Regarding the fundamental laws of Fascism; on the 14th December 1936 he voted for the institution of the "Camera dei Fasci e delle Corporazioni", and this law has been unanimously approved. Prof. Giglioli took also part to the secret votation for the change into law of the RR.DD.LL. (Royal decrees) 17 November 1938 n. 1728, 15 November 1938 n. 1779, 5 September 1938 n. 1539, and 1390, and 23 September 1938 n. 1630 which treated the first fundamental dispositions regarding "the race".

In his defence Prof. Giglioli said, that judging his political activity it is necessary to consider that his career of learned person and professor has not been influenced by it, and that he exercised it with probity disapproving of any measure he found against his conscience, and setting himself against the transportation of work of arts to Germany. He spoke also about his activity as professor and learned person, and about the part he took in many interesting publications and especially in the "Mostra Augusta della Romanità". Several personalities have confirmed the esteem with which Prof. Giglioli is surrounded in and outside the cultural circle.

The Commission recognises all the contribution he gave to science, to the schools and to the exposition, however, according to the D.L.L. 27 July 1944 n. 159 which mentions the sanctions against Fascism, all his merits cannot annul his political activity which is quite a different thing. Examining the contribution given by Prof. Giglioli to the Fascist political life which results from the above mentioned parliamentary documents, we must say that it has been important, and is considered by art. I n. II of the above said decree an active participation to the political life of Fascism. According to this law, and with the suspension from his office Prof. Giglioli has been considered unworthy to serve the State.

Regarding the qualification of antemarcia, Prof. Giglioli said that it does not correspond to a fact, because he joined the Fascist Party only after its amalgamation with the National Association to which he belonged since 1912, and received therefore an honorary enrollment as of the 23rd of March 1919. He said also that he never took advantage of such qualification. As the witness Prof. Pietro Romanelli, Central Inspector of the Ministry of Public Education, has confirmed these circumstances, Prof. Giglioli can therefore be cleared from the second accusation.

THE COMMISSION

considers Prof. Giulio Quirino Giglioli guilty of the fault mentioned in paragraph n. I, and proposes his suspension from service.



C O P YMEMORANDUM

Professor Giulio Quirini Giglioli, born in Rome in 1886, belongs a family of patriots of northern Italy. His grandfather was one of the most intimate friends and followers of Giuseppe Mazzini.

When he was still very young he took part in the National movement for the great war in which he volunteered during the years 1915-1918 gaining a decoration on the field.

He joined the fascist party when the nationalistic movement to which he belonged was incorporated in fascism in 1923. He never was a "squadrista".

His fame as a scholar of Archeology is international. His discovery of the "Apelle di Vevo", which took place 25 years ago, has given a new light to the study of the Etruscan people.

The museum of the Roman Empire, of which he is the director, was started with the archeological material collected for the International Exhibition of 1911. It is now the largest and most complete collection of the documents of Roman civilisation existing. This material was used by Professor Giglioli in 1937-1938 for the Mostra Augustea della Romanità of which he was Director and which was greatly admired by scholars of every nation. With the eminently scientific idea of this arrangement he intended also to react to the anti-roman tendency which, since Moesen, has for nearly a century informed all German science.

At the age of 37 he won in regular competition the chair of Archeology in Pisa; he was afterwards transferred to Rome to the chair of "Topography and Ancient Italy" and later, in 1935, to the chair of Archeology.

He is the author of numerous and praiseworthy publications on Greek, Etruscan and Roman Archeology.

After the great war he was elected Member of Parliament and then Consigliere Nazionale. His political activity has always been purely idealistic and even his opponents always admitted his absolute honesty and straightforwardness.

By family tradition he always was anti-german and against all violence, severely disapproving anti-jew laws.

After July 25th and still more after September 8th 1943, Professo Giglioli led a retired life refusing to join the fascist republic and to accept all public charges which were offered to him.

He is very much loved and estimated by all his students which he has always encouraged and helped independently of the political party to which they might belong.

Professor Giglioli has been arrested on June the 5th by

I have looked into the case of Prof. Giulio Guirino Giglioli.

For your private and confidential information I may state that he was interned as a "prominent Fascist with a long and prominent record in the Fascist Party" and is an "antemarcia". He has further been accused under Art. 13 of the Sanctions against Fascism Decree of 27th July, 1944, of taking an active part in Fascist political life.

I doubt whether much can be done, but all these cases are periodically reviewed and I am asking the reviewing authority to take into account on the next review the Memorandum you gave me.

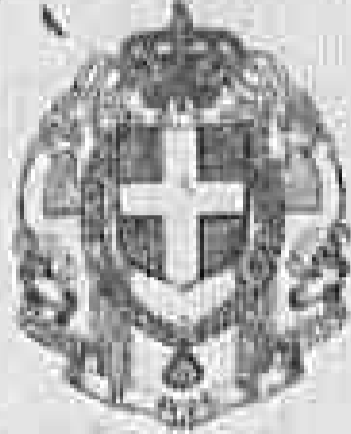

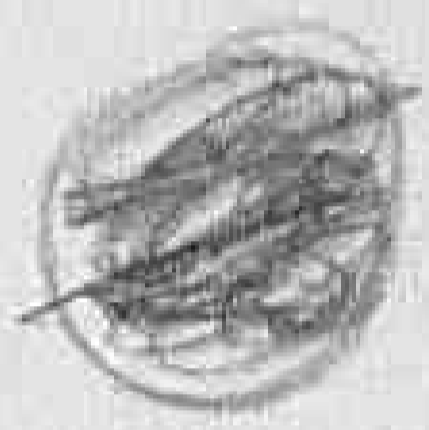
