allied policy with regard to Italy. In the first instance the Advisory Council will be composed of representatives of the United States, the United Kingdom, the Soviet Union, and the French Committee of National Liberation. Later, representatives of Greece and Yugoslavia will be added to this Council.

The United Nations are converting Italy into an effective instrument of war against Germany. They look to the Italian Government to produce tangible results. By rallying the entire people to a vigorous resistance to the Germans, the Government of Italy may hasten the redemption of its country and prove its value to the United Nations.

ABSTRACT NO. 1

The Italian Government and people will abstain from all action detrimental to the United Nations. Personnel of the Italian administrative, judicial and public services will carry out their functions and all orders given by the United Nations promptly and efficiently. There shall be no destruction or concealment of archives, records, plans or other documents or information and they must be made available on request.

The Italian authorities will make available in occupied and non-occupied Italian territories all transport facilities required by the United Nations, and all members of the forces and officials of the United Nations will have the right of passage in or over such territories.

All instructions issued by the Allied C-in-C or officers designated by him, regarding the use and control of airfields, ports, shipping, inland transport systems and vehicles, intercommunication systems, power stations and public utility services, all refineries, stocks and fuel and power supplies, and means of producing same, and all connected repair and construction facilities will be complied with.

ABSTRACT No. 6

Prisoners of War, and nationals belonging to the United Nations held under restraint in Italian or Italian occupied territory will forthwith be handed over to the United Nations.

Persons of whatever nationality who have been held under restraint on account of dealings or sympathies with the United Nations, or on grounds of race, color, creed or political opinions will be released and relieved from all legal disabilities on that account.

The Italian Government will take steps to safeguard the persons and property of foreign states and foreign nationals.

ABSTRACT No. 9

No radio or telecommunication installations or other forms of intercommunications, shore or afloat, under Italian control, whether belonging to Italy or any nation other than the United Nations will transmit until directions for the control of those installations have been prescribed by the Allied C-in-C. The Italian authorities will conform to such measures for control and censorship of press and of other publications, of theatrical and cinematograph performances, of broadcasting and also of all forms of intercommunication as the Allied C-in-C may direct. The Allied C-in-C may, at his discretion, take over radio, cable and other communication stations.

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
